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	<p>surrounding the principles, both from an ICANN Community perspective and from an individual structure/stakeholder group perspective.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Principle 1 team noted that Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-Bound (SMART) criteria and indicators can inform the CIP framework.● Principle 3 team noted that the additional nouns describing the subgroups of the ICANN Community are superfluous and can be removed after the catch-all phrase, "ICANN Community".● Principle 4 to distinguish between external and internal accountability, and criteria will specify further for each structure.● Principle 5 team noted the importance of collaborating effectively with the ICANN org and Board, in terms of continuous improvement.● CIP-CCG volunteers stated general agreement on the five draft principles.
