


# .JP ccTLD Management Governance



### Internet resource management in Japan

	JPRS (private company)	JPNIC (general incorporated association)
ccTLD (.JP)	<ul> <li>• Manages <u>JP domain</u></li> <li><u>names</u></li> <li>• Develops name registration policy and registry systems</li> <li>• Manages registry database</li> <li>• Operates JP Domain Name System</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Oversees management of .JP ccTLD conducted by JPRS (thru consultation with gov.)</li> <li>Finds new registry operator in case redelegation from JPRS is necessary (thru consultation with gov.)</li> <li>Maintains JP-DRP (JP domain name dispute resolution policy)</li> </ul>




# Running .JP for the interest of the community

- "Advisory Committee" on JP domain name service policy
  - members are the representatives form the following 7 sectors
    - JPNIC
    - JP domain name registrars
    - ISPs
    - Private sector (user companies)
    - academic experts
    - individual Internet users (e.g., consumers)
    - Japanese Government (from 2015)
  - JPRS submits a consultation document when it is necessary or Advisory Committee spontaneously finds something necessary to discuss.
  - Advisory Committee discusses about the policy of the JP domain name services from various points of view.
  - Committee meetings and the documents are open to the public.
  - After getting reports from the Advisory Committee, JPRS informs JPNIC of its action as a response to the advisory report. Then, JPNIC reports it further to the Government.
- Check on organizational stability as an registry
  - JPRS reports its financial report to JPNIC at least once a year. And then, JPNIC checks it and reports it further to the Government.

### Why IGCJ?

- Internet Issues are getting more...
  - complicated, globalized, seriously impacting, stakeholders involved, politicized, …
- Low interest/concern about Internet Governance in Japan
  - Less awareness regarding importance of <u>IG</u> discussion
  - There hadn't been any suitable activities in Japan to address this situation (as of 2 years ago)
- IGCJ aims to be a (bottom-up) platform
  - for various stakeholders
  - to discuss various Internet-related issues
  - no decision making mechanism in IGCJ
- IGCJ keeps its activities continuous
  - Physical meetings with remote participation every other months
  - Provide information through Mailing list, facebook page, etc
- IGCJ liaises with other existing/theme-specific activities



### Numbers (as of April. 25)

- Launched on : June 18, 2014 (~2 years old)
- Subscription to Mailing List : 300
- Messages to Mailing List : 239
- Participants in a meeting : 30 60 (staff excluded)
  - Mainly from ISPs but some from biz, gov, academia, and users
- Meetings held : 14 regular and 1 ad hoc


