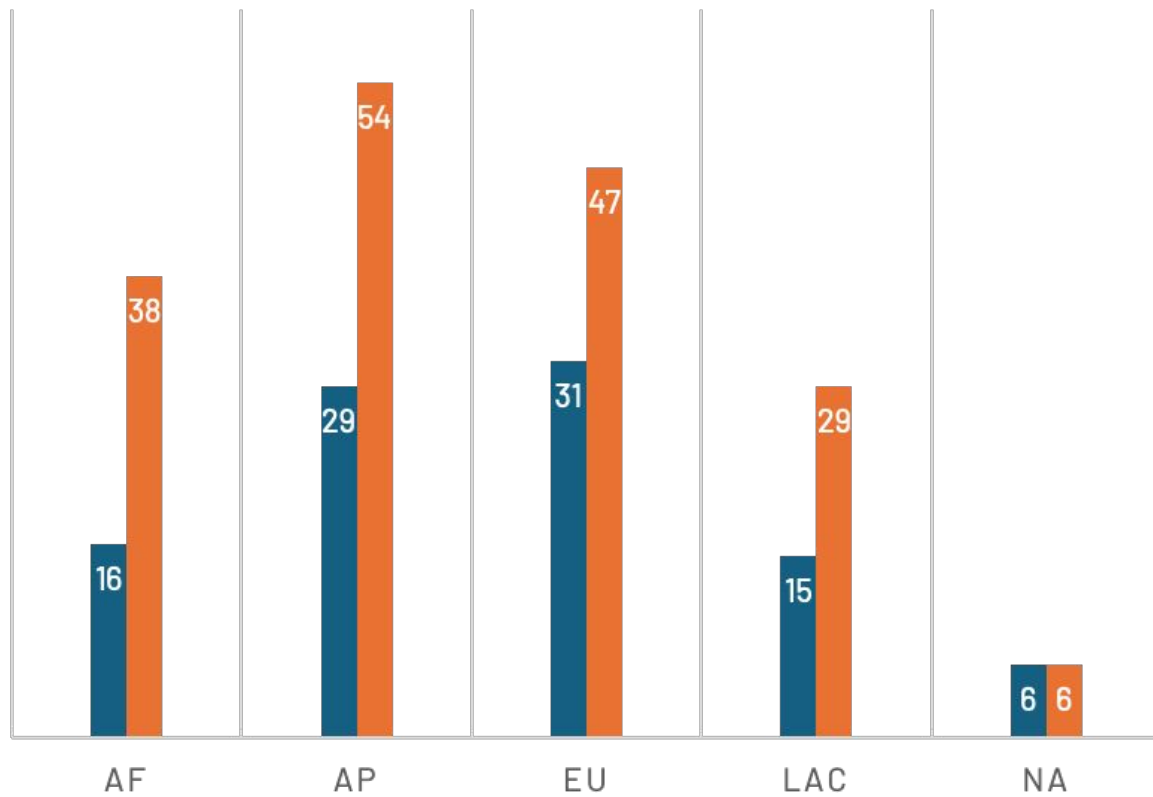

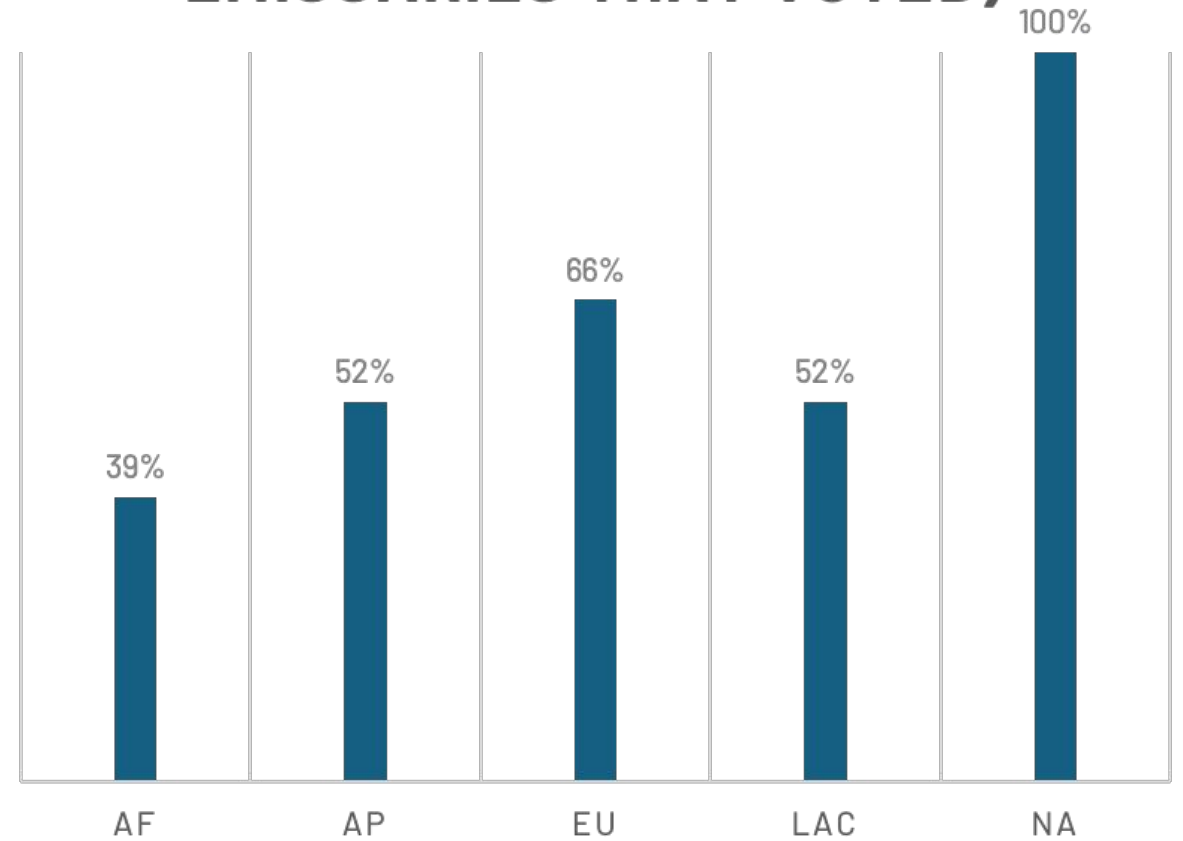
ccPDP4 - Votes per region

■ number of votes ■ number of Emissaries

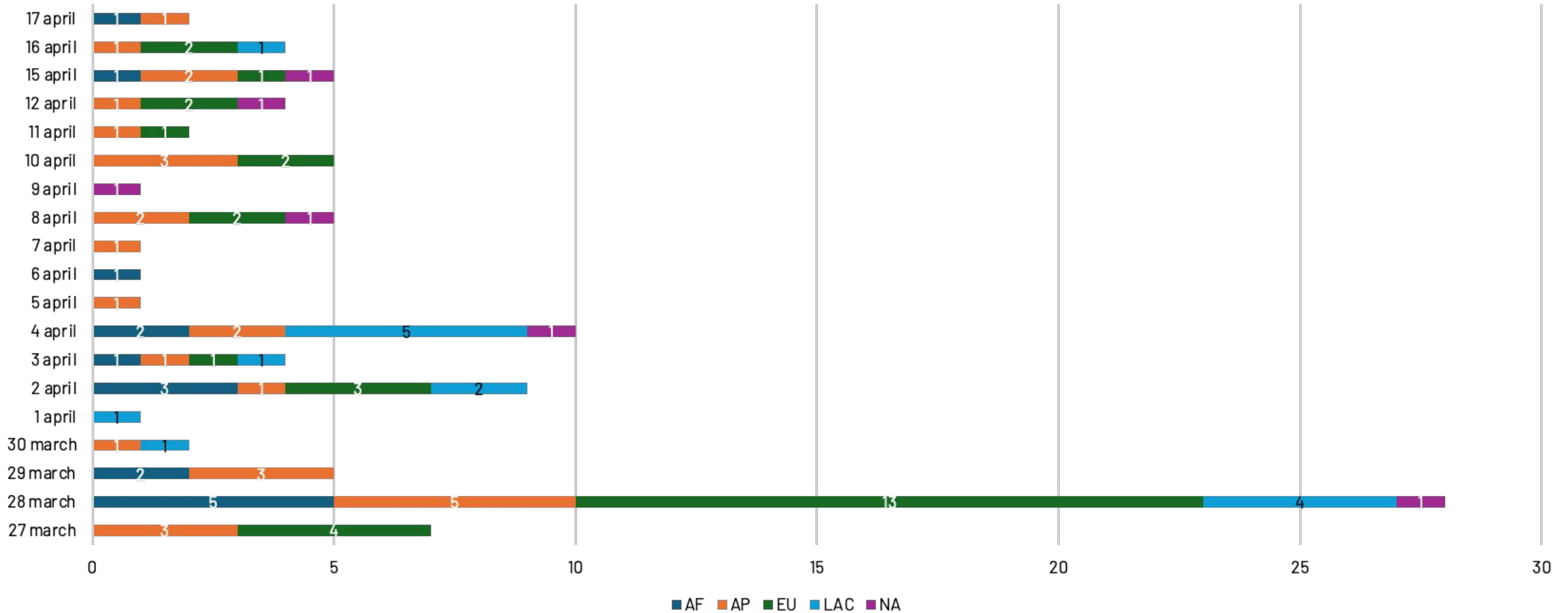


VOTES PER REGION (% OF EMISSARIES THAT VOTED)

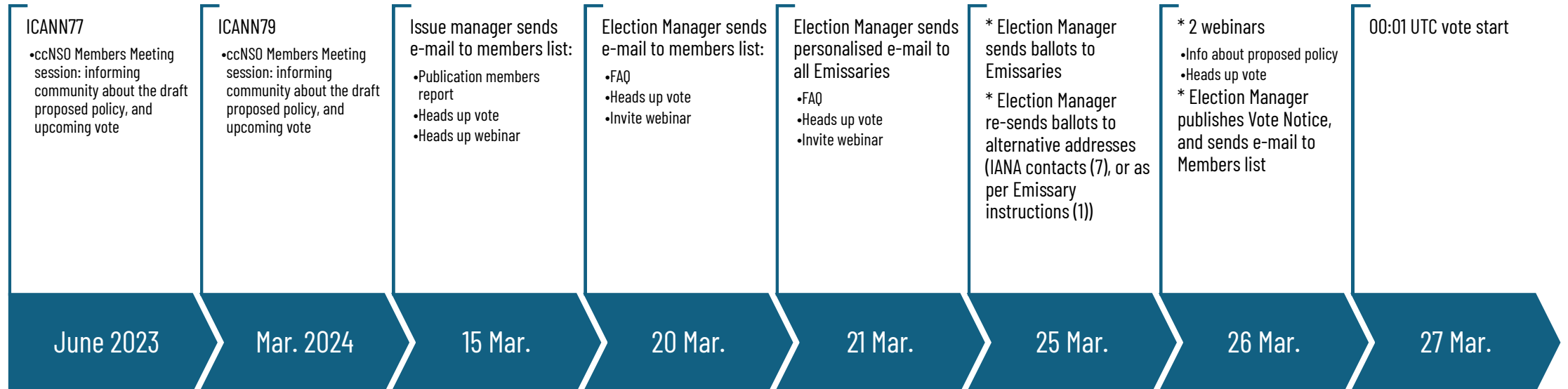


ccPDP4 - Number of votes per region, per day

(note: in case of duplicate votes, the first vote submitted is included in the overview below. When calculating the total result however, the value chosen in the last vote cast is counted)



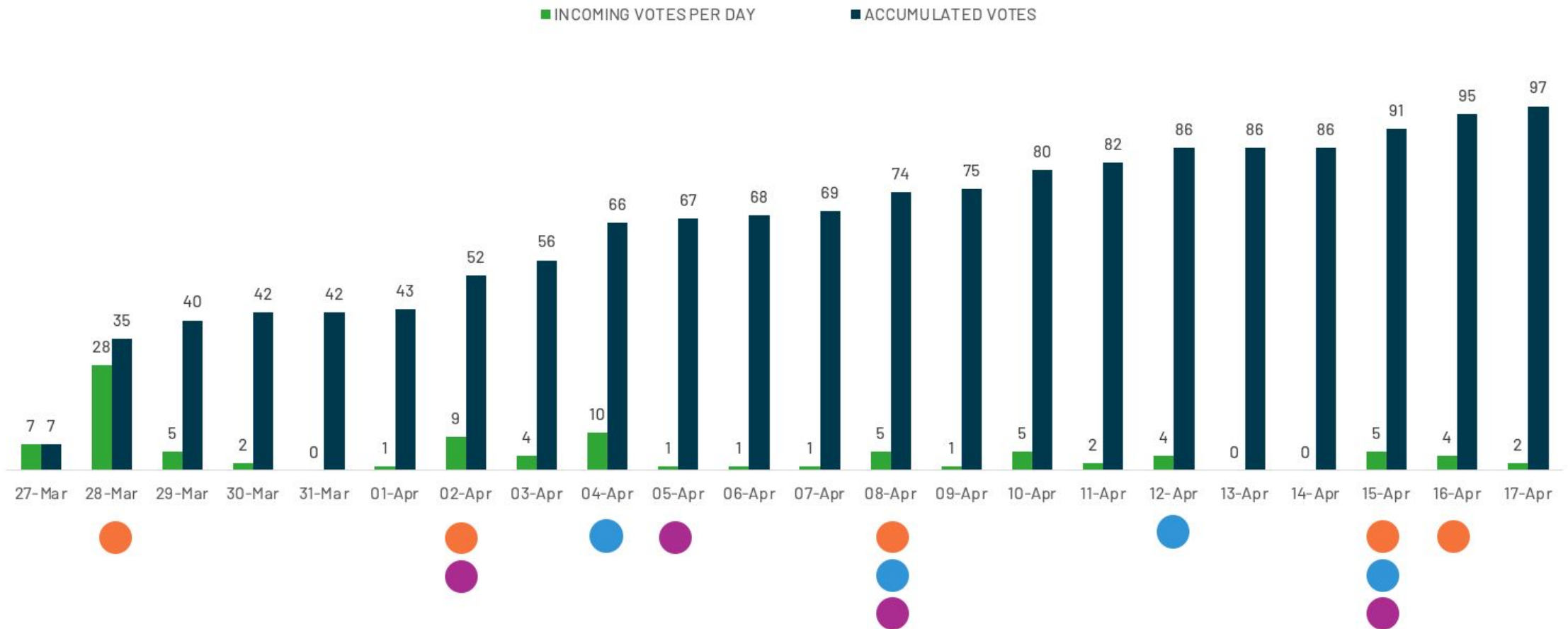
ccPDP4: pre-vote phase



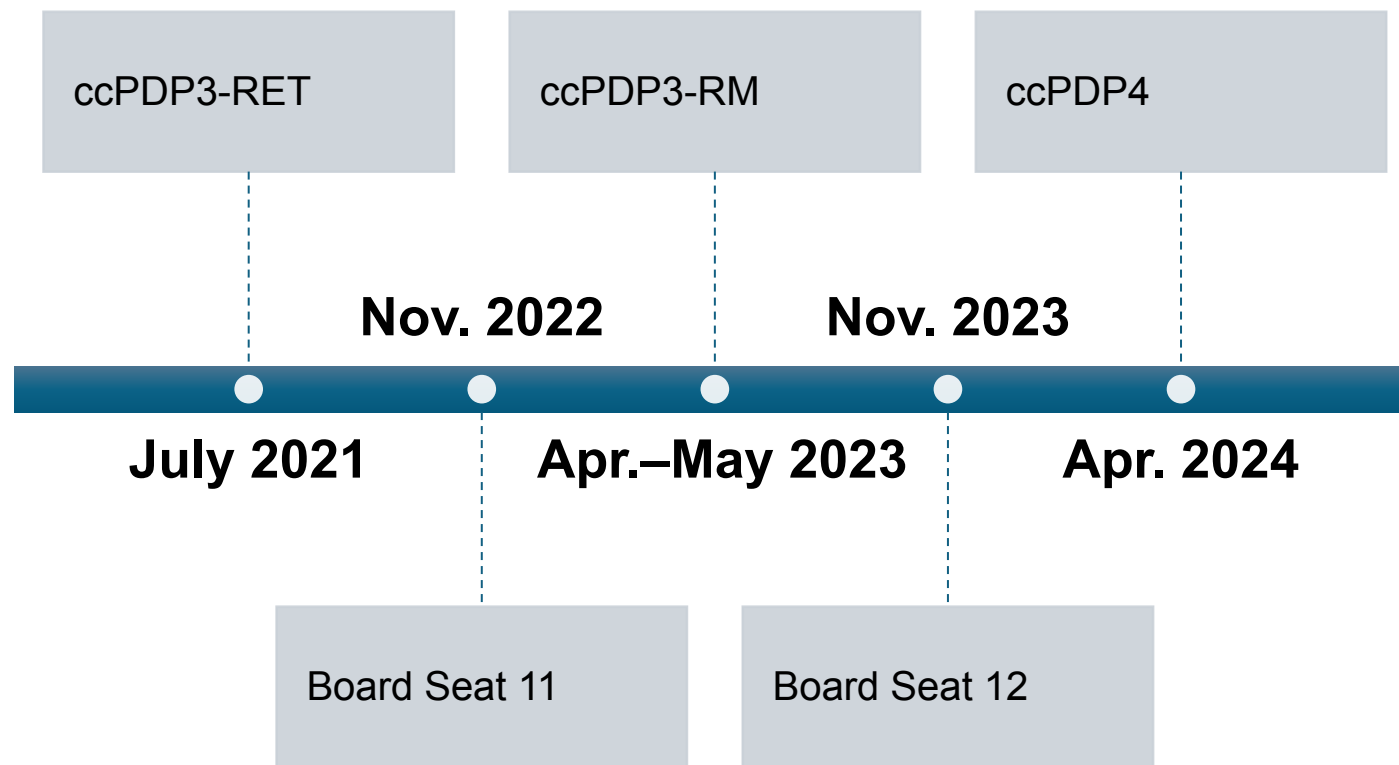
ccPDP4: voting phase

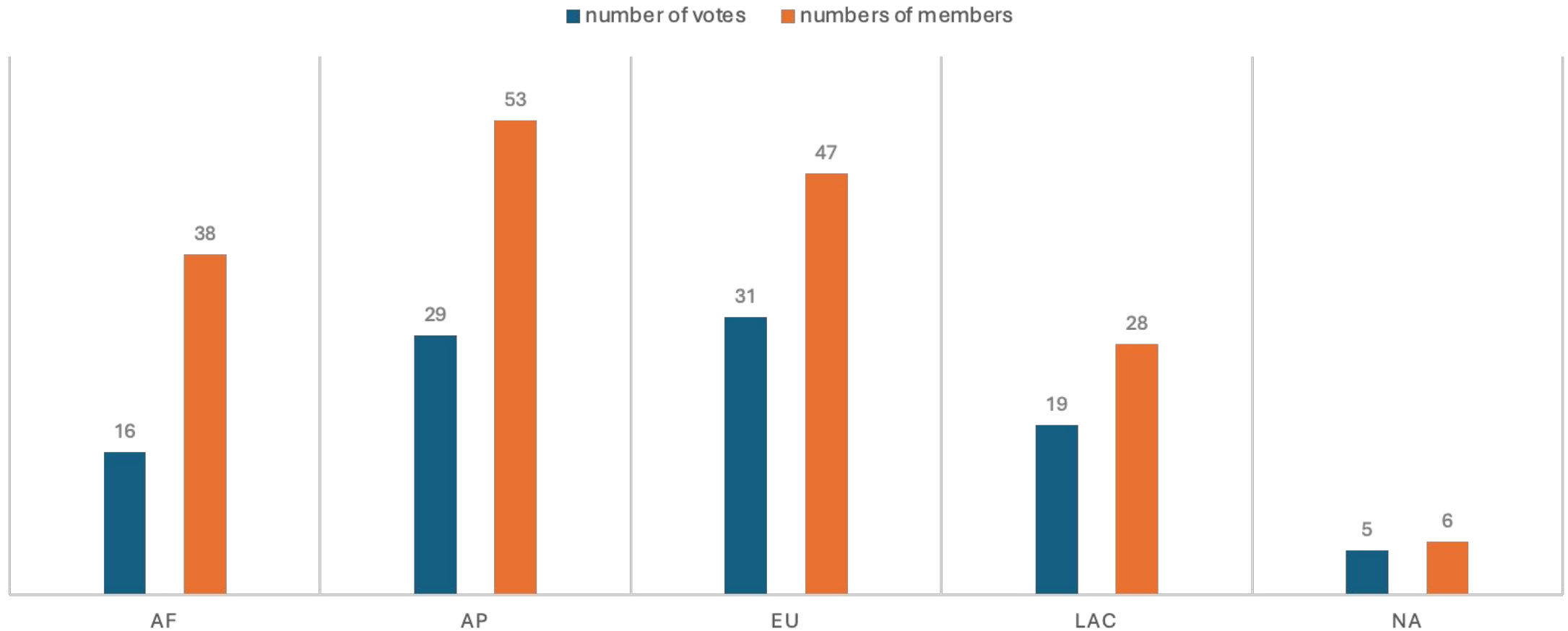

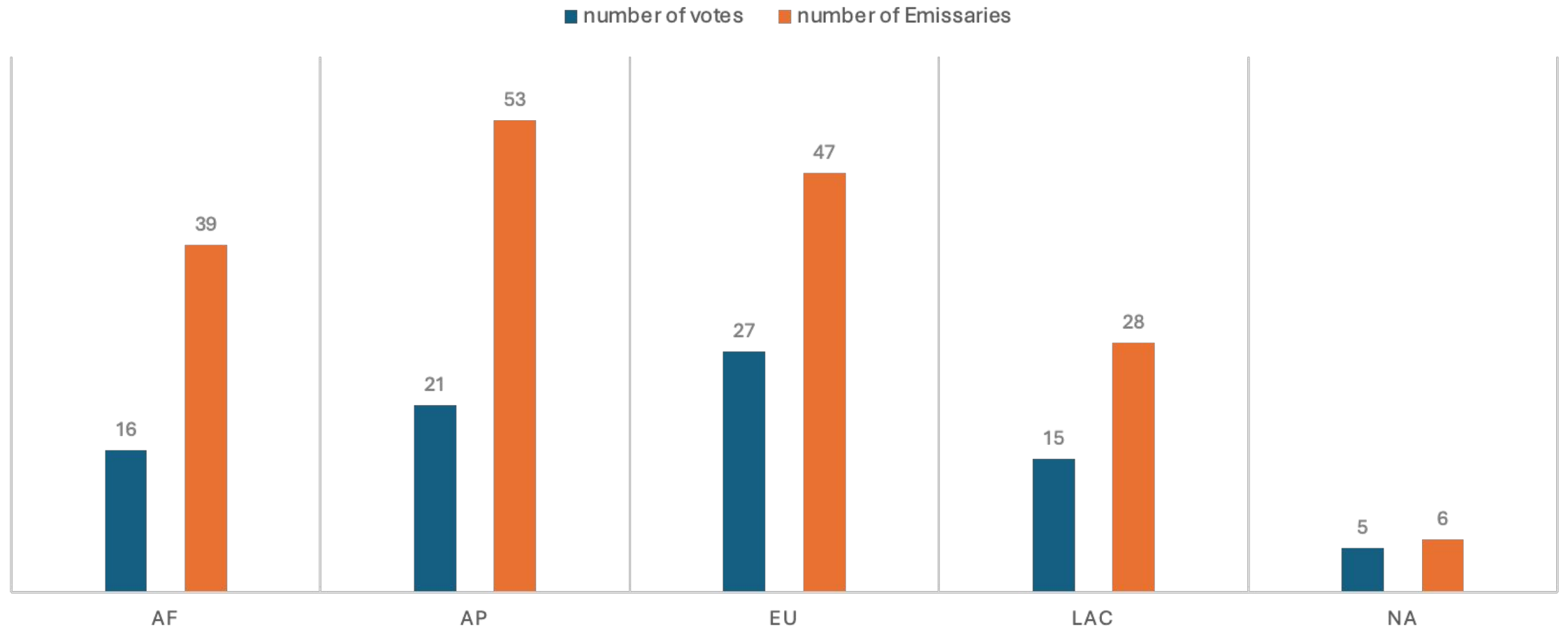

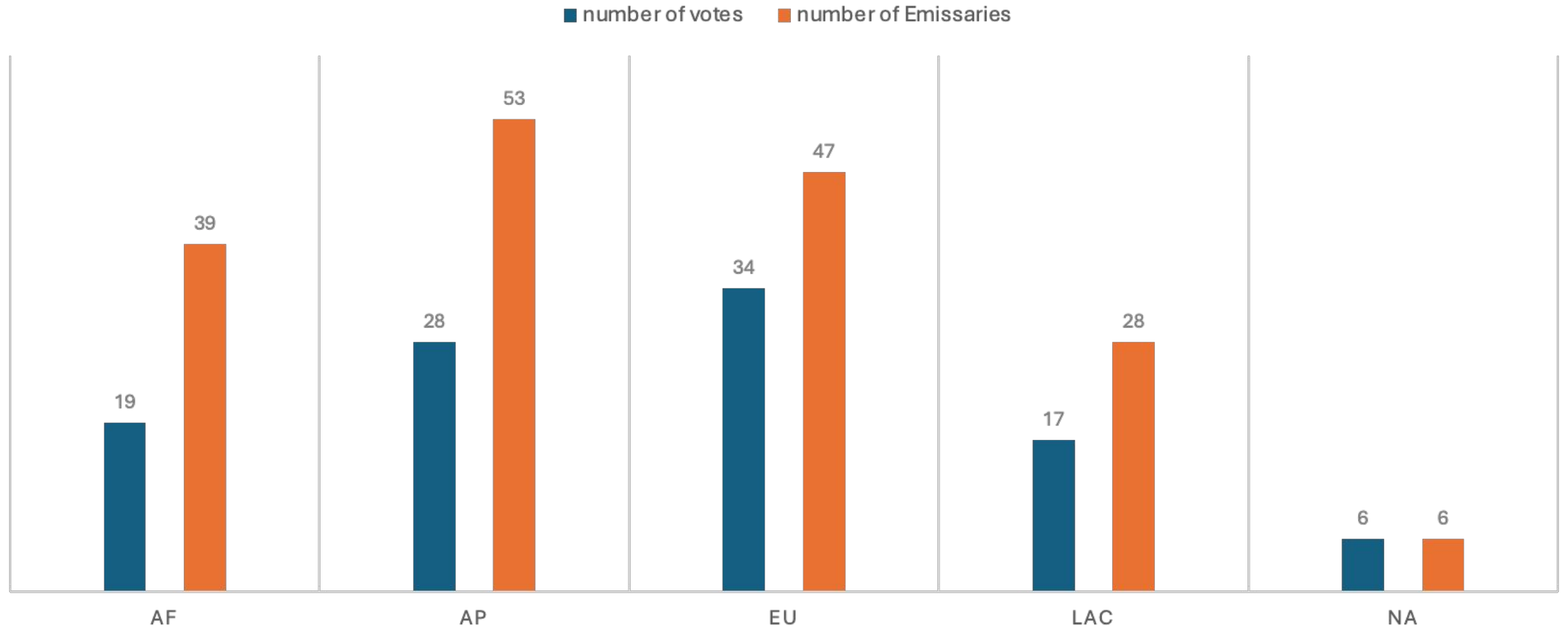

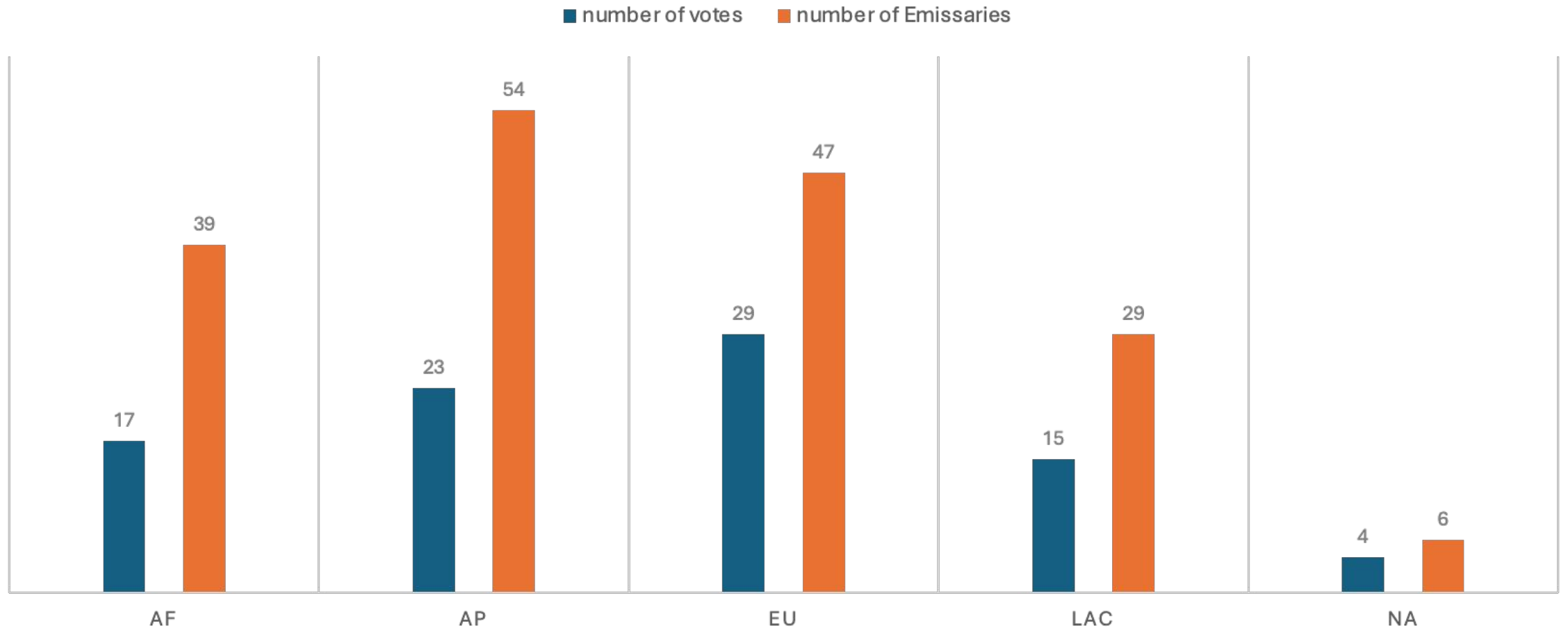

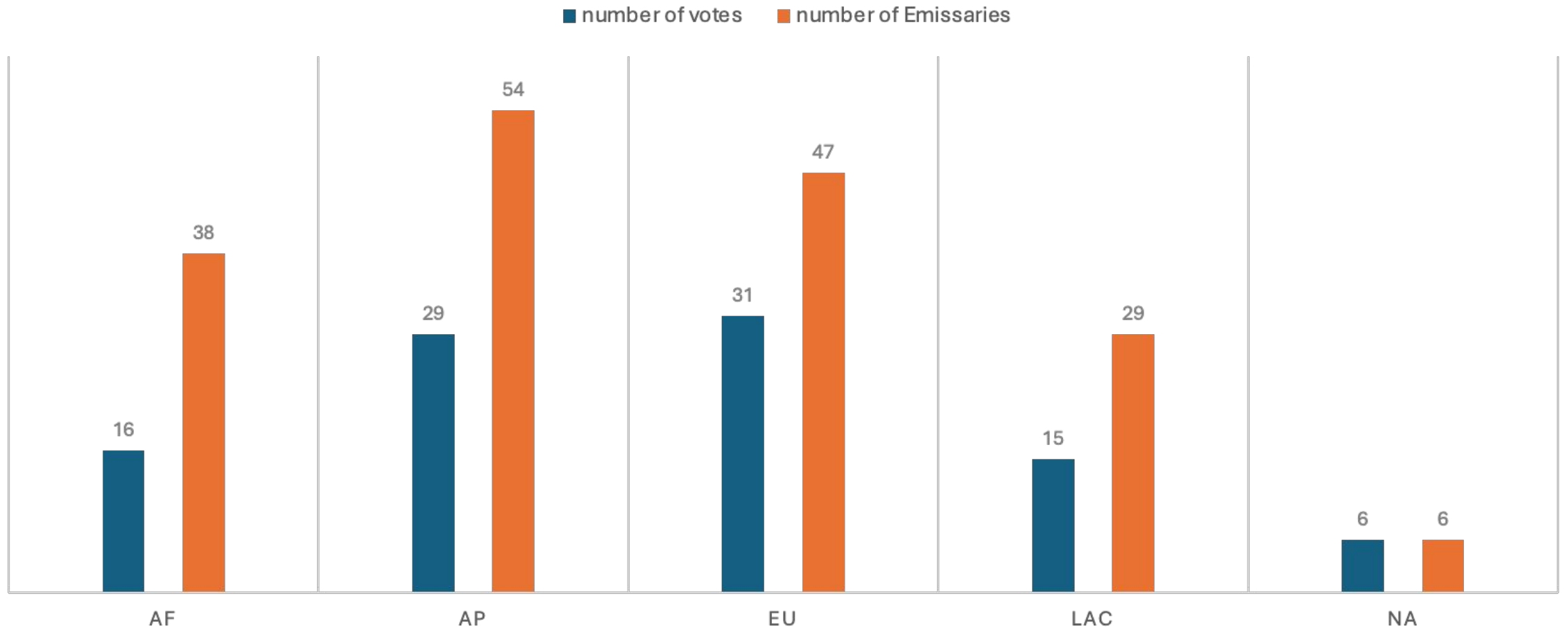

Which percentage of the Members/Emissaries voted per region, per vote?



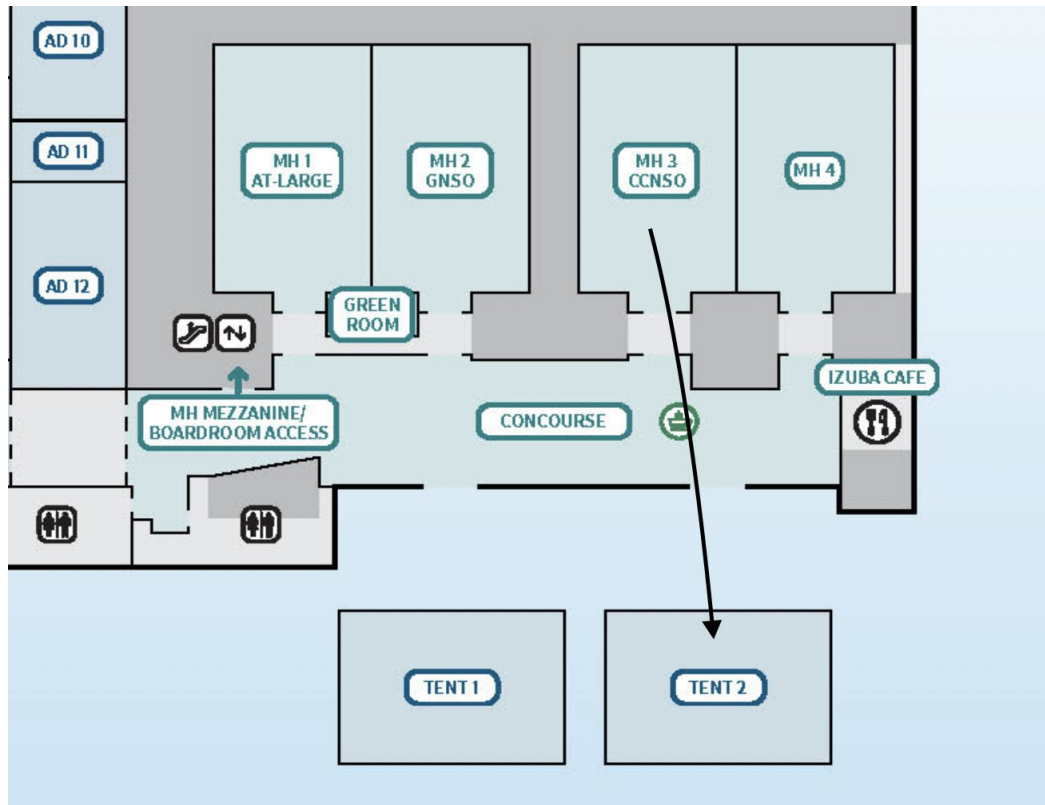
