

GNSO Review - Background

- The Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO) develops and recommends subtantive policies relating to generic top-level domains (gTLDs) to the ICANN Board.
 - E.g., Uniform Dispute Resolution Policy (UDRP)
- GNSO Organizational Review examines the GNSO's organizational effectiveness.
- 1st GNSO Review : 2008 to 2012.
- ⊙ 2nd GNSO Review (current): 2014 to 2017.



GNSO Review Report – Where we are now






APAC Space Comments on GNSO Review draft Report

- APAC Space comments were focused on the 16 recommendations relating to Participation and Representation in GNSO.
- Suggested prioritising 3 key recommendations #32, #35, and #33
- Recommendation 32: That ICANN define "cultural diversity" and that relevant metrics (encompassing geographic, gender, age group and cultural, possibly by using birth language) be monitored and published. – GNSO Review Working Party proposed not to implement as it was too broad.



GNSO Review – Where we are now




Update:

- GNSO Review Working Party completed its assessment and prioritization of 36 Recommendations in Feb 2016 and submitted its report to the GNSO Council
- OEC requested rationale for recommendations where GNSO disagreed with the Independent Examiner

GNSO Review – "Do Not Implement"

The GNSO Review Working Party proposes that Recommendations 21, 23 and 32 not be implemented

Rec	Independent Examiner's Final Recommendation	Comments & Notes from GNSO Review Working Party	Priority
21	That the GNSO Council should regularly undertake or commission analysis of trends in gTLDs in order to forecast likely requirements for policy and to ensure those affected are well-represented in the policy-making process.	This recommendation is not well phrased and does not conform to what is in the Final Report; additionally, the GNSO Review Working Party does not feel that it is appropriate to implement the recommendation at this time and would be difficult to implement. We did not believe it was in scope for the GNSO to collect and analyze trend data and would be more appropriately completed elsewhere within ICANN such as in other Reviews.	N/A - Low
32	That ICANN define "cultural diversity" (possibly by using birth language); and regularly publish this along with geographic, gender and age group metrics, at least for the GNSO Council, SGs, Cs and WGs.	Recommendation language is too broad. The Working Party agrees in principle with the concept of cultural diversity in ICANN, but was concerned about the way this recommendation was made, specifically: • Cultural diversity should be defined for ICANN as a whole, not by GNSO alone • Not clear that it is feasible to reach a consensus on such a definition. May be more feasible to look for practical applications to ensure diversity and that such work may already be underway.	N/A - Low
23	In order to support ICANN's multi- stakeholder model, all Cs should have seats on the GNSO Council, allocated equally (as far as numerically practicable) by their SGs.	Concerns include: 1. Would not work if any SG ever has more than six constituencies. 2. Assumes all constituencies are equal with respect to mission clarity, member engagement and contributions to GNSO work. 3. Could incent groups to form constituencies simply in order to get seats on the Council. 4. Questionable rationale throughout conclusion in Final Report and this addition was made at the very end of the process without input or feedback from the Working Party.	N/A - Low



Suggestions from Dublin

- 1) Travel support for the participants from the underserved regions
- 2) Provide transcript of GNSO meetings (not translation)
- 3) There are many factors related to the concept of "diversity". For example, geographic cultural and gender language diversity. Could we suggest a scorecard that include these factors?



Facilitating APAC participation in GNSO PDP work (1)

Time zone considerations:

- Every Working Group member is now asked to select a preferred time zone for meetings/calls when they sign up
- Doodle scheduling polls are used frequently the most popular time is <u>not</u> always selected as there generally tend to be more participants from the Americas and Europe
- Recent PDP Working Groups have agreed to rotate time zones for calls
- The GNSO Council rotates its monthly calls across 3 time zones

Translation of key documents in accordance with the ICANN Bylaws:

"As appropriate and to the extent provided in the ICANN budget, ICANN shall facilitate the translation of final published documents into various appropriate languages."

- GNSO Operating Procedures encourage translation of all Preliminary Issue Reports (scoping out the topic for a possible PDP) and Executive Summaries of all Working Group Initial Reports and Final Reports into the six official UN languages
- In practice, full text of some Reports are also often translated



Facilitating APAC participation in GNSO PDP work (2)

Facilitating APAC participation in GNSO PDP work (3)

Cross-departmental collaborations to ensure timely communication

Overall enhanced travel and outreach funding opportunities, particularly for developing countries:

- For every ICANN Meeting, all members of the GNSO Council receive travel support (including NomCom appointees - total of 21 Councilors plus the GNSO liaison to the GAC).
- In addition, each GNSO Stakeholder Group and Constituency receives a certain number of travel slots which each allocates according to its own rules.
- This does not include funding that may go to GNSO members outside the Council/GNSO allocations, e.g. as Fellows, or via funds raised within or by their own Stakeholder Group / Constituency.

Snapshot of current GNSO policy development activities

- □ 4 ongoing Policy Development Processes (PDPs) that could result in new consensus policies affecting all gTLDs:
 - ❖ IGO-INGO Access to Curative Rights Mechanisms
 - Next-Generation Registration Directory Service to Replace WHOIS
 - New gTLDs Subsequent Procedures
 - Review of All Rights Protection Mechanisms in All gTLDs
- □ 2 Cross-Community Working Groups (not including IANA Stewardship Transition or ICANN Accountability):
 - Development of a Framework of Uniform Principles for Future CCWGs
 - Use of Country & Territory Names as TLDs
- □ 5 completed PDPs in implementation phase; 2 completed PDPs in Board adoption phase; several Drafting Teams and other projects
 - Most recent: Drafting Team to develop a charter for a Cross Community Working Group concerning the auction proceeds from new gTLDs



Overview of the three most recent GNSO PDPs

- □ Next-Generation Registration Directory Service to Replace WHOIS (initiated Nov 2015)
 - 139 Members, 116 Observers (as of 15 April); first Working Group meeting was on 26 January 2016
- □ New gTLDs Subsequent Procedures (initiated Dec 2015)
 - 110 Members, 56 Observers (as of 15 April); first Working Group meeting was on 22 February 2016
- □ Review of All Rights Protection Mechanisms in All gTLDs (initiated Feb 2016)
 - 128 Members, 52 Observers (as of 15 April); first Working Group meeting to be held on 21 April 2016
