# **FY14 Flagship Projects**

### 1) Team Outreach Activities

The Africa staff has carried out a number of Outreach engagement missions recently. This is in line with the ICANN Africa strategy of deepening awareness around Internet Governance and reaching out to Africa's stakeholders to revive and improve their participation in ICANN activities as well as participation in the Internet Ecosystem. Countries visited so far include Togo, Guinea, Liberia, Niger, Congo Senegal, Cape Verde, Namibia, Benin, Mauritius, Uganda, Tanzania, Kenya, Botswana, Malawi, Zimbabwe, Burundi and Rwanda. These missions have been very successful with most countries welcoming the increased visibility and ICANN presence in Africa.

# 2) Workshop on Domain Names, Trademarks and Rights Protection in Africa: Cotonou, Benin, 5-7 May 2014.

This <u>event</u> seeks to address the trademark and rights protection issues that ccTLDs registry managers, registrars and registrants in Africa are facing by providing a platform for sharing ideas on the best practices from experienced panelists and experts IP law. Moreover, African ccTLD managers and registrars will be empowered to better and faster implement measures for their ccTLD security, management and promotion. *You are all welcome and we look forward to your participation!* 

#### **3) DNS Forum 2014**

The Africa Domain Name System (DNS) Forum 2014 will be held as from 7 - 9 July 2014 in Abuja, Nigeria. This year's event will be hosted by the Nigeria Internet Registration Association (NIRA).

Organized by AfTLD, the Internet Society African Bureau and the ICANN with the support of other partners, the event seeks to build a community of practice that will strengthen the Domain Name Industry on the African Continent.

# 4) DNSSEC Roadshows – Phase 2

Our inaugural DNSSEC roadshow project is now in its second year and continues to develop capacity and support African registrars in deploying secure registries. This will further improve stability and security of African domain registries. Already Tanzania, one of the initial beneficiaries of the project has fully signed their root-zone and more countries are undergoing tests. Our latest beneficiary is <a href="Rwanda">Rwanda</a> with Senegal, Zambia and Burkina coming up in the next 2 months. The training focuses on:

- a) DNSSEC Introduction
- b) Business case for DNSSEC
- c) DNS Refresher
- d) DNSSEC Technical overview
- e) DNSSEC protocol detail and deployment
- f) Implementation consideration and risk analysis
