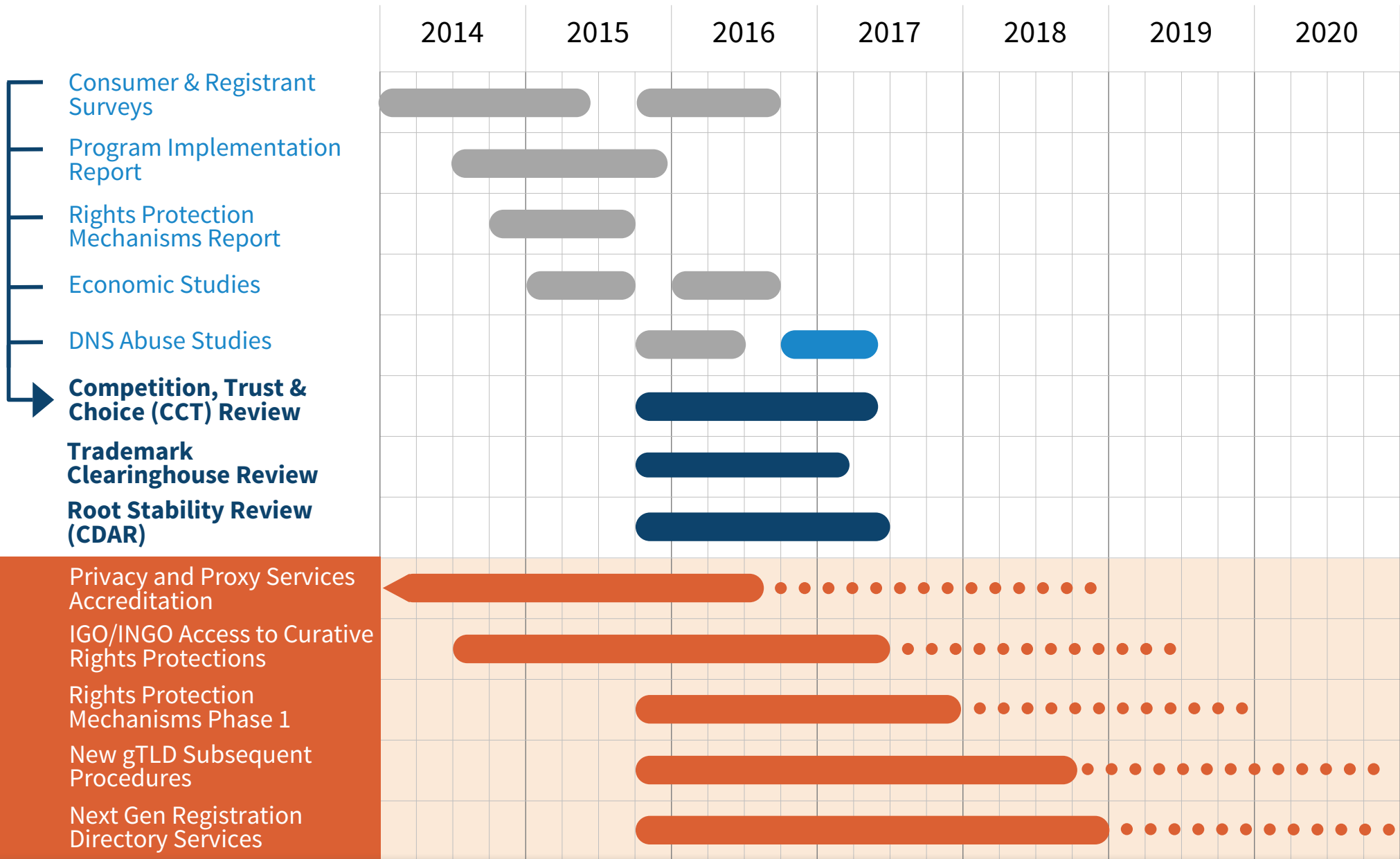

Thick Whois Policy Implementation

Background

- ⦿ Policy Recommendations adopted by the ICANN Board on 7 February 2014
<http://www.icann.org/en/groups/board/documents/resolutions-07feb14-en.htm#2.c>
- ⦿ Two expected outcomes (per policy recommendation #1)
 - Transition from thin to thick WHOIS for .COM, .NET and .JOBS
 - Consistent labeling and display for all gTLDs per Spec 3 RAA 2013

Status of Consistent Labeling & Display for all gTLDs (CL&D)

- ⦿ Consensus Policy initially published for public comment in late 2015, with August 2016 effective date
- ⦿ Due to Request for Reconsideration from RySG, Consensus Policy republished for public comment in October 2016
- ⦿ Target effective date - 1 August 2017

Status of Transition from Thin to Thick for .COM, .NET & .JOBS

- ⦿ Consensus Policy published for public comment in October 2016
- ⦿ Target effective date for new registration – 1 May 2018
- ⦿ Target effective date for existing registration – 1 February 2019

Translation and Transliteration of Contact Information

Policy Recommendations approved by Board in September 2015:

- Registries and registrars may voluntarily translate and/or transliterate registration data
- Policy recommendations provide some requirements for how registries and registrars may translate and transliterate registration data
- Policy recommendations also require working to coordinate implementation with other WHOIS efforts

Current Implementation Status:

- GDD Staff and Implementation Review Team are in early stages of discussing requirements for the scope of the policy implementation project
- GDD Staff and IRT examining early drafts of policy language

IGO/INGO Identifiers Protection Policy Implementation

Background

- ⦿ Recommendations adopted in part by the ICANN Board on 30 April 2014
<https://www.icann.org/resources/board-material/resolutions-2014-04-30-en#2.a>
- ⦿ Current effort focusing on implementation of adopted protections, at the top and 2nd level for:
 - Red Cross Red Crescent Movement (Full Names)
 - IOC Identifiers (Full Names)
 - IGOs Identifiers (Full Names)
 - INGOs Identifiers (ECOSOC General and Consultative Lists)

Current Status

- ⦿ Staff and IRT have been discussing initial draft Consensus Policy Language addressing reservation at top and 2nd level, including exception procedures
- ⦿ Staff and IRT are now focusing on prerequisite to implementation such as the building of authoritative lists of DNS labels, including some challenges arising in the gathering of data required for implementation
- ⦿ Projected Policy Effective date (current assumption): 1 February 2018

Privacy & Proxy Accreditation Implementation Review

- This Implementation Review Team has been convened to assist staff in implementing a new Privacy and Proxy Services Accreditation Program:
 - [Final Recommendations](#) adopted by GNSO Council – January 2016.
 - Approved by ICANN Board - 9 August 2016.
- Thirty-seven (37) community members have volunteered for the IRT, plus two observers.
- Roughly half of IRT members are registrars.
 - Also members from IPC, NCUC, governments.
- First IRT meeting held Oct 18. IRT working meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, 8 November.

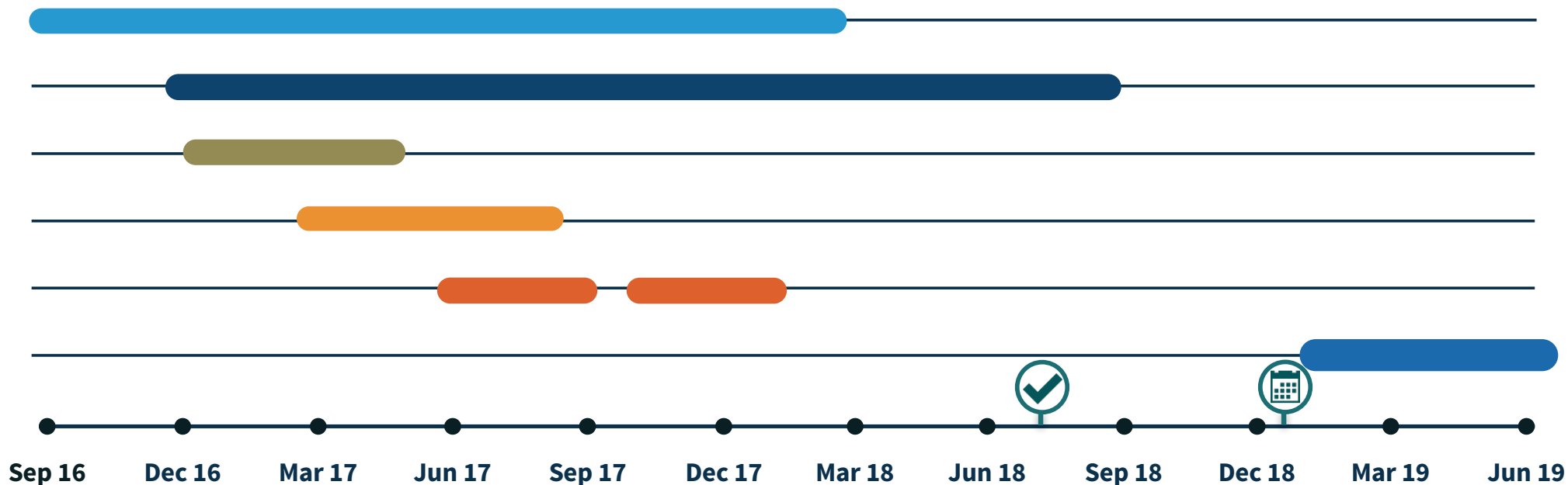
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Proposed Framework

- Draft proposed framework is based on text of Final Recommendations and PDP discussions.
- During PDP, staff proposed three potential models as options for designing this program (registrar, reseller, TPP).
- In light of report's text and PDP discussion, staff proposes registrar model of accreditation as a starting point for designing this program.
- Program is expected to be simplified from the registrar model (likely a shorter application and contract).
- Expect to create: Accreditation Policy, Accreditation Agreement, ICANN infrastructure and processes to manage program.

Proposed Timeline: Program Implementation



- Analyse & Design Work With IRT
- Operational Design, Build; Compliance Preparation
- (Internal) Outlining Draft Policy, Contract; First Policy Draft
- (Internal) Contract Drafting
- Public Comment Periods
- Initial Onboarding (could take up to 12+ months)



Final implementation announced



Proposed effective date—January 2019
(possibly with extended or early onboarding period)

Inter-Registrar Transfer Policy Summary

Inter-Registrar Transfer Policy contained the following key elements in which Registrars will be required to adhere to as of 1 December 2016.

- "Change of Registrant" is now a defined term.
- Secure mechanism to confirm consented to any Change of Registrant
- Notification to prior registrant and new registrant of a Change of Registrant
- Process the Change of Registrant within one (1) day of receiving the confirmation of Change of Registrant
- Sixty (60) Day Transfer Lock shall be imposed following a Change of Registrant but registrars may allow registered name holders to opt out of the lock prior to any Change of Registrant request
- Form of Authorization shall expire under defined circumstances
