- Initial Phase I spec left a detail unspecified
- Implementation Review Team (IRT) attempted to fill in the detail
- Closer examination revealed deeper problems
- Board eliminated the requirement
- SSAC wrote SAC 122

Urgent Requests

"Urgent Requests for Lawful Disclosure" are limited to circumstances that pose an imminent threat

```
to life,
of serious bodily injury,
to critical infrastructure, or
of child exploitation
```

in cases where disclosure of the data is necessary in combatting or addressing this threat.

Critical infrastructure means the physical and cyber systems that are vital in that their incapacity or destruction would have a debilitating impact on economic security or public safety.
