A two to three paragraph statement about your knowledge of the GNSO community's structures and operations and any participation therein	After 3 years representing the Government of Costa Rica in the GAC (2011-2014), and after finishing my 5 year term as Commissioner of our National Regulatory Agency, I motivated my colleagues in the ISOC Costa Rica Chapters to get involved beyond ALAC, and continue the good work Marie-Laure Lemineur and Ricardo Monge had done in NPOC. 2013 I had an exceptional opportunity to experience the AoC Review first hand by participating in the second ATRT Review. And while not all issues I would liked to have been included where included in the discussions and the final report, I enjoyed the seriousness of the meetings, discussion and work. I also learned a lot of the tight time management and effective coordination of the Chair and Co Chairs of the Review Team. 2014 at the suggestion of some NCSG members I put forwards my name to the NomCom for the GNSO Council and we honoured with the rare opportunity of the independent member of the Council. In my first year in the Council I have focused on the efforts to improve work with the GAC and also Co Chaired the CWG on the Use of Country and Territory Names, both a result of past experience in the GAC on some geographic names that failed to become gTLDS. For the second year I hope to see more progress and participate in areas related to future rounds, in particular the possibility to use at least some of auction proceeds, in improving the market conditions of the DNS in underserved areas, regional excellence centers, and more flexibility and lower cost to use geographic, cultural and linguistic terms as TLDs.

question	well known for its heavy asset structure and strong geographical economies of

scale. Over that period I had to deal with various cases of international trade related Antidumping claims both in Europe as well as in the USA, as well as M&A that were reviewed in different jurisdictions in Latin America. Later in Costa Rica's National Regulatory Agency we had to create from scratch a new consumer protection procedures for the opening Telecom Market, and establish clear obligations for the new private operators, both in their spectrum concessions with the Government, as well as the service contracts with customers. I believe that the global assumption that the Internet should remain unregulated has already created very dominant market positions by intermediaries between the classical operators and content providers, whereas some of the users rights in terms of privacy, data protection and freedom of expression have been compromised in the name of network efficiencies. I consider the CCT Review as first of its kind, and a strong statement in terms of ICANNs commitment to accountability and the openness of the Internet.
