Table 4: Remaining metrics for evaluation

- 1.11: Cost of domain name policing
 - Update from INTA?
 - Is this a reliable source and will it provide meaningful data for evaluating trust?
- 1.19: Sites dealing in identity fraud
 - Academic sources?
 - Likely remains a complex mapping effort for internal sources.



- 1.21: Errors in gTLD zones
 - Tech services team requires more clarification on "errors." Genuine errors in the way they run DNS data, some are higher up in the registry, like DNSSEC/truncation error. Can an error be algorithmically detected?
- 2.14: Traffic in new gTLDs
 - Tech services recommends sampling particular domains as a representative sample of traffic.
 i.e. Most popular domain names in that TLD?
