ICANN Bylaws

- Approved by ICANN Board on May 27
- Puts into place requirements from transition proposal (ICG) and CCWG-Accountability Work Stream 1
- New roles for ALAC:
 - Empowered Community participation
 - Customer Standing Committee (PTI)
 - Representatives to IANA Functions Review
 - Selection of Review Team Membership
 - Nomination of up to seven members
 - Chair participates in selection



Establishing an Empowered Community

The CCWG-Accountability recommends creating an entity that will act at the direction of the community to exercise and enforce Community Powers called the "Empowered Community."

THE EMPOWERED COMMUNITY:

- Will be given the role of Sole Designator of ICANN's Board
 Directors and will have the ability to enforce directly or indirectly the Community Powers.
- Will act as directed by participating SOs and ACs, which will be referred to as the "Decisional Participants."
- Will have the rules by which it is governed constituted in ICANN's Fundamental Bylaws.



The Empowered Community

- A new legal entity
- The mechanism designed by the CCWG-Accountability for the community to come together and exercise new powers
- It is comprised of the ASO, ALAC, ccNSO, GAC and GNSO (the Decisional Participants)
- New form of checks and balances in the Post-transition environment

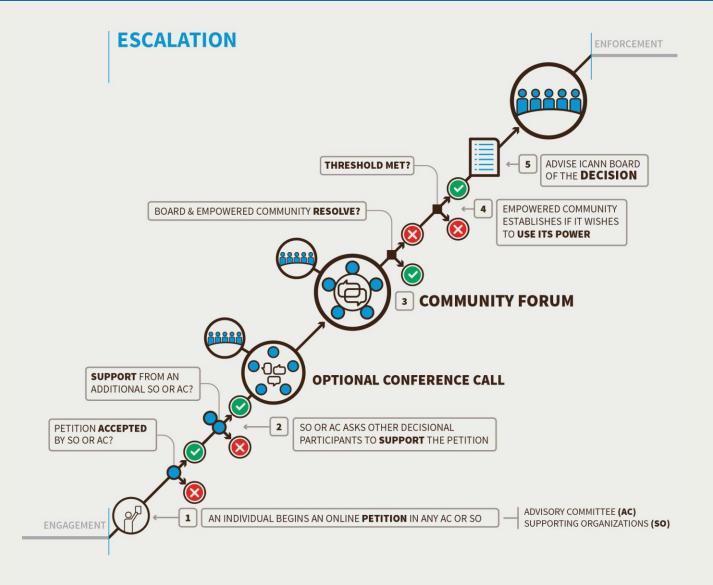

Escalation Path



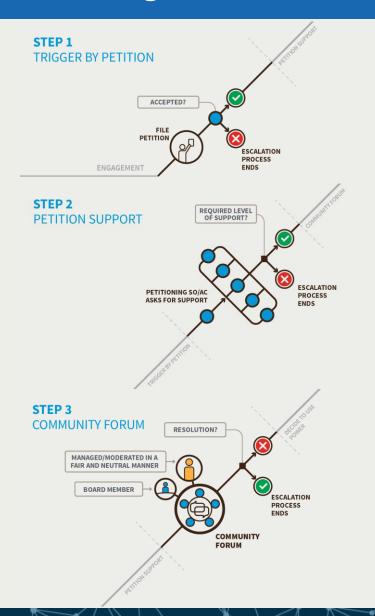


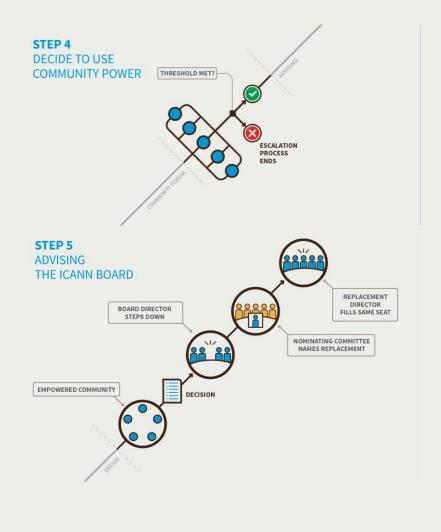
Required Thresholds for Escalation Processes

Required Community Powers	Should a conference call be held?	Should a Community Forum be convened?	Is there consensus support to exercise a Community Power?
Reject a proposed Operating Plan/Strategic Plan/Budget	2 AC/SOs support blocking	3 AC/SOs support blocking	4 support rejection, and no more than 1 objection
Approve changes to Fundamental Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation	2 AC/SOs support approval	3 AC/SOs support approval	4 support approval, and no more than 1 objection
3. Reject changes to regular Bylaws	2 AC/SOs support blocking	2 AC/SOs support blocking	3 support rejection, and no more than 1 objection
4a. Remove an individual Board Director appointed by a Supporting Organization or Advisory Committee	Majority within the appointing AC/SO	Majority within appointing AC/SO	Invite and consider comments from all SO/ACs. 3/4 majority within the appointing AC/SO to remove their director
4b. Remove an individual Board Director appointed by the Nominating Committee	2 AC/SOs support	2 AC/SOs support	3 support, and no more than 1 objection.
5. Recall the entire Board of Directors	2 AC/SOs support	3 AC/SOs support	4 support, and no more than 1 objection
6. Initiate a binding Independent Review Process	2 AC/SOs support	2 AC/SOs support	3 support, and no more than 1 objection. Require mediation before IRP begins
7. Reject ICANN Board decisions relating to reviews of IANA functions, including the triggering of Post-Transition IANA separation	2 AC/SOs support	3 AC/SOs support	4 support, and no more than 1 objection



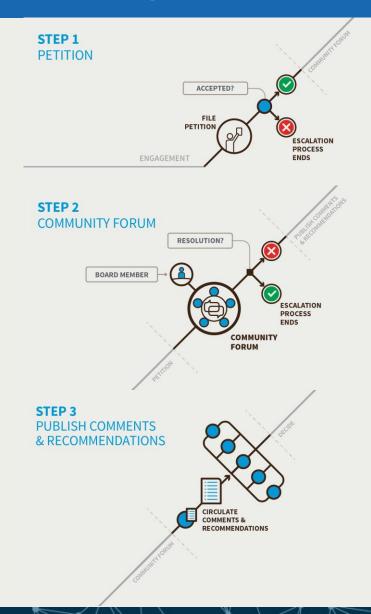
Removing a Board Director (NOMCOM)

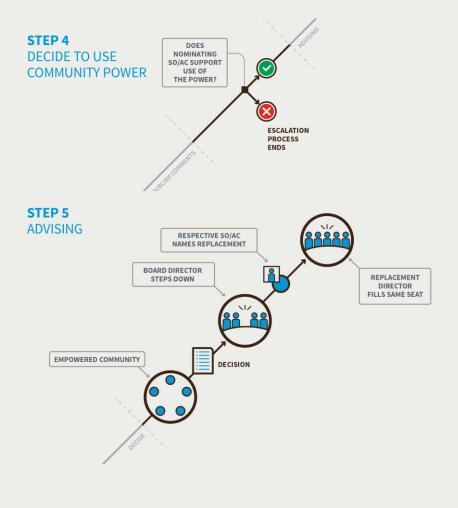






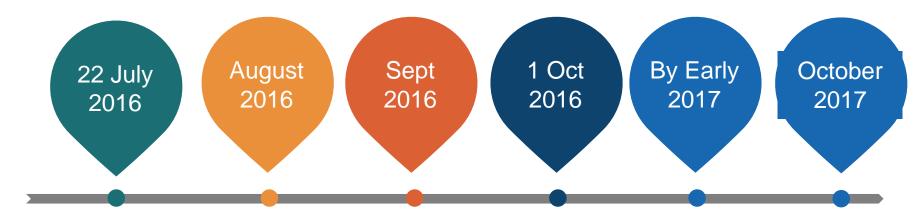
Removing a Board Director (SO/AC)
