Bottom-up, consensusdriven policy development and advice is at the core of ICANN's mission.

ICANN's mission (as defined by the ICANN Bylaws):

"To coordinate the development and implementation of **policies that are developed through a bottom-up consensus-based multistakeholder process** and designed to ensure the stable and secure operation of the Internet's unique names systems."



# The Concept of "Consensus" in the ICANN Community

Is consensus defined? ## **GNSO: gTLD Policy Decision Making**

## **GNSO Working Groups:**

- Full Consensus (unanimity)
- Consensus (most agree, only small minority disagree)
- Strong Support but Significant Opposition
- Divergence (no consensus, many different points of view)
- Minority View

## **GNSO Council:**

- Different voting thresholds depending on type of decision:
  - GNSO Supermajority (approve PDP recommendations): either 2/3 of the Council members of each House, or 3/4 of the Council members of one House and a majority of the Council members of the other House.



## **ICANN** Board: Approving Community-Developed Policy

## **GNSO Policy Recommendations:**

 Any PDP Recommendations approved by a GNSO Supermajority Vote shall be adopted by the Board unless, by a vote of more than two-thirds (2/3) of the Board, the Board determines that such policy is not in the best interests of the ICANN community or ICANN

## ccNSO Policy Recommendations:

• The Board shall adopt the ccNSO Recommendation unless by a vote of more than 66% the Board determines that such policy is not in the best interest of the ICANN community or of ICANN.



## Policy Making at ICANN: Three Myths (maybe ...)

- The policy development process takes too long.
- The policy development process is too complex.
- The policy development process is too reactive.
