

ICANN71 to be Held as a Virtual Meeting

ICANN's Board of Directors has announced that ICANN71 will be held as a virtual Public Meeting due to the continuing impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The ICANN71 Policy Forum was scheduled to be held in The Hague, Netherlands, from 14-17 June 2021. The meeting dates will remain the same.

The 2021 Nominating Committee (NomCom) is inviting applicants for key leadership positions within ICANN, including:

- Three members of the ICANN Board of Directors
- Three regional representatives for the At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC) – one each representing the Africa region, Asia, Australia, and Pacific Islands region, and Latin America and Caribbean region



- Two members of the Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO) Council one each representing the Contracted Parties House and Non-Contracted Parties House
- One member of the Country Code Names Supporting Organization (ccNSO) Council

CANTO successfully completes the 37th Annual General Meeting

The Caribbean Association of National Telecommunications Operators (CANTO) held its 37th Annual General Meeting (AGM37) on 8-9 February 2021, virtually. In the midst of reshaping the new age of emerging technology in the Caribbean region, all industries are driven to change or modify their business strategies and services to a new environment by enabling smart communities, cities, and nations, and to revolutionize and innovate cutting edge solutions to the networking challenges of today and tomorrow. Key stakeholders engaged in lively discussions on these themes at CANTO AGM37.

POLICY UPDATE

GNSO Council Approves New gTLD Subsequent Procedures PDP Final Report

On 18 February 2021, the Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO) Council voted on the Final Report of the New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Policy Development

Process (PDP). Concluding five years of work, this working group put forward hundreds of affirmations, recommendations, and implementation guidance under 41 topics (collectively referred to as "outputs").

Only two outputs did not receive consensus or full consensus support from the working group. The GNSO Council unanimously approved all outputs except for those two. The GNSO Council also requested that the ICANN Board



initiate an Operational Design Phase on the Final Report and that the ICANN org convene an Implementation Review Team to implement the outputs.

Expediting the Policy Proposals on Retirement of ccTLDs

The third Country Code Names Supporting Organization (ccNSO) Policy Development Process Working Group (ccPDP3) submitted its Interim Report to the Issue Manager for consideration by the ccNSO. The Issue Manager is now seeking Public Comment on the Interim Report.

This proceeding includes the proposed policy recommendations for the retirement of country code top-level domains (ccTLDs) and separation of ccPDP3 into two parts: part one, the retirement of ccTLDs; and part two, proposed policy recommendations for a review mechanism of decisions pertaining to the delegation, transfer, revocation, and retirement of ccTLDs. If the separation receives support, the ccNSO decision process on the retirement policy will start in April 2021 without waiting for the completion of part two.

GNSO Council Initiates PDP to Review Transfer Policy



On 18 February 2021, the Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO) Council initiated a two-phase Policy Development Process (PDP) to review the Transfer Policy.

This PDP is tasked to determine if changes to the policy are needed to improve the ease, security, and efficacy of inter-registrar and inter-registrant transfers.

After incorporating feedback received via Public Comment, the Final Issue Report recommends that the PDP address the following topics in sequence: Form of Authorization and AuthInfo Codes (Phase 1a); change of registrant (Phase 1b); transfer emergency action contact and reversing inter-registrar transfers, Transfer Dispute Resolution Policy, NACKing transfers, and ICANN-approved transfers (Phase 2).

The GNSO Council requested that the working group be convened as soon as possible after the adoption of the proposed PDP charter, incorporating PDP 3.0 improvements. **Learn more.**
