Rafik: I am not sure to understand what we mean by "ICANN decision-making processes" here.

Collin Kurre: For example, PDPs, but also the decision-making processes behind advisory committees' recommendations

Collin Kurre: On Michele's intervention, it's interesting to note that problems of scale go both ways. Big companies operating in many jurisdictions face a certain set of problems in terms of due diligence, but so do small companies that may not have the weight or resources to easily affect change

Michele Neylon: Collin - true - we're 100% Irish based

Michele Neylon: we don't have offices anywhere else

Collin Kurre: Great point about leverage and remit, David.

Michael Karanicolas: Defining the scope of human rights is also crucial, I think.

Michael Karanicolas: Michael Samway mentioned the UDHR as a key guiding principle there.

Michael Karanicolas: But I would note that, while freedom of expression and the right to privacy would naturally be expected to be the main focuses of an HRIA in ICANN's context, that doesn't mean that other human rights will never be relevant
