- **1.** Internet Society China Satish will share with the ISOC Chapter List, the APRALO LT statement to the ALAC re our recommendation to support ISC membership.
- 2. China visit APRALO LT will establish objectives and responsibilities of the delegation (APRALO LT plus Jia Rong) to China to attend their annual general meeting to talk to relevant At-Large bodies within ISC. LT to provide ISC with costings for airfares, accommodation, expenses for the delegation. Other MOU partners APTLD, APNIC and Dot.ASIA will also be invited to attend.
- **3. Funding of APRALO ALS activities** earlier proposed to the FBSC the Palestine, Bangladesh, India, Global IGF and China applications may be funded by GSE. The APrIGF will also be funded by GSE as Satish and Maureen are already in Jia-Rong's programme
- **4. Funding available for ALSes** for outreach requires clarification so that we can give our ALSes clear guidelines about what FBSC, GSE and CROPP will provide for.
