Notes

- At present, there have been 66 total responses, of which 34 have been completed. This number is not to say that responders will not continue to take the survey, as they can be easily come back and take the survey.
- While there has been participation from various stakeholder groups across ICANN, about of half of responses have been from the GNSO.
- The Working Party had previously discussed the possibility of extending the close of the survey to September 23. It was decided that this approach would in fact go ahead. It was decided that this announcement would go out in the first week of September in order to achieve maximum effectiveness.
- To help the responses and to ensure that the Westlake team has broad and diverse set of responses to analyze, ICANN Staff will continue its outreach efforts.
- The mechanism of reminding individuals to complete their surveys is being developed.
- The group discussed the issue of surveying the various Working Groups.
 Westlake noted that September would be a good time to launch a specific Working Group focused survey of no more than perhaps about three pages

- long. As of now, the survey would be targeted towards individuals, but as the scope of the survey has not been finalized, the final details will be released closer to the launch.
- Some timing for the LA meeting and interviews were discussed, but it was noted that it is difficult to arrange the meetings, as the ICANN schedule has not yet been published. However, it was noted that the meeting should be an open session.
