ARIN is a nonprofit, member-based organization that supports the operation of the Internet. ARIN's core service is the management and distribution of Internet number resources: Internet Protocol (IP) addresses and Autonomous System Numbers (ASNs). ARIN manages these resources within Canada, the United States, and many Caribbean and North Atlantic islands. ARIN also coordinates policy development by the community and advances the Internet through informational outreach.

Internet Protocol version 6 (IPv6) was developed to be a successor to the now depleted IPv4. ARIN encourages you to deploy IPv6 and connect to the whole Internet, not just the old Internet.

INTERNET NUMBER RESOURCE POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Internet number resource policies are documented community decisions that directly determine the rules by which ARIN manages and administers Internet number resources. Through ARIN's Policy Development Process (PDP), the Internet community develops Internet number resource policies in an open and transparent manner. Any interested party may participate in the PDP with the exception of ARIN Board of Trustees members or staff. **ARIN membership is NOT required to participate.**

If your organization disagrees with any current ARIN policy, you may propose a change directly to the community in the form of a policy proposal. The ARIN Advisory Council shepherds proposals through the PDP and when community consensus is reached, recommends draft policies to the Board of Trustees for adoption and implementation.

ARIN Announce brings you the latest news and announcements on key issues affecting our members and the Internet community.

ARIN Discuss provides a members-only forum for ARIN internal procedure and fee discussions.

The Public Policy Mailing List (PPML) serves as a forum for policy proposals and related ideas and serves as an integral part of the PDP.

ARIN Consult is used to gather comments on any active consultations or suggestions.

ARIN Technical Discussions is used to provide feedback on current ARIN services and features in development (see www.arin.net/resources/services and www.arin.net/features for more information).

ARIN-Issued is a daily report of IPv4, IPv6, and Autonomous System Number (ASN) resources issued directly by ARIN, and resources returned to ARIN's free pool.

ARIN Suggestions is used by ARIN staff to notify the community about new ACSP suggestions and ARIN responses.

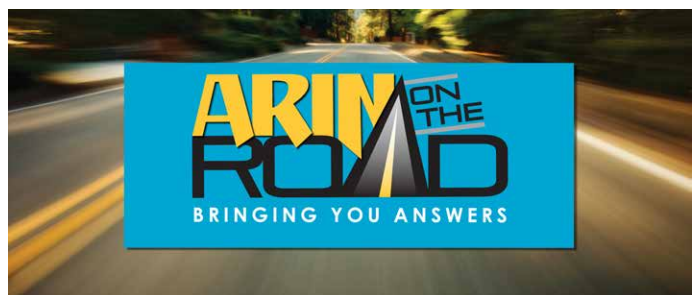
