


Setting the Stage



1. Setting the stage

- A dedicated committee for overseeing and implementing GNSO's structural, procedural, process improvements was proposed in the form of a <u>Pilot (June 2021)</u>
- Upon completion of Pilot and evaluation via <u>a survey conducted by SG/Cs</u>, GNSO Council permitted continuation of committee and revision of charter on <u>16 May 2024</u>


- Current Pilot Team to complete charter work by 2024 END


Continuous Improvement Program Roadmap






Establish a decision-making methodology for the CCOICI



4. Overarching Principle



Council Committee assignments concern those activities that are determined to be Council specific and it is therefore appropriate for the Council Committee to address these. Each Task Force also has its specific assignments that are assigned by the Council Committee.

4. Guiding Principles for Charter Revision

Composition Principles

- 1. Standing Committee composition remains the same; one Councilor from each SG/C + 1 NCA.
- 2. Standing Committee shall have a single Chair selected from the SC and approved by the GNSO Council.
- 3. Task Forces shall use the Representative + Participant + Observer model (see EPDP_IDN <u>Charter</u>, section IV).
- 4. Task Forces shall have a single Chair from & approved by the GNSO Council, option for VC from each house.

4. Guiding Principles for Charter Revision

Decision-making Principles

- 1. Both the SC & TFs shall operate under the methods for making decisions section of the <u>WG Guidelines 3.6</u>.
- 2. Chairs are expected to use all tools available, such as the <u>Consensus Playbook</u> & liaise w/ Council leaders frequently.
- 3. The SC & TF Chairs are responsible for designating final levels of consensus.
- 4. In all cases, regardless of consensus outcomes, a report will be delivered to the GNSO Council for consideration.

4. Guiding Principles for Charter Revision

Scope Principles

1. The charter shall not be overly prescriptive as to minimize invoking charter amendment processes.

2. All assignments of the SC and/or TF shall be first approved by the GNSO Council.


3. Any project initiated by the Council expecting to exceed 4 months must include a charter & schedule.

4. Remaining projects identified in the pilot CCOICI charter will be placed into a living "backlog" separate from the charter.
