Candidates are asked to fill in, save and submit their application forms to reviews@icann.org by **2 June 2017, 23:59 UTC**.

The entire contents of this template, as well as any other supporting documents will be published on the [wiki page](#). Accordingly, please be mindful of any personal information submitted, and please inform us if any of this information should be redacted from the public posting.

How to complete your application:

1. This application form is divided in 4 main sections:
 - Applicant Information
 - Expertise
 - Skills
 - Motivation for serving on the Review Team
2. All sections of each form need to be filled in by the applicant. If given criteria (e.g. expertise) does not apply to the applicant, (s)he will leave the box empty.
3. Once the applicant has completed the form, (s)he will save it on his or her computer/tablet/smartphone.
4. The applicant will create a new email message addressed to reviews@icann.org, attach the form which (s)he previously saved and submit their application for consideration.
5. The applicant shall submit his or her application before **2 June 2017, 23:59 UTC**.

I have always been interested in fair, ethical and equitable public policy, foreign, domestic and international. Many of my career achievements have at least partially satisfied that interest. After a long and interesting IT intensive career, I felt compelled to write a book about the Internet not fully realizing the formidable task I was undertaking. Ten years, many thousands of hours, hundreds of drafts, 950 pages and literally hundreds of splendid corrections, contributions and ideas from the top Internet pioneers later, I feel that I'm beginning to acquire a good knowledge of the Internet and just as importantly, the constellation of collateral disciplines and concerns it encompasses.

Through work on the book, through many interviews, ISOC meetings, SIG meetings and ongoing reading, studying and research, I strive to maintain a good level of working knowledge of the Internet and all it impacts. I'm a member of the Colorado ISOC Chapter and I'm an invited member of IPNSIG (the InterPlanetary Networking Special Interest Group). For decades I've been interested in terrestrial and space-based DTN (delay and disruption tolerant networking) and in related asynchronous, fault and interruption tolerant, latency-resistant and highly secure distributed systems.

I bring to the table a very broad spectrum of knowledge, experience and competency regarding policy, regulation, implementation and innovation in networking, nearly all of that performed in real world business or research intensive environments where stuff has to actually work. Given the enormous potential of the Internet to affect the transmission of selected information and the positive and negative propaganda potential inherent to that, I feel that providing high integrity public policy guidance to those who control Internet policy to be an essential service in the 21st century.
