Notes

- At present, 84 individuals have started the survey, but only about 40-45 individuals have completed it.
- Reminders will be sent on 8-September-2014 to those who have not yet completed the survey. A second reminder will be sent on 16-September-2014.
- The Working Party asked if there was a specific point at which individuals dropped out of the survey. Westlake indicated that once individuals entered the substantive sections of the survey, they tended to complete the survey.
- The Working Party asked if anyone was filling out the comment boxes. Westlake indicated that individuals were, but that no pattern in terms of filling out the comment boxes had yet been observed.
- The Working Party noted that the participation of GAC members in the review was encouraging.

- Staff noted the extension of the survey to the 23-September-2014.
- Staff thanked the Working Party for their input on the GNSO Review Supplementary 360 Assessment, particularly on the GNSO Review Mailing List. Specifically, that the Supplementary 360 Assessment take place after the initial 360 Assessment.
- It was noted that Working Groups can vary in terms of quality for various reasons and that it was a good idea to not have a generalized survey for the Working Groups, but rather the individual surveys.
- The Working Party confirmed its support for not running two overlapping surveys.
- In terms of the interviews to be completed, Westlake noted that it was working with Staff and the Community to identify key individuals who Westlake should interview.
- Westlake noted that interviews would be completed in person, as well as via telecommunications methods such as telephone and Skype. Westlake also noted that it wished to target no more than 20 individuals in person and no more than 20 individuals via telecommunications methods.
- Staff noted a tentative time and date for the GNSO Working Party to meet at the ICANN Meeting in Los Angeles, but also noted that a finalized time would later be sent to the list.
- Staff noted that the originally published timeline was being reviewed as the survey extension caused a delay in scheduling.
