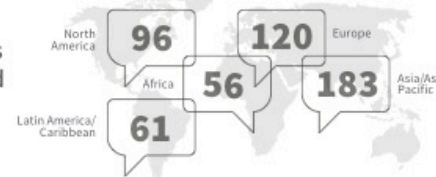

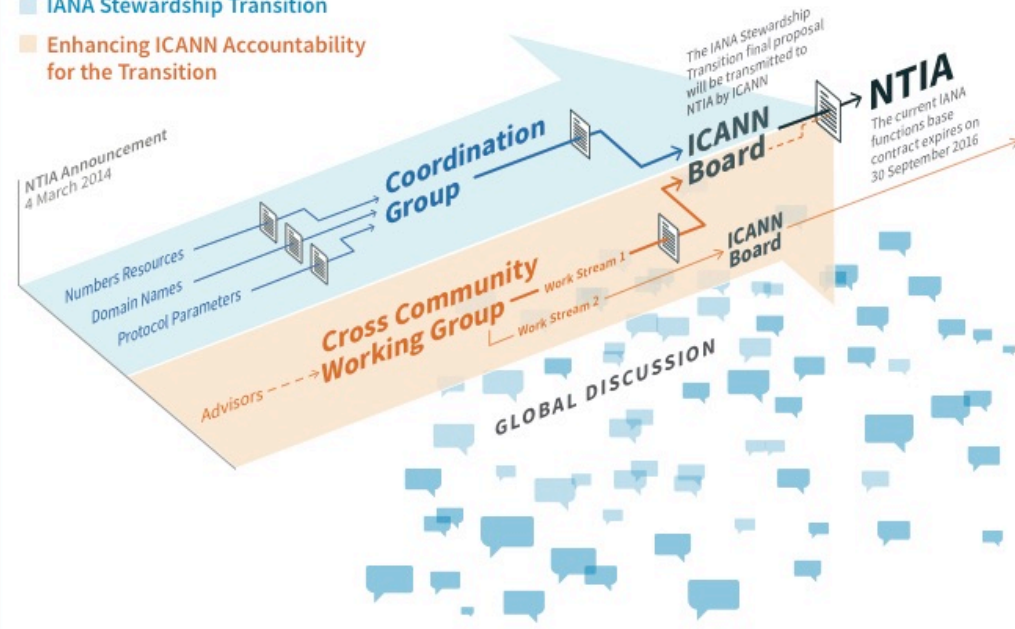

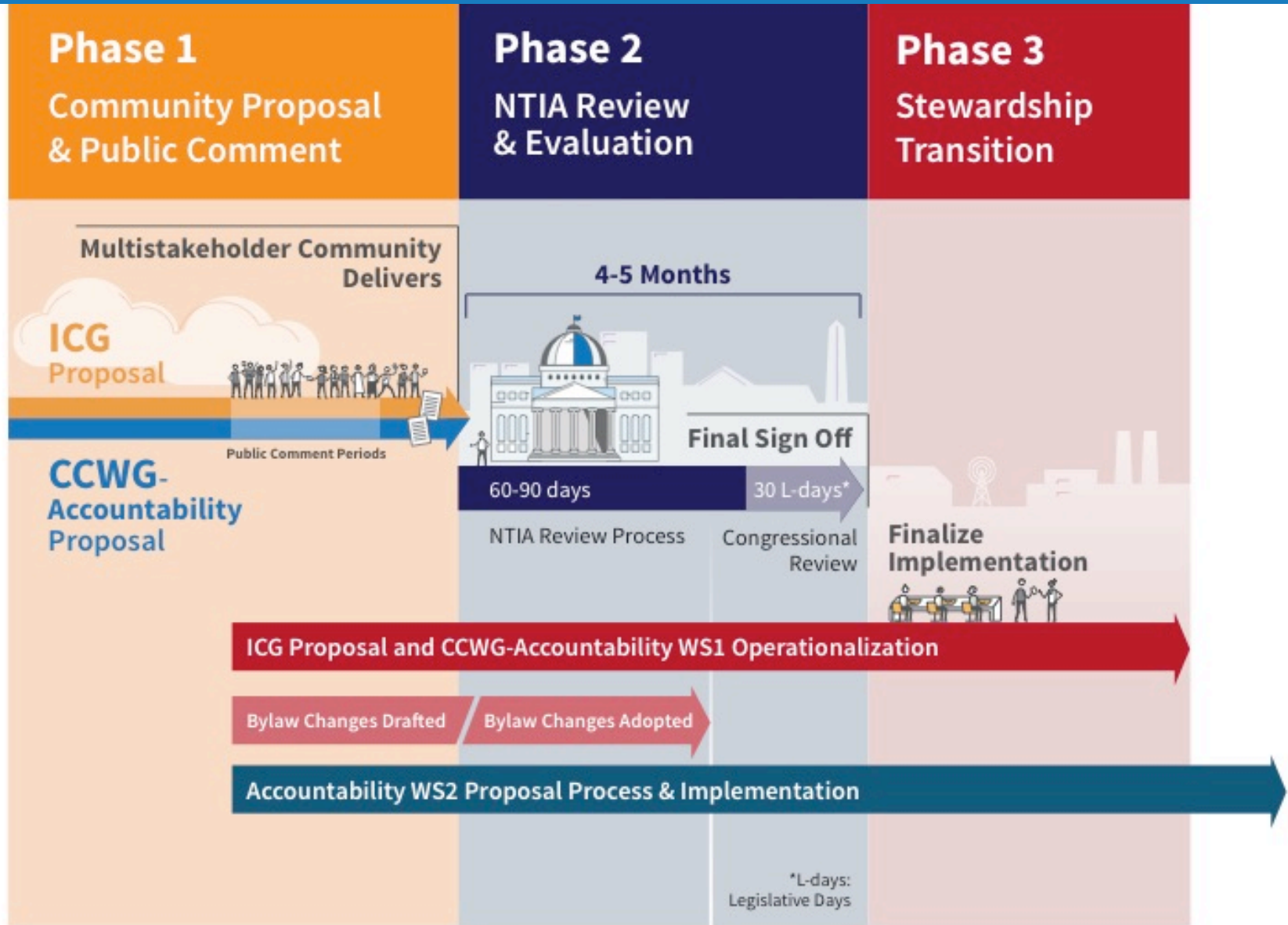

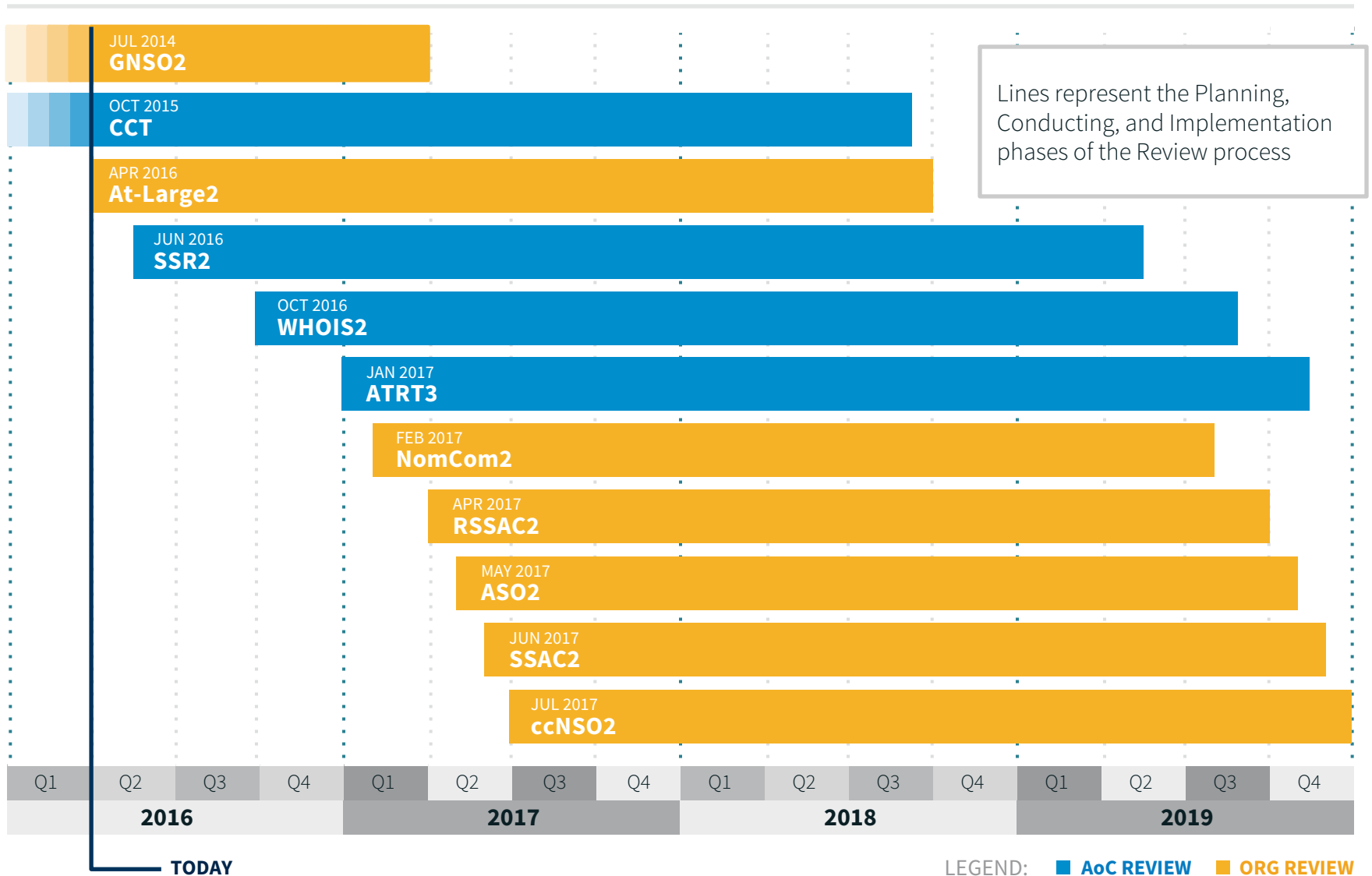

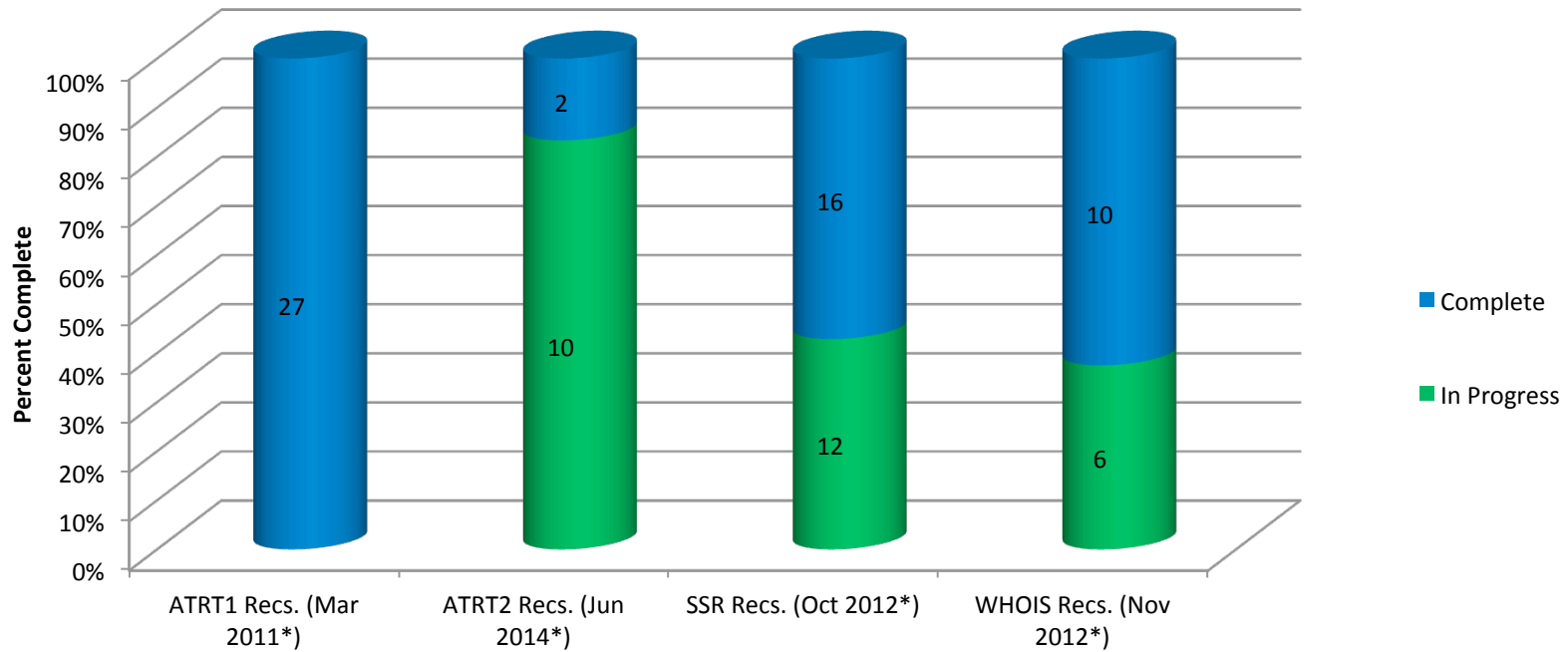
Reviews: what is coming up



Focus on Accountability: AoC Reviews

- **CCWG Proposal moves AoC reviews into Bylaws**
 - Increased scrutiny on community-led reviews
 - ICANN is committed to continued improvements
 - Recent Board Workshop – oversight to ensure delivery of the outstanding commitments
 - Focus on data gathering & implementation reporting
 - Additional Review proposed – IANA Review
- **Next 12 months: 3 new AoC Reviews**
 - Preparations underway to support launch
 - Call for Volunteers: SSR-2 June, WHOIS-2 Oct, ATRT-3 Jan

Competition, Consumer Trust and Consumer Choice (CCT) Review

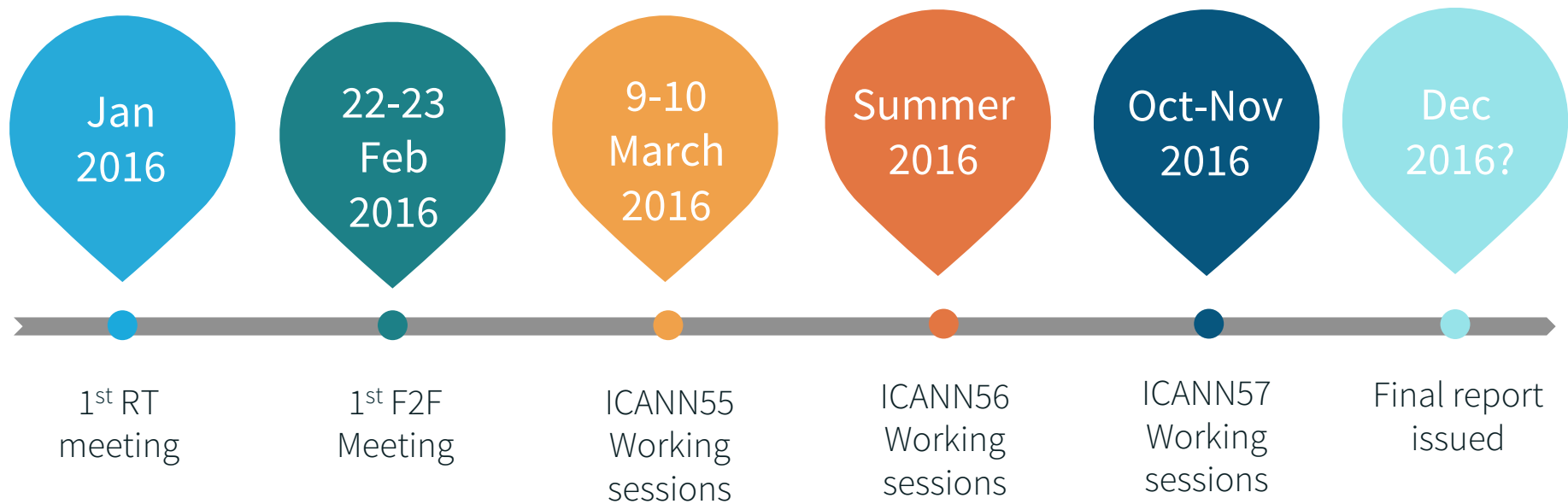
Overview

The CCT Review Team (RT) will evaluate the New gTLD Program for its progress in enhancing competition, consumer trust and consumer choice. Data on a number of community-recommended metrics have been collected and published.

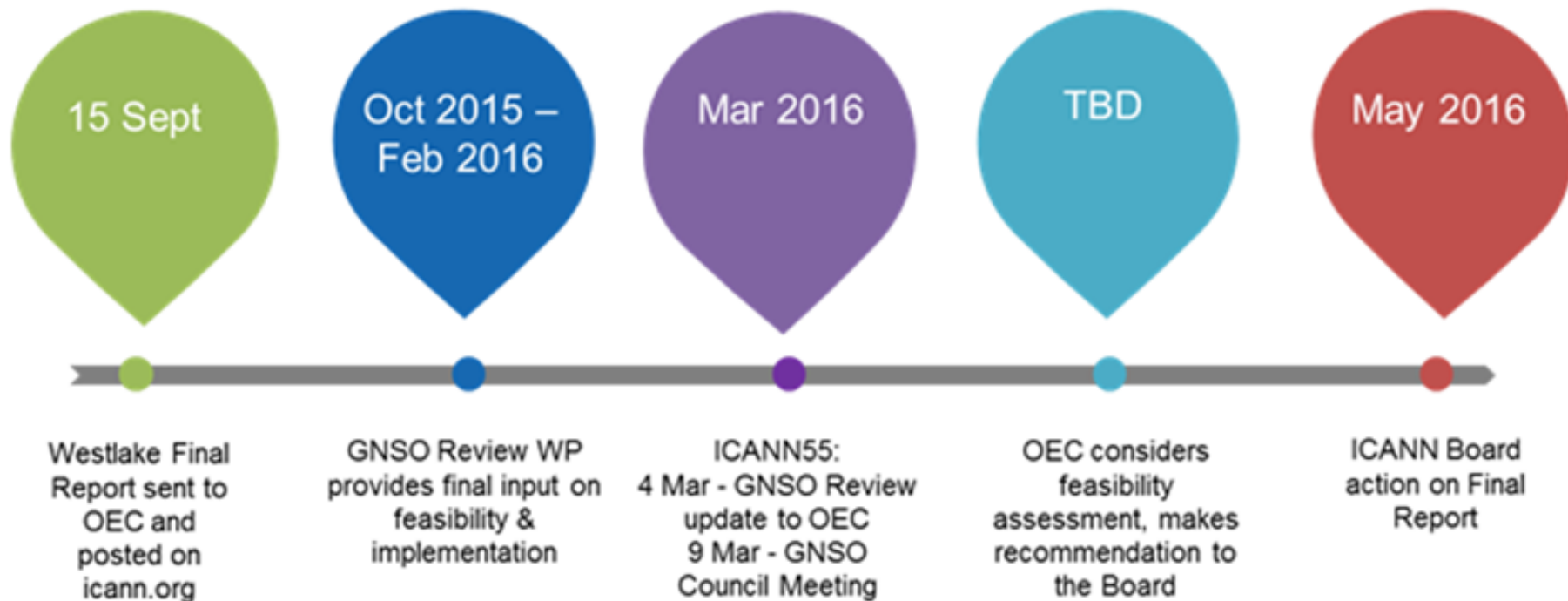
Key Points

- Review team work in progress
- Team understands work affects the next round
- Working to produce Interim Recommendations to identify areas for additional policy work
- May take 18 months to complete
- Evaluating Metrics recommended by the Community

Feasibility Assessment & Prioritization

GNSO Review Working Party evaluated and prioritized 36 recommendations issued by the independent examiner:

- ✓ Ease or difficulty of implementation,
- ✓ Cost of implementation,
- ✓ Alignment with the strategic plan of the GNSO
- ✓ Impact on existing or other work

Highlights from Lessons Learned

1

Community buy-in is essential for successful implementation of improvements

2

Feedback loop & measurable improvements contribute to buy-in

3

Link Review outputs to Strategic Planning and other ICANN processes

4

Reviews of individual organizations should be aligned with ICANN strategic direction and overall structure

5

Plan thoughtfully: apply relevant elements, realistic timelines, clear directions and definitions


6

Implementation plans must contain required elements to be approved by the Board
