2ND Africa DNS Forum - 2014: Iulv 7-9. Abuia Nigeria

The 2014 DNS forum was hosted by <u>Nigeria Internet Registration Association</u> (NIRA). This was the second forum in Africa after the inaugural DNS forum held in Durban during ICANN 47 and was jointly organized and sponsored by AfTLD, ISOC and ICANN with and other partners. The overall theme was "*monetization of the African Domain Names Space*"

The opening was presided over by the Director of E-government in the Ministry ICT - Federal Republic of Nigeria on behalf of the Minister, and moderated by NIRA president Mrs. Mary Uduma. Yaovi represented ICANN in the opening address, which was also addressed by the ICANN VP for Africa through video. Over 150 participants attended. **Some key topics discussed include:**

- 1. Key note address on "Monetizing Africa's top level Domains"
- 2. Registries Business: Growing the African Domain Name Reseller and
- 3. Increasing Reseller Domain Name Sales

The level of participation and attendance witnessed (including in social media) shows improved community awareness and the *DNS Forum* is another promising platform in the African Internet calendar to discuss and seek solutions to various issues affecting the DNS industry in a true multi-stakeholder model. Highlights from ICANN 50

As you know, ICANN 50 in London, was the largest meeting yet in terms of participation, we had over 3,000 people turn up, in addition to the 175 Ministers representing over 77 countries that came for the parallel High Level Panel meeting and representatives from about 160 At-Large Structures for the ATLAS II Summit, another parallel meeting that took place during the week. The meeting was themed around 3 core areas, which also represent ICANN's priority for the year ahead namely:

- > IANA stewardship transition & ICANN accountability
- Globalization and the hardening of ICANN's organization and operations
- > Evolution of the Global Domains Division

This meeting demonstrated that the multi-stakeholder model is legitimate, and is critical to maintain the open and free Internet

Inaugural Coordination Group (ICG) Meeting: London UK

On 6 June 2014, ICANN published a Process to <u>Develop the Proposal and Next Steps</u> that is the culmination of a series of community discussions and input into the process to develop a proposal to transition stewardship of the IANA functions to the global multistakeholder community. The document reflects the multitude of views expressed in different fora and calls for the establishment of Coordination Group, among other things.

The Coordination Group has since been created & comprised of 27 individuals representing 13 communities, and includes direct and indirect stakeholders. Africa IGF: July 10 - 12 Abuja Nigeria

The <u>3rd Africa IGF</u> was held on **10-12 of July 2014** at the NICON Luxury Hotel, Abuja- Nigeria. Jointly organized by the AUC and UNECA and sponsored by ICANN, ISOC, Google and. Africa amongst other, this years edition saw a record attendance of over 300 participants representing over 23 countries including Brazil and the US, a truly multi-stakeholder event.

The opening was presided over by the Hon. minister for ICT-Federal Government of Nigeria Mrs. Omobola Johnson who is also the current chairperson of CSTD. (She later chaired a panel on CSTD 10 review of the progress made in the implementation of the WSIS outcomes). The theme for 2014 was: "Connecting Continents for Enhanced Multi stakeholder Internet Governance" with sub themes as:

- 1. Policies enabling Access
- 2. Content Creation, Dissemination and Use
- 3. Internet as engine for growth & development
- 4. IGF & The Future of the Internet ecosystem and
- 5. Enhancing Digital Trust

Once again there was great focus on the IANA stewardship transition and Africa's participation and influence on IG. At the closing session, delegates stressed the need to restructure the current AfIGF secretariat to make it more open and inclusive and the urgent need for sustainable funding.
