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# 5 WAYS TO BUILD AND MAINTAIN STRONG PASSWORDS

Never give out your password

This includes someone asking in person (e.g., parents, significant other) or in an email link or over the telephone

Use, at the minimum, 8 alphanumeric characters, letters, and numbers

If you have an account that will allow it, use (e.g., % or ?) too. When you use letters, use upper and lower-case. The longer and more complex the password gets the harder it is to crack

Create a different password for every account

(e.g., ECU email, Yahoo email, Facebook, eBay). This way if one account is compromised, the key will not open all doors

Use passphrases

For example, a line from a song or poem and use the first letters of each word. (e.g., "Once upon a midnight dreary, while I pondered" could become this password "ouAmndW1p")

Change your password every 6 months

Make new passwords every 6 months on each account. Make sure not to recycle your passwords!

A strong password is like a lock on your car, apartment, or house--it keeps others away from your online privacy and electronic things. Those things are your email, bank accounts, credit card accounts, etc. Building and maintaining strong passwords will make it much more difficult for a computer hacker to destroy your life and your credibility. Hackers try to guess passwords by using your personal life against you--names of a significant other, a telephone number, or the name of your pet or hometown. If guessing doesn't work they will use a piece of software to guess (or "crack") for them.

## Avoid

- Using a password generator--hackers have those too!
- Writing your password down!
- Sending your password(s) in an email!
- Allowing people to look over your shoulder while you type your password(s)!

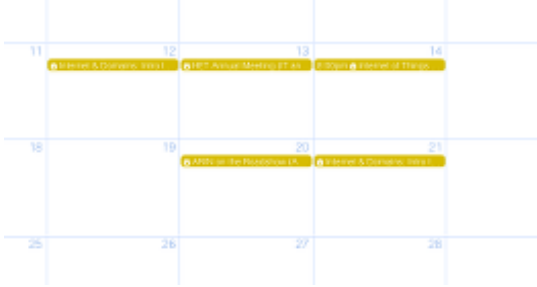
