Notes

- The Registry Constituency expressed concern that they are limited up to three members.
- It was noted that the purpose for the cap on membership is to ensure that the group can complete its work in a short amount of time. However, once the 360 Assessment is launched, everyone in the community will have the opportunity to provide feedback.
- A concern over an equal number of members per stakeholder group was expressed.

- There will be an online survey to ensure that people can give their input on this process. The survey should take no longer than 5-10 minutes.
- The survey will be translated into the 6 UN Languages.
- The survey will give respondents the choice to identify their affiliation and/or relationship to the ICANN Community.
- The Working Party is to test and review the survey before it is distributed.
- The question of making the survey anonymous was raised, but no consensus was reached. Some felt that there would be more respondents if the survey is anonymous, but others were concerned that there may be a flooding of comments if the survey is anonymous.
- In terms of scaling, the survey would most likely give respondents the choice of providing answers on a scale of one to five.
- There would not be an expectation that each question be answered for each of the structural components.
- Tailoring of the questions based on how a respondent self-identifies was raised. In particular, there may be utility in having one set of questions directed to people with in-depth knowledge of the GNSO and another set for people with minimal knowledge.
- The technology for the survey is CVENT.
- The GNSO Review wiki is public.

Action Items

- Matt Ashtiani is to resend the 360 Assessment Proposed Draft (survey) to the group as new members were added recently.
- The members of the GNSO Review Working Party will review the 360 Assessment Proposed Draft in detail and provide feedback at the next meeting, on 29 May 2014.
- Based on the feedback to be provided on 29 May, Staff will develop a test 360 Assessment to check for ease of use, clarity and functionality.
