He first joined Afnic in January 2008 as Products and Partnerships Manager, within the Communications Department. In January 2009, he was appointed advisor to the Cabinet of Nathalie Kosciusko-Morizet, Secretary of State for Development of the Digital Economy. He is responsible for innovation, content and international affairs. From November 2010 to February 2012, he continued his mission as advisor to Nathalie Kosciusko-Morizet, Minister of Ecology, Sustainable Development, Transport and Housing. Pierre Bonis joined Afnic a second time in October 2012. After having held the position of deputy general director, he was appointed general director on September 1, 2017.

Vesna Manojlovic

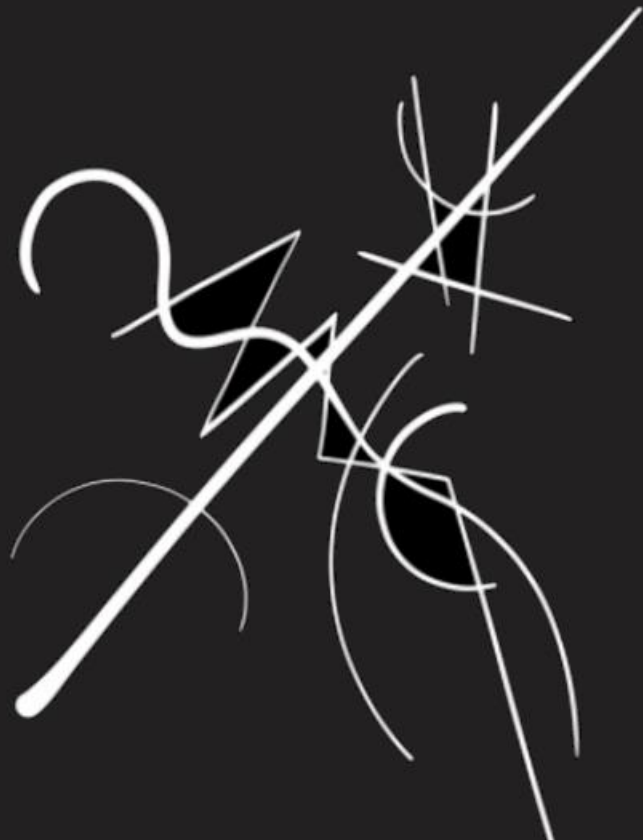
