Michele Neylon: how many comment periods over what period?

Michele Neylon: sorry - that number sounded really really high

Ken Bour: @Michele: Total of 286 solicitations from 2010-2014 (2Q)

Michele Neylon: whoa

Glenn: voice dropped

Ken Bour: The average is 5-6 per month or 16-18 per quarter.

Michele Neylon: that's 71.5 / year

Michele Neylon: which is more than 1 per week

Michele Neylon: without even considering holidays etc

Glenn: not alot

Glenn: holidays what is that?

Glenn: volume was ok and then back down low

Dev Anand Teelucksingh: Q: re: 2 Global Leaders (in slide 5) - what are

"Global Leaders"

Carlos Reyes: @Dev, Global Leaders is the collective term for some of ICANN's

senior staff members (David Olive, Sally Costerton, etc.)

Dev Anand Teelucksingh: ah, thanks Carlos

Carlos Reyes: You are welcome.

Michele Neylon: I think we should give them special badges or hats or

something:)

Michele Neylon: /me ducks

Michele Neylon: I assume those reports are also being used by the ICANN

Board?

Dev Anand Teelucksingh: Q: How would the community be made aware that the staff report was filed? Is it only the public comment period table on the site? Would the persons/entities that submitted comments be contacted when the staff report is published?

Ken Bour: @Dev: There is a "Follow" option for each solicitation. I'm advised that clicking that will notify the user when the Staff Summary report is published.

Michele Neylon: The "follow" option is very handy

David Olive: Yes, Michele, the reports on public commemnts are included in Board briefing papers

Michele Neylon: David - I thought they might be .. which is why their "accuracy"

is key

David Olive: Yes, I agree

Michele Neylon: I don't have the dial in details but I'm happy to post any

comments here

David Olive: Yes Please

Michele Neylon: I like the overall improvements

Michele Neylon: I am still concerned by the sheer volume of public comments

Michele Neylon: periods

Dev Anand Teelucksingh: @Ken and Carlos - thanks

Michele Neylon: Killing ther reply period = good idea

Michele Neylon: longer comment periods = good

Ken Bour: @Michele: Of interest, perhaps, the median number of comments per solicitation = 5.0

Dev Anand Teelucksingh: Q: any hopes of standardising scheduling the release of public comments - the release of public comment periods appear to be ad-hoc

Michele Neylon: Ken - interesting

Michele Neylon: Ken - though I know some of the periods get huge numbers while others get 0 - 2/3

Michele Neylon: .xxx had how many? 3000?

Ken Bour: @Michele: True! I used median vs. average for that reason.

Michele Neylon: Ken:)

Michele Neylon: Comment: more outreach via other channels would be a good thing and I'd encourage it

Michele Neylon: Some of the comments made by attendees at Namescon were interesting and quite worrying

Michele Neylon: ie. they weren't really aware of what had been going on

Ken Bour: @Dev: The "release" schedule has been explored, but we haven't settled on any implementation scheme. It's a tricky problem and has pluses and minuses.

Carlos Reyes: @Dev -- we did explore the idea of standardizing the release of public comment proceedings

Dev Anand Teelucksingh: Also, what happens to URLs - when public comments are closed - so if someone searches an email link a year later - would a link work?

Carlos Reyes: @Dev, yes

David Olive: Thanks All

Michele Neylon: Dev - they should do

Carlos Reyes: Each proceeding has a dedicated page
