Role Play Topic

A roadmap to **strengthening multi-stakeholder Internet governance** in the region and its impact on **brining the next billion Internet users online**

Objective

- ▶ Convert theory learnt into practice
- ▶ Brainstorm the issue in-hand
- ▶ Discuss in a constructive manner with peers from other stakeholder groups in small sub-groups
- ▶ Debate with the entire class how to reach to “rough consensus”

Format

- ▶ 3 sessions of role play
 - ▶ **Day 1**
 - ▶ **Day 2**
 - ▶ **Day 3**

Day 1

- ▶ Explanation of the topic in-hand and what is required
- ▶ Participants to choose a stakeholder hat different to what they currently wear
- ▶ Each participant to identify one topic that is of relevance to the main topic in hand (e.g. IPv6, IDNs, Local Content... etc.)
- ▶ Break into sub-groups of 5 maximum with each sub-group having members from all 5 stakeholder groups
- ▶ Solicit topics identified by participants and display them to all

Day 2

- ▶ From the pool of topics suggested, each group to choose 5 topics **minimum** and start discussions on how to tackle them within the context of the role-play title. Each topic can be tackled separately. Once conclusion is reached on each topic, it should be documented
- ▶ At the end of the day, participants must share on the mailing list their outcome document

Day 3

- ▶ *Fahd Batayneh* to solicit all documents received into one master document, and the entire group is to discuss each item in that document to reach “rough consensus” on the content and wording
- ▶ The final document is to be uploaded to the working space for public consumption

Notes

- ▶ There is no “right” answer or “wrong” answer. You have to “convince” others of your rational in a constructive and debatable manner
