OnApril17,2002,theInternationalFederationofRedCrossandRedCrescentSocietiesand theInternationalCommitteeoftheR edCrosspresentedtheSecretariatwithaReportentitled "Cyber-misuseoftheProtectedNamesandEmblemsoftheInternationalRedCrossandRed CrescentMovement:ACaseforSpecialProtection,"whichdetailstheirexperiencewithregardto theabusive registration,asdomainnames,oftheprotectednamesandacronymsoftheconstituent partsoftheInternationalRedCrossandRedCrescentMovement.Asthemembersofthe StandingCommitteeontheLawofTrademarks,IndustrialDesignsandGeographicalIn dications (SCT)hadrequested,atthefirstSpecialSessionoftheSCT,furtherevidenceoftheextentofthe problemoftheabusiveregistration,asdomainnames,ofthenamesandacronymsofinternational organizations,theReportprovidedbytheRedCro ssandRedCrescentMovementissubmittedby theSecretariatfortheinformationofthesecondSpecialSessionoftheSCT.

 $The names and embl \ \ ems of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement \ \ - The need for protection and the provisions of international law that provide it$ 

- TheRedCrossandRedCrescentnamesandemblemsareinternationallyrecognisedsymbols 1. of protection used by the ecomponents of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. During armed conflict, the security of the Movement's personnel and of those its eeks to assist and protectrequires that the names, acronyms and symbols of the Movement be associated exclusively wi thit. itswork,andwiththeconcept:"Don'tshootatme."Inrecognitionofthisfact,theGeneva ConventionsandtheirAdditionalProtocols -someofthemostwidelyratifiedofinternational treaties -containexplicitprohibitionsagainstunauthoris eduse of the emblems and names andrequireStatespartiestotakeadequatemeasuretopreventandrepressabuses. <sup>1</sup>Intimesofconflict, <sup>2</sup>Atalltimes,theycause suchabusescancostlivesandtherefore, may constitute war crimes. erosionoftherespec tthatcombatantsandcivilianshavefortheMovement,thuscompromising the Movement's ability to fulfilits humanitarian mission.
- 2. Inadditiontotheirprotectivefunctionduringarmedconflict,theemblemsandnameshavea secondarypurpose -toidentif ythecomponentsoftheInternationalRedCrossandRedCrescent Movement.<sup>3</sup>

 $The components, functions and legal status of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent \\ Movement$ 

- $3. \quad The Movement is composed of the National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies \\ , the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and the International Federation of Red Cross \\ and Red Crescent Societies (IFR Cor International Federation). The Movement's mission is to prevent and alleviate human suffering. \\$
- 4. The National Red Cross sand Red Crescent Societies are formed in each country in consequence of the country's ratification of, or accession to, the 1949 Geneva Conventions. They joint he Movement on condition that they are first recognised by their own government and that they use names and emblems in conformity with the Geneva Conventions. They carry out humanitarian activities in their respective countries in accordance with national law and with the Statutes of the Movement.
- 5. NationalSocietieshaveaspecialroleinco -operatingwiththeirgovernmentstoprotectthese emblemsandnamessothattheydonotlosetheirspecialvalue.TheICRCandtheInternational Federationhavetherighttousetheemblemsatalltimes <sup>4</sup>andtheyassistNationalSocietiesand sharewiththem theresponsibilitytoprotecttheemblemsandthenamesoftheMovement.

- 6. TheICRCdirectsandco -ordinatestheinternationalreliefactivitiesconducted by the Movementinsituations of armed conflict and thereby strives to protect the lives and dignity of victims of war and internal violence and to provide them with assistance. It also works to promote and strengthen humanitarian law and universal humanitarian principles. It sinternational legal personality is explicitly recognised by the States with which ich it has concluded agreements acknowledging its status, privileges and immunities. The ICRC enjoys observer status in the United Nations General Assembly.
- 7. TheInternationalFederationisthefederationofcurrently178NationalRedCrossandRed CrescentSocieties.ItsinternationallegalpersonalityisrecognisedbyalargenumberofStates throughstatusagreements,grantingitsimilarprivilegesandimmunitiesenjoyedbytheUNfamily andotherInternationalOrganisations.Itwasalsoconfirmeda saninternationalorganisationby theUNsystem,whenUNGeneralAssemblyResolution492of27October1994grantedthe InternationalFederationobserverstatuswithintheGeneralAssembly.TheInternational Federation'smandateistoco -ordinate,inspir e,encourage,facilitateandpromotethe establishmentanddevelopmentofNationalSocieties,andtheirhumanitarianactivities,especially onbehalfofvictimsofnaturaldisasterandinfieldsofpublichealth.

#### Examplesofmisuse

- 8. Misuseshaveoccurred andcontinuetooccurinallformsinthenon -cyber-world.National Societiesusethenormalproceduresavailabletoattacksuchmisuses,includingactiontakenby theirgovernments,insomecasesthroughcriminalprosecution.Civillegalproceedingshav ealso beenundertaken,eithertopreventortoobtaindamagesformisuse.Asmightbeexpected,misuse alsooccursinthecyber -world,wheretraditionalremediesaredifficultorimpossibletoapply. MisuseofprotecteddesignationsoftheMovementincl udesdomainnamesthatintegratethewords "redcross"or""redcrescent",e.g.,www.redcrossfashions.com.Otherformsofmisuseinclude cybersquattingandthediversionofdomainnamesofcomponentsoftheMovementto pornographicsites. 5Threecasess hallbebrieflymentionedhere:
- (i) TheregionaldelegationoftheInternationalFederationinGuatemalaregisteredthe domainnames"cruzrojahumanidad.org"and"caribredcross.org"onbehalfoftheNational Societiesintheregion.Bothsitesweredesignedt ocreatelinksbetweentheregionaldelegation's web-pageandthewebsitesoftheregion'sNationalSocieties,forinstance www.nicaragua.cruzrojahumanidad.orgorwww.guatemala.cruzrojahumanidad.org.

Attheendof December 2001, the regional delegation eceived a letter from the registrar, asking it to decide within one month if it wanted to renew the reservation for one more year. The delegations entatimely, positive answer, but the domain name had already been committed to another person.

Followingt his,allthesitesusingthedomainnamecruzrojahumanidad.orgwereredirected toapornographysitewiththeaddress"www.tinawebcam.com",includingdirectoriesofmajor searchengines.Forunknownreasons,theaddresswww.cruzrojahumanidad.orgwassubseq uently redirectedtothesiteofaprivatecompany,DomainStrategy.com,showinganeutralpagewiththe comment"Websitecomingsoon".InthiscasetheregistrarwasinCanada,andtheCanadianRed

Crosswasabletoconvincetheownertotransferthename backtotheInternationalFederation. ThiswasaccomplishedbynegotiationledbytheCanadianRedCrossanditwasnotnecessaryto seekgovernmentintervention.InApril2002,DomainStrategy.comagreedtotransferthedomain namebacktotheInternatio nalFederation.

- (ii) Similar difficulties occurred with the domain name "caribred cross.org". This name was linked to a site called "adult city" where pornography was available to gether with an advertisement of fering the site for sale. In quiries through doma in name search sites showed that the domain name was owned through Nic GODD omain Service sin Russia. The Administrative Contact was in Armenia and the Technical Contact was based in the US. With the assistance of the Armenian Red Cross, it was verified tha the address in Armenia was false. The International Federation contacted the American Red Cross, requesting it to contact the Technical Contact and through it, to locate the cyber squatter. The domain name "caribred cross.org" is no longer in use, but it has not been transferred back to the International Federation.
- (iii) ThethirdcaseinvolvesthemaliciousmisrepresentationofaNationalSociety throughtheregistrationofacopyofthesitewithadomainnameusingthesamebasicnameasthat oftheNati onalSociety,butwithadifferentsuffix(".net"inplaceof".org"). The misrepresentationinvolvedthesubstitutionofsomesectionsofthesitewithtextandpictures whichdefamedtheSocietyanditshumanitarianprinciples.

This case was ultimately closed, but not before several interventions. During the process the site was moved about to business addresses in several different countries. This case does not, however, involve the same name protection is sue sast he first two, as the National Societ yhad not used the protected name "red crescent" in its own domain name. Theseexamplesshowthatincyberspace,neithergovernmentsnorcomponentsoftheRed CrossandRedCrescentMovementpresentlypossessthetoolsnecessarytofulfilt heirobligation toprotecttheemblemsandthenames"RedCross"and"RedCrescent".Althoughsomemisuses seemtohavebeenstoppedthroughpainstakingeffort,themajoritypersist.Thesecanrangefrom theverydamagingmisusesbypornographicsites,t otheespeciallyegregiousabuseof cybersquatting,examplesofwhicharehighlightedin *AppendixA*,attached.Inaddition,itshould benotedthatendinganabusedoesnothingtoredressthedamagecaused.Tothatend,readily availableandefficientre medialproceduresarerequired.

Conclusion:reliefsoughtbytheInternationalRedCrossandRedCrescentMovement

10. ThedomesticlawsandremedialproceduresofStatesareatbest,cumbersome,andatworst, insufficienttopreventandrepressabuseoft heemblemsanddesignationsoftheRedCrossand RedCrescentMovement.InsomeStates,theyaresimplyunavailable.Inothers,theyare theoreticallyavailablebutmaybeunreliable,excessivelyexpensiveforpublicinterest organisations,orexcessively ytimeconsuming.Aremedyinonecase,inoneState,doesnotcreate aprecedentforlikecasesinotherStates.State -by Stateenforcementissimplyimpracticalfor misusesthatarisefromtechnologyspanningtheglobalcommunity.Thelegalobligation ofStates

to"takemeasuresforthepreventionandrepression,atalltimes" of abuse of the emblems and designations of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movementhas already been noted. A step toward fulfilment of that obligation would be the establishmen to fasimple, efficient administrative procedure to remedy misuses of its names, which are protected under international law.
