**What's new in ICANN?**

On March 14th, a historical announcement made by the government of the United States stated that the government was ready to transfer its stewardship of the important Internet technical functions to the global community. The transfer to the global community of the supervising role was something that had been planned a long time ago and this announcement shows that the United States government recognizes ICANN's maturity as a multistakeholder organization. ICANN was then tasked to convene the global community to develop the transition process of the United States government stewardship to a global community consensus-driven mechanism.

"We are inviting governments, the private sector, civil society, and other Internet organizations from the whole world to join us in developing this transition process", said Fadi Chehadé, ICANN's President and CEO. "All stakeholders deserve a voice in the management and governance of this global resource as equal partners."

Even though 240 sessions were held, some of the main topics worth noting are the IANA transition process, Internet governance and ICANN's efforts in terms of responsibility and transparency. Our region, as part of the LAC strategy, now has its own permanent space in the ICANN global meetings. This time, making use of the participation of several actors from Asia Pacific, we held an exchange to get to know more about the DNS ecosystem in Asia. **Update on the LAC Strategic Plan**



During this time, we have also been working hard to make our LAC-i-Roadshow a reality. This is an important initiative within our Strategic Plan, developed by the region's multiple stakeholders represented by ICANN.

This plan is designed to show the entire region key aspects related to DNS's critical infrastructure, such as the transition to IPv6, SSR (Security, Stability and Resiliency) and the impact of the New gTLD Program. To ensure a good distribution of the events, there will be four editions each year: in the Caribbean, the Andean region, Mexico and Central America, and South America.

In this framework, this year we will be developing promotional materials and we will be visiting on a standby basis the following countries on the stated dates:

- Trinidad and Tobago: April 25th, 2014.
- Colombia: September, 2014.
- Mexico: September, 2014.
- Sao Paulo: October, 2014.

Moreover, we want to emphasize another important update, this time related to a change in leadership in LACRALO. LACRALO is the At-Large organization of the Latin American and Caribbean region and it is composed by a group of people from the region that belong to and represent organizations from different countries. LACRALO is one of the four organizations seeking to collaborate in the ICANN policy development process in its corresponding regions. In this opportunity, we would like to thank the outgoing President José Arce for his unflagging commitment, and to welcome and congratulate Alberto Soto, the new President of LACRALO.

Finally, and as another recent and important event in the region, we want to focus on the approval of the Civil Rights Framework in Brazil granted by the Chamber of Deputies of the Brazilian Congress on March 25th, 2014. This legislation intends to guarantee civil rights in the use of Internet in the country, and it is now awaiting the approval of the Federal Senate.
