Cheryl Langdon-Orr (CLO): Or not well known about Avri, we have a lot of hidden gems I fear

Klaus: I can only repeat that this is work to be done by the community with the help of ICANN staff not by the community under ICANN leadership. How often do we need to say that?

Glenn McKnight: We have two approaches to the same problem

Glenn McKnight: It should be a collaboration

Klaus: Indeed!

Heidi Ullrich: Several of the Beginner's Guides have been authored by Operations staff. When they are at the draft stage, the author seeks advice from the community.

Olivier Crepin-Leblond: @Avri: update the existing document, yes. Re-invent the existing documents, no.

Daniel K. Nanghaka: +1 Olivier, but then we staff have to collaborate with the community

Klaus: collaboration of staff and community would be very nice

Olivier Crepin-Leblond: @Aiden: ICANN doesn't use Listservs anymore - it uses Majordomo. : -) But I know what you mean. The problem with pointing to the Majordomo list of lists is that they all contain old defunct lists that are kept there for archival reasons. And the Majordomo management is done by ICANN Core IT staff -- and they have not been diligent in keeping the descriptions up to date, so there is no way to see which list is defunct and apt for archival purposes and which is active. Ultimately the front end of these lists is actually the respective pages of each SO/AC, whether their Web site, or WIKI. In many cases, it is impossible to subscribe directly to a mailing list and you need to ask staff to manually add you.

Klaus: Before we move on we should discuss the relationship between staff and stakeholders again. The rest will then be much easier.
