

2nd Draft Report

ICANN shall have no power to act other than in accordance with, and as reasonably appropriate to achieve its Mission.

Without in any way limiting the foregoing absolute prohibition, ICANN shall not regulate services that use the Internet's unique identifiers, or the content that such services carry or provide.

3rd Draft Report

ICANN shall act strictly in accordance with, and only as reasonably appropriate to achieve its Mission.

ICANN shall not impose regulations on services (i.e., any software process that accepts connections from the Internet) that use the Internet's unique identifiers, or the content that such services carry or provide.

ICANN shall have the ability to negotiate, enter into and enforce agreements with contracted parties in [service of][support of][furtherance of] its Mission.

ICANN shall act strictly in accordance with, and only as reasonably appropriate to achieve its Mission.

ICANN shall not

- (A) impose regulations on services (i.e., any software process that accepts connections from the Internet) that use the Internet's unique identifiers, or the content that such services carry or provide; or
- (B) Impose –directly or indirectly – contractual obligations or conditions on the conduct or behavior of domain name registrants, except to the extent that (1) the domain name registration is causing harm to 3rd parties or (2) the conduct or behavior is causing harm to the stable and secure operation of the DNS.

ICANN shall have the ability to negotiate, enter into and enforce agreements with contracted parties in **service of its Mission**
