### 3. Clarification of Scope

- The SPIRT Charter Drafting Team is expected to develop a draft Charter for the SPIRT, which is a group recommended in the new gTLD Subsequent Procedures Final Report;
- The SPIRT Charter Drafting Team's <u>only task</u> is to develop the draft Charter for the SPIRT, with the Charter being subject to GNSO Council approval.

#### **Background:**

- Given the unique and complicated nature of the New gTLD Program, the Working Group recommends that a <u>Standing</u> <u>Predictability Implementation Review Team (SPIRT) (pronounced "spirit")</u> be established to utilize the Predictability Framework.
- The <u>Predictability Framework</u> will be an output of the implementation effort for New gTLD Subsequent Procedures as developed by ICANN org, in coordination with the Implementation Review Team (IRT).
- The SPIRT Charter is a requirement for establishing the SPIRT. However, the SPIRT and the Predictability Framework are by definition, not intended to operate until the Applicant Guidebook (AGB) is approved by the ICANN Board.



- This SPIRT Charter Drafting Team will <u>NOT</u> be responsible for developing the <u>Predictability Framework</u> [already complete], but will be responsible for <u>the limited task of determining how the SPIRT will utilize</u> <u>the Predictability Framework, by preparing the draft Charter.</u>
- In developing the draft Charter, the SPIRT Charter Drafting Team will be expected to consider:
  - the composition of the SPIRT;
  - detailing how issues are raised to the SPIRT procedurally;
  - defining operating principles and decision-making;
  - and other important aspects to support the proper functioning of the SPIRT.

### 4. Draft Charter

For the Draft Charter:

The New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Final Report included an <u>annex</u> that provides detailed guidance on how the SPIRT should operate.

- The content included in this <u>annex (pp.322-328)</u> should serve as the starting point for the Drafting Team in developing the draft Charter, but there are key decision points for the Drafting Team:
  - → Potential key questions:
  - 1) SPIRT Membership Model Open or Representative? Criteria and Length of Term?
  - 2) Leadership Model and Criteria?
  - 3) GNSO Working Group Guidelines (section 3.6) as the sole basis for decision making methodology suitable?
