YESIM NAZLAR: We are already two minutes passing the start time. If it's all fine for you,

I can start with the roll call.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Okay, if the [inaudible] has finished, yes please, let's start the recording

and the roll call.

YESIM NAZLAR: Okay. Thank you very much. So let's please start the call recording.

Good morning, good afternoon, and good evening to everyone.

Welcome to today's AFRALO Marrakech Activities call taking place on

Tuesday, the 16th of February, 2016, at 17:00 UTC.

On the English channel, we have Daniel Nanghaka, Barrack Otieno,

Sarah Kiden, and Olivier Crépin-Leblond.

On the French channel, we have Tijani Ben Jeema, Abdeldjalil Bachar

Bong, and Aziz Hilali.

We don't have any apologies for today's call.

From staff, we have Heidi Ullrich, Gisella Gruber, Melanie Cruz, Luna

Madi, Nancy [inaudible]; and myself, Yeşim Nazlar.

Our French interpreters today are Camila, Florencia, and Claire.

Please do remind me if I forgot to state anyone's name. Oh, I forgot to

mention Ergys Ramaj. Sorry for the pronunciation.

Note: The following is the output resulting from transcribing an audio file into a word/text document. Finally, I'd like to remind everyone to state their names while speaking not only for transcript purposes, but also for interpretation purposes as well. Over to you, Tijani. Thank you very much.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much, Yesim. Good morning, good afternoon, and good evening. This is another call of the organizing committee of the Marrakech events. You have the agenda on the Adobe Connect. Do you agree with it, adopt it? Do we have any additions? I don't see any hands, so I assume the agenda is adopted and we'll go to item #3, which is AFRALO NGO program. Can you upload it please, Yesim?

As I said last time, first of all, we got [inaudible] a small group for the capacity building program for the NGOs. Knowing that, the NGO program is not only capacity building, but it will be capacity building, mentoring, and there will be [inaudible] in the other sessions.

So as for the capacity building, the group contained myself, Heidi, Beran, and I forgot who else was with us. I ask staff or anyone who knows [inaudible], please give me the list so that I will send it to them so that they give their remarks.

So it will be a daily session except for Monday, since Monday is [inaudible] will be the opening ceremony. That will start at 8:30, so we will not have time to make this session. But for the other days, we start by an introduction in general, reintroduce the program and the NGOs will introduce themselves. Then I will try to give them an idea about the beginner guide for ICANN and At-Large. Then we will speak about AFRALO within At-Large, and at the end it will be the guestions and

answers. This is the main part of the sessions. Every day we have a good amount of time for questions and answers.

The second day will be about the ICANN strategies for Africa and for [inaudible], and there will be the two vice presidents [from Africa and from Middle East] who will do that. And then the current chair of ALAC and the two [formal] chairs will give their perspectives regarding ALAC and the [importance] of AFRALO. And at the end, as usual, there will be questions and answers. I have [inaudible], please.

I am asked that we speak about showcase before the others because [inaudible].No problem.

So coming back to this NGO program, on Wednesday it will be about the SOs and ACs and we will invite Rudi, the chair of the NPOC. Rudi asked me personally that he wants to interact with the NGOs. So we will invite him under the request of Heidi to come and to participate in the presentation of SOs and ACs and he will present NPOC. And then questions and answers.

On Thursday, it will be a wrap-up session more or less, so we will get the feedback of the NGO representatives and we will speak about next steps, and at the end we will give them [inaudible].

So this is the Capacity Building Program for the NGOs. I have Heidi's hand up. Heidi, go ahead, please.

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Yes. Thank you, Tijani. Just a couple of points on the logistics. I do see that Nora is confirmed for the Tuesday, but for the other speakers, we

have Pierre and Baher. We have Alan, Olivier, and Cheryl on Sunday. I'm wondering if you might be able to send them an invitation and ask them to present, and if they wish to have a PowerPoint, etc.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Okay. I am ready to do that. Normally, you do that for us, but if you want me to do it, I will do it. No problem.

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Okay, either/or. If you would like us, staff, to do that on your behalf, we're happy to do that as well.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Okay. Thank you very much, Heidi. It would be just the right thing because this is the challenge we are using always for the invitations. There is only one invitation I will send it to Rudi because Rudi asked me personally. I will send him an e-mail and invite him, but you can invite him as well. You can do all the invitations and I will do the invitation [inaudible]. I will [inaudible].

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Okay. I'm just also wondering... I know that NCUC works with academics. I believe that some of the university students will be there during some of the days, so I wonder if it might be useful to invite them as well, just to ensure that everyone feels invited. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Heidi, we get expressed and very clear will from the NPOC to interact with the NGOs. That's why we are inviting them. But if we invite the NCUC, why we don't invite GNSO, ccNSO, and the others, etc.? It will be more or less a problem [inaudible]. Only Rudi because he asked you and asked me personally also. He sent me an e-mail also. So that's why we are trying to... Academics, Heidi, those are not academics. Those are NGOs. The academic session will be for the outreach. It will be in the university here. We are with NGOs.

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Okay, thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you, Heidi. Any other question, any other remark? Otherwise, we will go straight forward to the showcase. Okay. So here we are. As you know, we will have a combined session, a combined event, between our showcase and the farewell of Fadi.

Since it will be like this, there will be a huge number of people – more than perhaps [inaudible]. A big number of people. We will make a combined event between our showcase and the farewell of Fadi.

At the beginning, we thought about making two parts of it – one for the farewell of Fadi and then our showcase – but we realized the head of... Nancy particularly, because she is used to make this kind of event, that it was too long. The [talks] are too long and people will not focus if it is too long like this. So the best is to make it very short. We tried our best

with the help of Heidi, Nancy, Gisella. We tried to make it shorter and reduce the number of speakers and the time of speech.

Now we have a new program and I will let Nancy, if she wants to do so, or Heidi, to present it to you or even Gisella perhaps, because Gisella is doing the final work. She prepared this program. Gisella, if you want, you can present it. Gisella, you are here? Is Gisella here?

GISELLA GRUBER:

Sorry. Tijani, yes. Can you hear me?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

I hear you very well.

GISELLA GRUBER:

Thank you very much, Tijani. So as Tijani said, we prepared this and it is what we are hoping will be the program for Monday evening. As Tijani said, we have had the help of Nancy [Luciano] who is very familiar with these big events. We will have security metal detectors at the event on Monday. So while people are curing up to go through the metal detectors, we will have entertainment, a couple of cameras outside, as well as a local music group and people will then enter the tent and there will be a band playing inside.

The event itself will start at 7:20, and as you can see on the screen – we've put it in synch so you can scroll yourselves down the presentation – we have kept this as brief as possible to be able to keep people's attention for the shortest time possible, because as we all know, if the

speeches are too long people get distracted and it's not very respectful towards the people giving the speeches.

We have the welcome address by Aziz. We then go on to Steve Crocker. We also have two external guests, one of the Minister of Industry and the second one, the General Director of the National Agency for Regulation and Telecommunications —again, two short speeches. We have invited Alan Greenberg and Rinalia to follow on with two short speeches. And then Tijani will do a very brief presentation of the AFRALO ALSes and also introduce the testimonial video for Fadi. And then Fadi will be invited to speak, and we've put seven minutes for him. He may go a little bit over, but I'm sure everyone will listen to him. Then we will have the presentation of a gift. Aziz will present the gift with Tijani, Pierre, [inaudible] and [Rachel] and Baher.

We'll then end the evening with the music and the catering will start when people arrive. There will be drinks and there will be [inaudible]. And from what Nancy and Melanie – well, Nancy said this. Melanie didn't say so, but we'll wait for her confirmation – that the drinks and [inaudible] will go throughout the evening. We'll monitor the [inaudible] because I think they are 11 per person, according to the menu.

The evening is planned to run from 7:20 we'll have finished close to 8:00 once we've given the gift. By 8:30, most of the people will have left, but the venue is available until 9:00 PM for those staying on a little bit later.

I'm not sure if anyone wants to add anything to everything I've said, Nancy, Melanie?

[NANCY]: Melanie might want to make some remarks. That's fine, Gisella. You're

doing really great so far.

GISELLA GRUBER: Thank you, Nancy.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Yes, you did very good. Go ahead, Melanie.

[NANCY]: She's listening. I'm not sure if she's on mute.

GISELLA GRUBER: That's correct. Two hours [inaudible]. Fantastic. Thank you very much,

Melanie, for confirming that. Tijani, Aziz, Heidi, anything to add?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: You did very well. There is nothing to add for the [inaudible]. Thank you

very much, Gisella.

GISELLA GRUBER: Thank you, Tijani. Then Nancy and Melanie will be leaving the call, as we

know they've got other engagements. Thank you very much for taking

the time to join today's call. Thank you. Back to you, Tijani.

[NANCY]: Thank you. Just get in touch with us if you need anything.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Thank you very much, very, very much. That's kind of you. You are very

helpful.

[NANCY]: Thank you, bye-bye.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Bye-bye. So any remark about the program of the showcase and the

tribute of Fadi? Any remark, any question? Yes, Olivier, please?

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: I have a stupid question. It mentions here security metal detectors to go

in. I mean, I thought this was all within the grounds of [inaudible]. I

don't know. This might have been discussed before, but why?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Is it a question or it's only a remark?

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: It's a question. Why? Why security metal detectors?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Okay, this is security. Aziz will answer your question, and then I will go to another question. Aziz?

AZIZ HILALI:

Thank you, Tijani. Just to answer to Olivier, I've already said it at other meetings. As of the Marrakech meeting, not because the meeting is to be held in Marrakech, but ICANN has this idea to add security metal detectors at all ICANN meetings to add security services at the access points of each conference center.

Now, regarding Marrakech, the place where we will be holding our evening for the AFRALO showcase and the [inaudible], it's a very big room that will be inside a tent. And in order to access to that tent, it will take a short walk, a few minutes from the convention center to get there. It was only last week that we defined exactly what it would all look like, and that we added the security detectors. We've been in communication with the higher authorities of the Marrakech region. There is the governor of the region. There's a general [inaudible] for the City of Morocco, the mayor. There's people from the Army and there's the secret service. They [inaudible]. ICANN asked them all to assist them in ensuring the security of the event and there will be controls in every meeting in every room, and every participant accessing these rooms will also be checked.

So as you see, it is very important that we have added metal detectors outside the tent.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Thank you, Aziz. Gisella, is this about the same subject? Because I have

Sarah to take the floor. So if you will give another information about the

same topic, go ahead.

GISELLA GRUBER: No, please do pass it on to Sarah. It's just I missed a bit on the

entertainment, so I'll update after Sarah's question. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Okay, Thank you. So Sarah, you have the floor.

SARAH KIDEN: I wanted to ask what [inaudible] doing [inaudible]? Thanks. [inaudible].

Hello?

YESIM NAZLAR: Tijani, can you hear us?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Yes, go ahead. Sarah, can you please repeat your question?

SARAH KIDEN: I was asking what [inaudible] or has everything been [inaudible]?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: [inaudible].

YESIM NAZLAR: Tijani, sorry for interrupting, but we cannot hear you. Could you please

repeat what you have just said?

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: [inaudible].

YESIM NAZLAR: Tijani, you sound very far away.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: So I will go on the French channel and be interpreted.

YESIM NAZLAR: This time you sound perfect. Yes, it is perfect. Please go ahead.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Okay. Please, Yesim, did you understand the question of Sarah? Sarah,

can you type your question in the chat?

SARAH KIDEN: I was asking if there is anything we are required to do? Is there any

[inaudible] during the showcase?

GISELLA GRUBER:

Tijani, did you hear and understand the question? Sarah was asking whether they were required – whether she, whether they, the group – were required to do anything during the showcase.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Okay. Now I understand your question. Sarah, as you have seen the program, since we have, for the talk, we don't have time for anyone [to talk]. It is really very, very short talks and very compressed, because as Nancy, Heidi, and myself explained, we realized that if it is too long it will not be followed by people. But for the preparation for the work inside the [inaudible], for sure all AFRALO people will work to make this showcase be well done and to make it successful. So we will be all together and we will work all together for everything. We will be there before the showcase to be sure that everything is done in the right way and to try to make the event successful. Right now, we don't have a precise things to do, but when we be closer to the event, we will have more clear idea about the logistics, how it is done, what is needed. Do we need to be there to welcome people or will be a [musical troupe] at the entry to welcome people, etc., [inaudible] clear for us when we are closer to the event and we will do it all together, all the AFRALO people.

Have I answered your question?

SARAH KIDEN:

Yes, Tijani. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much. Okay, I have two hands, Gisella and Heidi. I don't know who is the first, but I will give the floor to Heidi first, if you don't mind.

HEIDI ULLRICH:

I was going to give it to Gisella. She knows much more of what's going on. Gisella, please. I just have a small comment. Gisella?

GISELLA GRUBER:

Yes. Thank you, Tijani. Thank you, Heidi. I know that we were going through the program and we might have addressed the entertainment at another time. But just because we are working on the program, just to give you an idea of the entertainment, when people arrive and are going through the metal detectors, we will have a couple of camels outside. We'll have a photographer. We will also have an acoustic band playing outside, a small group dressed in traditional clothes, that will keep the people happy while they're waiting to go through the metal detector.

As soon as they come into the main tent, if we may call it a tent, there will be a jazz band again, a Moroccan jazz band. Aziz, do correct me if I'm wrong. We will also have a couple of henna ladies who will be offering to do henna on whoever would like, ladies or gentlemen. We will also have a couple of water carries. And as I said, the jazz band will be inside playing as well.

Now, the henna, the water carriers, and the jazz band will be there throughout the event. The jazz band will play until the speeches start, and then again after the presentation of Fadi's present.

The henna ladies and the water carriers will be on the side, and there will no doubt, for the henna ladies, be doing henna during the presentations. It's usually what we do at the bigger events. If there is any kind of entertainment, I'm sure it will help also keep the crowds a little hush.

I don't know if there's any questions for that, but again, we are finalizing the entertainment as it stands now, and if there are any comments, please do make them now. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you, Gisella. Heidi, go ahead.

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Yes, thank you. Just to let everyone know that we are producing new AFRALO trifold brochures as well as business cards. I think that this group could possibly ensure that people are aware of those brochures during the showcase and Fadi tribute, and perhaps just answer any questions about At-Large that people might have as well. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much. Thank you. Any other remarks? Any other questions about the showcase program?

SARAH KIDEN: I have another question.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Go ahead, Sarah.

SARAH KIDEN: Is it [inaudible] too late to send information...

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Hello?

SARAH KIDEN: Yes. I'm asking if it's too late to send information about our ALS

[inaudible] changes.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Yes. This is something that Aziz asked for. Normally, Barrack is in charge

of this. I don't know if Barrack collected the information about the ALSes. If he [inaudible], please send him all the information required to

him so that perhaps we will manage to use this [PIC] with all the

information about all the ALSes.

So Barrack is in charge of it, so send it to Barrack. Gisella?

GISELLA GRUBER: Sorry, my apologies. Old hand.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA: Okay, Sarah, we will go to the—

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Tijani, sorry. One more point. You will see that to be part of introducing the ALSes has been removed from this speaking role and that's because it's really important that we don't have too many speeches. People will get restless. They've been working a very long day, so they really just want to be entertained.

But what I think will be nice is if all of you who were attending this will wear your traditional dress to this event so people would see the various ALSes that we do have in AFRALO. Thank you, Tijani.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you, Heidi. For your information, Sarah and the others, the first program we prepared, in the first program there was a slot for the presentation of the ALSes present in the evening. But unfortunately, we were obliged to remove it because of the time, as was explained now by Heidi and before by [inaudible] others. That's why we will not give the floor to any of the ALSes, or even the NGOs that we invited. So nobody will speak except the officials. Sorry for that. It is because we have this merging with the Fadi [tribute] that makes it longer and that makes it more populated. So we will have a huge number of people. If they are not interested and focused on what is being said, we will have more

noise than any level of speech. That's why it is better not to make it very long.

Heidi, old hand or new hand?

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Yes, sorry. I'll [inaudible] that.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Okay, thank you. Now, we come back to our agenda. So after NGO program, we will go to the outreach activities. As you know, we will have students coming to our meeting, students come from Rabat, about 60 people and they will attend with us two days, Monday and Tuesday. Those students will participate in some activities in the conference center, and then we will go together to a university in Marrakech.

So let's go step-by-step through the program of outreach. So on Sunday, the students will come to Marrakech. If they come before 5:00 PM, they will come to conferencing center and take their badges, take their registration and take their badges. If they come later, it will be closed so they will not be able to make their badges, so they will not be able to enter the conference center. So if they come before and take their badges, they will be transported later to their hotel, which will be outside the conference center.

On Monday morning, they will come. And if they didn't register on Sunday evening, they will register on Monday morning. Then we will go all together to the opening ceremony.

Then during the coffee break, those students will have a meet-and-greet with Fadi Chehadé [inaudible]. And then they will have an interview with the Communication Department to be published on the ICANN newsletter.

Then, on the afternoon, we will break out those people into several small groups and [Aziz] will do that, and we will try to integrate them into the various meetings. This would be done with the help of Aziz because Aziz knows people and he knows how to [break] them. And we will try to integrate them into the various meetings, as I said.

Then we will go to the public forum all together. And then to the AFRALO showcase. This is for Monday.

On Tuesday, they will come to the convention center and participate in the morning session, the morning capacity building session, of the NGOs. So on Tuesday, it will be Development and Public Responsibility Department presentation and they will be there and they will attend this session.

Then we will take the small groups – they were split in small groups, so we'll take the small groups and also we will make them participate in the various meetings in [inaudible].

Then they will come to the joint AFRALO-AfrICANN meeting. I hope that the room will be able to contain all people together, because there are about 60 persons. And if not, we will take only a small part of them and disperse the others to the other meetings.

And then, in the afternoon, we will go to the Marrakech university where we'll meet another group of students from Marrakech [inaudible]. So we have the students from Rabat who will go with us to this Marrakech [inaudible] university. There we will have a session between 2:30 until 5:00. It will be more or less an introduction to ICANN. There will be mostly French speaking people from At-Large who will come to the university to introduce ICANN and At-Large and ALAC and AFRALO, too. There will be Aziz and myself, Olivier and Sebastien speaking French. [inaudible] since he is from the Outreach Subcommittee. Alan Greenberg, but he apologized, so he will not come. And Cheryl Langdon-Orr, she is one of the best mentors in ICANN, so we will try to have her with us. Also, we will have staff from the GSE and our own staff. So it will be a session of introduction, and then we will give them the floor. We want them to ask as many questions as possible and as diverse questions as possible, so we can give them the best information through the answers of those questions.

This is the first experience in doing outreach outside the venue of the meeting. I hope it will be successful, because in the future, in the Meeting B, we will be obliged to do so because we have one full day of outreach.

So this is the end of the outreach program. Do you have questions? Is there any question, any remark? Yes, Heidi, go ahead, please.

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Yes, thank you. Just two points. The first is that to be able to distinguish the University of Rabat students, we will be providing all of these

students with ribbons to attach to their nametag. They will be in blue, which is the color of the University of Rabat. So we will be working with Aziz on that.

The second point is that there is a workspace that lists the materials that these students will be getting on USB drives. I just wanted to alert everyone to that, and I'll put that link in the chat now. I think if we could take a look at those, we have, for example, items like the Beginner's Guide, trifolds, ICANNLearn, a link to that. There are some graphics on the multi-stakeholder model, etc. If we could add those to the USB drives and distribute them to the students on Monday, that would be useful I think. So if everyone could just take a look at these items and add anymore, we will have them added to the USB drives to give to the students. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much, Heidi. Much useful. Very useful. Aziz?

AZIZ HILALI:

Thank you, Tijani. Thank you for the presentation of this agenda. It is the first time that we are having to do this outreach session outside of the venue with the work of the ALAC members. We are all very interested by this outreach session. Until now I have made a call for candidates. I've worked with some students. We have 75 candidates and we know they are young students and I have asked them to meet in a theater to explain them the agenda that we were going to have, asking them to respect the schedules, etc. So I hope everything will be okay.

I know that sometimes young people are not very respectful of schedules, so I hope everything will be okay. They want to arrive at around 3:00, just one hour before closing time of registration. So I'd like to ask Heidi to prepare something because they are going to come by [road]. So if there is a problem, a mechanical problem, if they're late for an hour or something like that, can we organize another desk – registration desk – for them to wait for them if they come late on Sunday?

Second question I wanted to ask, to discuss. For the opening ceremony, can we reserve a place for them so the 60 students can fit together, so if the ICANN chair or if Fadi speaks about them where we see them in the room.

Now about the university. I have been working. I've been there and we have spoken with the president of the university and they are all so very interested by these activities. So we hope that these activities will be repeated in the next ICANN meeting. I'm finished. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much, Aziz. This is very interesting presentation. You asked question to Heidi, so I will give the floor to Heidi so she can answer your questions. Heidi?

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Hi. So just a couple points. I'm working with Tanzanica right now. I hope to be able to get you more information on that before the end of this call.

Regarding the special reservation of seats for the 60 students, I'm not so sure we can do that. The concern is that we don't wish to have... We want to make sure that the NextGen students are recognized, and if they're not having reserved seats, then there's a concern that if we give the students of the University of Rabat reserved seats, there's a difference in equality, shall we say. So we can certainly ask, but I'm not sure that's going to be accepted. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you, Heidi. Aziz is not asking for the best places for them. It might be at the bottom of the room, in the corner, so that they may... When [inaudible] speak about them, they can stand up. For example, I can see them. This is I think the idea. But it is an idea. It can be done, it cannot be done, it's possible. Thank you.

Any other questions, any other remarks, about the outreach program? Seeing no hands, I will continue our agenda and go to item #5, joint AFRALO-AfrICANN meeting.

I am happy to announce that the CCWG has finished its work and they issued their [inaudible] final report. It was reviewed by us, by the members of the CCWG, and today morning we did a teleconference and the staff now will integrate all the remarks that were done during this period. And starting from tomorrow, we will have the last... No, not tomorrow. Starting from 18th of February we will have the last, last text.

So we can start working from now. So the drafting group, we have to start working. We have everything to start [inaudible]. Suen, myself, and the others, we have to start now. So Seun, if you are on the call, please,

you can hold the pen if you want. Otherwise, I will do. But one of us have to do so and we have to propose a draft so that the others will enrich or discuss, etc. This is the issue of AFRALO-AfrICANN meeting. Any question, any remark, about that? Aziz?

AZIZ HILALI:

Thank you very much, Tijani. I just wanted to say that we still have 20 days – only 20 days. We need to have first draft at the end of the week, so we can see if there are some comments. I know Tijnai and Seun are very busy with that and with all the preparation, but as the subject chosen was the ICANN reform, the ICANN changes. So I'm asking the drafting committee, please can you hurry a little bit so we can publish this report for its comment now? Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much, Aziz, for that. We have to start working now and I will try to be in touch with Seun and we organize ourselves so that it will be done perhaps not in this weekend, but in the beginning of the next week. Heidi?

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Yes, thank you. I just heard back from Tanzanica, and Aziz, they will be able to keep the registration booth open a little bit longer on Sunday. What they do ask are two things. The first is if you could please send me the names of all of the students that are coming from the University of Rabat and the other institute there. And also, very importantly, please let us know on Sunday how the students are — the time that they're

expected. Just keep us informed of what their expected arrival time is, so we can let the registration people know. Thank you, Aziz.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much, Heidi. Very useful and very helpful. And thank you, Tanzanica. It's really helpful, because at the beginning they said it will stop at 5:30 sharp, and now they are flexible and I have to thank them very much. Any other question? Aziz, you still have your hand up. Okay.

AZIZ HILALI:

I just wanted to say thank you to Heidi and to the registration desk. There will be some persons [inaudible] the students and they will inform us hour to hour about the time that they will arrive at the venue.

And about the list of the name, I have this list I'm going to send it to the ICANN staff, so the registration person, the registration team, has this list. Thank you. I'm finished.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you, Aziz. Thank you very much. Okay, I see no hands, no questions. I will go to the next point of our agenda, which is... So we spoke about showcase, we spoke about catering, and [inaudible] spoke about it.

The video. I will tell you about the video. As I told you last time, six people accepted to make a 40-second video about Fadi. Those are Mohamed El Bashir, Mercy Moyo, Michel Tchonang, Beran Dondeh,

Tijani Ben Jemaa, and Fatimata Seye Sylla. As you can notice, there is 100% balance – gender balance and language balance. But at the end, Fatimata chose to speak in English, so we have not a balance in terms of language, but it's not a problem. Those were the requirements of the communication people. That's why we tried to make it like this.

Is there any remark, any question about that? I see no hands, so I will go to the next point of our agenda which is any other business. We are very good on time, so is there any other business?

Heidi, I have a point I want to raise now. The guy who get... No. Let's speak about the next meeting. Shall we meet next week? I think so. What do you think? I think that we have to do a call next week at the same time. Yes, Aziz, please, go ahead. [inaudible] is okay.

AZIZ HILALI:

I'd like to organize another meeting next week, only if we have new stuff. If not, we can work by e-mail, sending information to the chair of this group because if not, we are to speak about the same, I think, except something new appears, something very important appears, we can do another conference call. If not, we have so many conference calls. Maybe we can skip this one if there is nothing new. This is my proposal. I'm finished.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you very much, Aziz. Indeed, we will not make a call if there is no new things to say. I think that if there will be a call it will be more dedicated to the drafting team of the AFRALO-AfrICANN meeting of the

statement. I don't think that for the NGO program... Oh, yes. There is a big issue that we skipped and we didn't speak about, which is the mentoring program.

We asked people to be volunteer to be mentors of those five NGOs and I didn't receive any volunteers. So I don't know if we have to perhaps ask people to do so because we need it. Those people have never been in an ICANN meeting and I don't think it will be useful to be like [inaudible] in those big meetings. The best is to have a mentor that they can ask questions and who can advise them about which meeting is best to go to attend, which activity is better than the other, has more priority, etc.

Aziz, you have the floor.

AZIZ HILALI:

Thank you, Tijani. I just wanted to – no, it's a [inaudible]. I'm sorry. Okay.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Okay, thank you. From the group here who are present here, who wants to be mentor? And we need English speakers and French speakers. Nobody wants to volunteer? So I will perhaps ask some people, some persons, to be mentors and see if they accept or refuse. I think it is an important issue, an important thing to do. And if we don't do it, they will miss something, those NGOs.

So I will send by e-mail to some people to ask them to do the mentoring and I hope I will manage to have a group that will help us in this issue.

So, if we have a call next week, I think it will be mainly all the drafting team of this AFRALO-AfrICANN meeting. I hope that we will be able to

prepare something.

Yes, Beran? Do you want to speak, Beran? Beran, please go ahead.

Okay, Beran cannot speak. Understood. No problem.

So we have one mentor already, Beran. Very good. And a speaker. I will

try to find others. Thank you, Beran, for volunteering. That's very kind.

I will send you e-mails during the week about the next teleconference. If

it is the general organizing committee to meet, I will tell you. If not, it

will not be invited. We will invite only the drafting team of the

statement.

Any other business? Do we have any other remark, any other question?

No? So thank you very much and have a good night. I hope it will be a

successful event. I am sure it will be a successful event.

Thank you, bye-bye!

HEIDI ULLRICH:

Bye, everyone. Thank you.

TIJANI BEN JEMAA:

Thank you, Heidi.

YESIM NAZLAR:

Thank you, everyone. The audio will now be disconnected. Thank you
