I am a director of Netistrar, an ICANN Accredited Registrar, and a member of the Registrar Stakeholder Group. The RrSG's Chair, Secretary and representative on GNSO Council (cc'd above) have kindly indicated support for my application.

I am an Associate Fellow at the Royal Institute of International Affairs (Chatham House) and Editor of their Journal of Cyber Policy, published by Routledge, Taylor & Francis http://www.tandfonline.com/toc/RCYB20/current. The Journal covers the full range of issues related to internet technologies including cybersecurity, resilience of critical internet infrastructure, cyberwar, human rights, and internet governance.

For Chatham House, I was a member of the Research Advisory Network for the Global Commission on Internet Governance, for which I contributed two peer reviewed papers: ICANN, Bridging the Trust Gap https://www.ourinternet.org/research/icann-bridging-trust-gap, and The Privatisation of Human

Rights https://www.ourinternet.org/research/privatization-human-rights-illusions-consent-automation-and-neutrality.

Working with EURid, I have developed compact seminars for post graduate students, on Internet law and governance for the College of Europe (Bruges) and the Scuola di Sant' Anna (Pisa). The course includes sessions on cyber-security, and the ICANN environment. I am also a regular lecturer at InterConnect Communications' Master Classes - both on Internet Governance, and Internet of Things.

I have long experience of working within the ICANN environment, both as a volunteer and as a consultant.

Relevant volunteer experience includes:

- Chair of WHOIS Review Team 2010-2012 (an AoC Review), which produced the first set of consensus recommendations on WHOIS in ICANN's history.
- Member of GNSO PDP Working Group on Translation and Transliteration of WHOIS records
