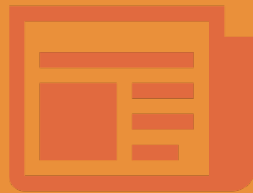
New gTLD Subsequent Procedures

Overview

Community efforts, such as a PDP and various reviews, are underway to take into consideration the 2012 New gTLD round and seek ways to improve, refine, or develop new policy recommendations for new gTLDs, acknowledging that there is existing new gTLD policy from the GNSO's 2007 Final Report on the Introduction of New gTLDs.

What to Expect at ICANN58

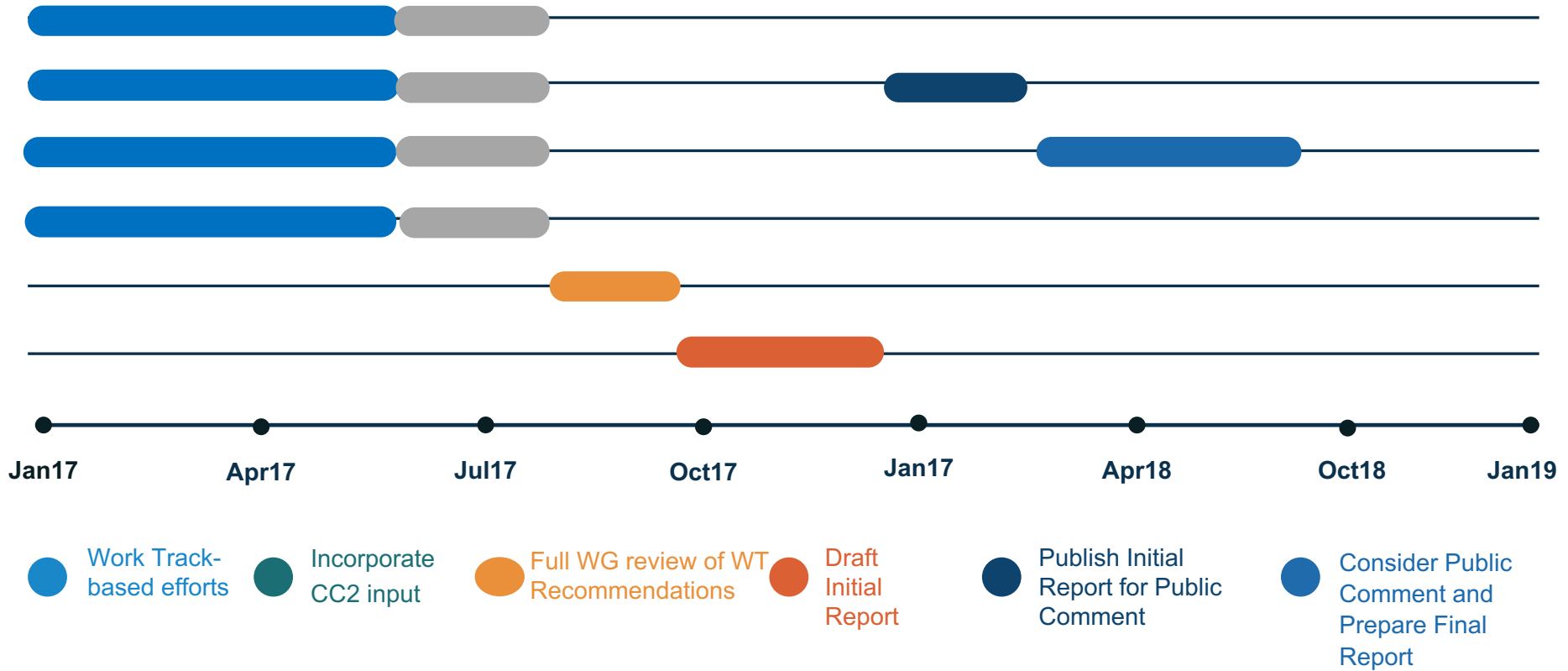
An open face-to-face working session took place on Saturday, 11 Mar to continue progress made on a number of different subjects, such as Applicant Support, the base registry agreement, objections, community applications, and other topics. Discussion continued at session today from 15:00-16:30 (Hall C1.4)



How to Participate

GNSO WG's are open to anyone who would like to participate. The WG has made an effort to try and select times are more hospitable to those in APAC (e.g., share the burden).

Timeline



To Summarize

There are 4 separate Work Tracks working on a number of different subjects. Their findings will be dependent upon input from the community (i.e., CC2) and any WT recommendations must be reviewed as a full WG.

Current Status

- ⦿ Overarching Issues/CC1
 - ⦿ WG has preliminarily considered 6 overarching subjects within its charter
 - ⦿ Sought input from the community (Community Comment 1, or CC1)
 - ⦿ Considered input and reached preliminary conclusions, such as:
 - ⦿ Did not identify a reason to NOT have additional new gTLD subsequent procedures
 - ⦿ There should not be limits on applications from an applicant or overall in a “round”
 - ⦿ Establish 3 drafting teams to develop proposals on: 1) Different TLD Types 2) Framework on Predictability 3) Application Rounds
- ⦿ Established 4 Work Tracks to consider remaining subjects in charter
 - ⦿ These subjects form the basis for Community Comment 2 (CC2)

Community Input

Community Comment 2 (CC2)

- ⦿ WG will seek input on 32+ topics being considered by WTs via Community Comment 2 (CC2) – will be published for public comment.
 - ⦿ Topics include: Registry Service Provider program, Applicant Support, Reserved Names, Closed Generics, Objections, Community Applications, String Similarity, IDNs, Technical/Financial Criteria, etc.

Some Community Inputs

- ⦿ Recommendations, data, and analysis from CCT-RT
- ⦿ Report from CWG-UCTN
- ⦿ GAC WGs

- ⦿ How can we best make sure work is coordinated? How can the PDP ensure that it ends up with a set of recommendations that has wide community acceptance?

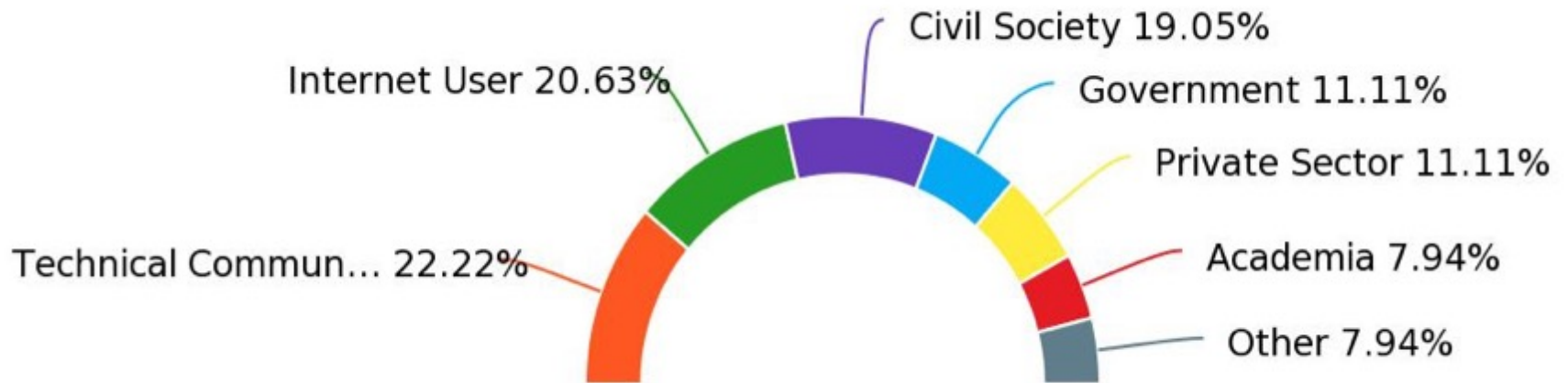

Focus Areas: Community's interest areas, and participation in ICANN and Internet Governance-related activities.

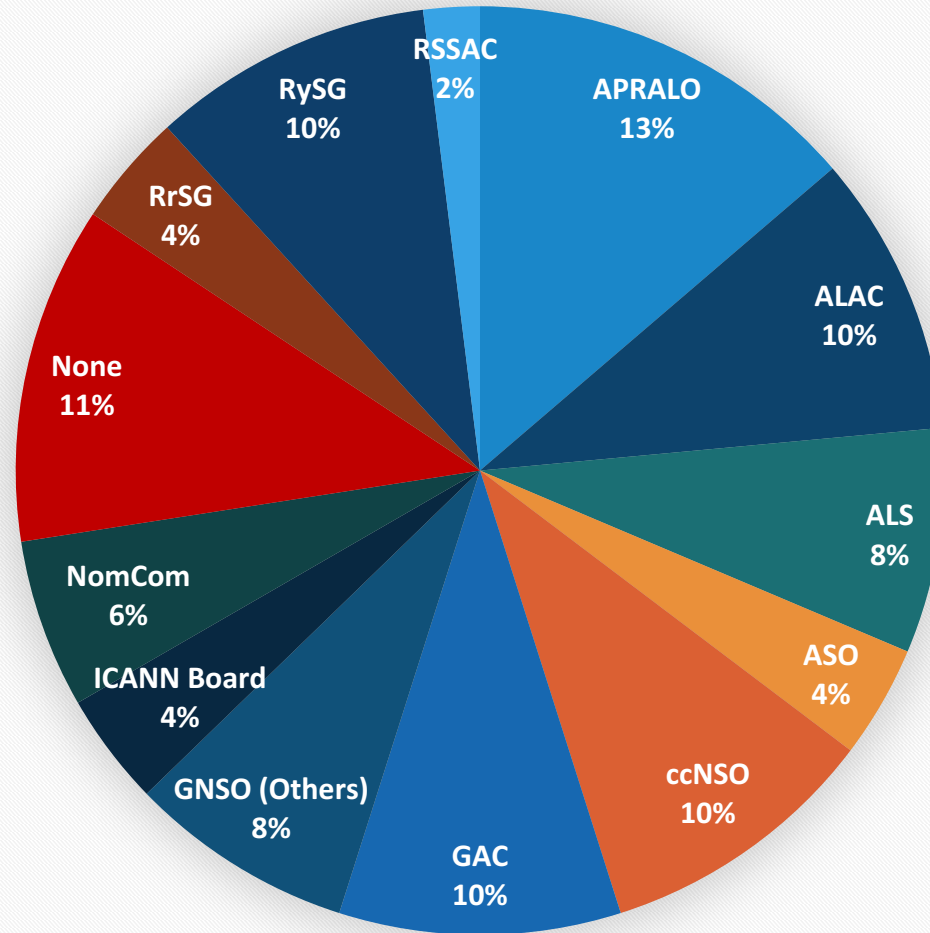

◎ Purpose

- Guidelines for second level IDN registration policies and practices
- Designed to minimize the risk of cybersquatting and consumer confusion

◎ Relevance

- For gTLD registries and registrars offering IDNs at the second level
- For IDN ccTLDs

◎ Status

- [Final draft for Public Comment](#) released on 3 March 2017
- Interim draft presented at ICANN 57
- Issues list presented at ICANN 55
- Working Group formed in October 2015
- [Call for Community Experts](#) in July 2015
- GNSO community requested for updating the Guidelines
 - Previous version ([3.0](#)) published in September 2011
