Executive Summary

This report to the chartering organizations of the Cross Community Working Group on Internet Governance (CCWG-IG) covers a number of issues including participation in events and contributions made to on-going Internet governance activities.

Discussion on the establishment of the CCWG-IG began in December 2013, well before the ICANN Community had developed <u>A Uniform Framework of Principles and</u> <u>Recommendations for Cross Community Working Groups (CCWG)</u>. As a result, the original charter of the CCWG-IG did not include regular reporting from the CCWG-IG back to the chartering organizations.

In an effort to update the CCWG-IG's working methods to better align with the new framework, the CCWG-IG has decided to report to its chartering organizations on its 2016 activities, and include a brief summary of its earlier activities, 2014-2015.

- A workshop at the <u>World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) Forum 2016</u>, Geneva
- A workshop at the Internet Governance Forum (IGF) 2016, Jalisco

In addition, the CCWG-IG monitored the discussion of a proposal regarding ccTLDs at the International Telecommunication Union's (<u>ITU</u>) World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly (<u>WTSA-16</u>).

To organize these events, as well as discuss other Internet governance related activities of relevance during 2016, the CCWG-IG:

- Held three face-to-face meetings during ICANN meetings
- Conducted 15 teleconferences
- Exchanged 767 emails on the CCWG-IG mailing list

In addition, there was regular dialogue between the ICANN Government Engagement (GE) team and the CCWG-IG (or subsets of its members) on a range of Internet governance issues, including information on meetings held by ICANN and discussions at various UN or International Governmental Organizations (IGOs)

1. Introduction

This report to the chartering organizations of the Cross Community Working Group on Internet Governance (CCWG-IG) covers a number of issues including participation in events and contributions made to on-going Internet governance activities.

In an effort to update the CCWG-IG's working methods to better align with the new framework, the CCWG-IG has decided to report to its chartering organizations on its 2016 activities, and include a brief summary of its earlier activities, 2014-2015.

1.1 Establishment of the CCWG-IG

The CCWG-IG list was <u>created</u> in December 2013, with an initial intent to coordinate ICANN community input into the <u>NETmundial 2014</u> meeting in Sao Paulo. The <u>final draft charter</u> for the CCWG-IG was provisionally approved by CCWG-IG members on a <u>teleconference on 16 May 2014</u>, with a <u>last call on the mailing list</u> open until 22 May 2014. The final draft was submitted to the chartering organizations on <u>17 June 2014</u> for their consideration.

Highlights of the CCWG-IG Charter

Objective

The Internet Governance CWG has been established by the participating SOs and ACs to coordinate, facilitate, and increase the participation of the ICANN community in discussions and processes pertaining to Internet Governance.

All issues, processes and discussions regarding the Transition of NTIA's Stewardship of the IANA Functions, and/or current and future accountability and accountability mechanisms related to the aforementioned Transition, are deemed to be out of scope of the objective of the WG.

For avoidance of doubt: The WG shall not act as a representative of the participating SOs and ACs collectively or individually, nor others, unless they have been explicitly asked to do so by all the participating SOs and ACs collectively or individually.

Scope of Activities

The scope of activities of the WG is to do whatever it deems relevant and necessary to facilitate and ensure engagement and participation of the ICANN community in the global Internet governance scene and multi-stakeholder decision-making processes.

The WG will take a proactive role in seeking and fostering participation and input into the processes and provide regular feedback to the SOs and ACs.

In achieving its objective the WG will undertake, but is not limited to, the following activities:

- Provide input to ICANN staff, SOs and/or ACs on issues pertaining to Internet Governance discussions and processes.
- Provide input to the participating SOs and/or ACs to ensure such input as mentioned under a. above is reflected in ICANN's activities in discussions and processes pertaining to Internet Governance.
- Convey to the ICANN community discussions about ICANN or ICANN matters that arise in other Internet Governance discussions and processes.
- Organize SO and AC focused sessions
- Disseminate and summarize information relevant and related to the Internet
- Governance events and processes described above.
- Draft Position Papers and Statements as deemed appropriate, in accordance with the rules of this Charter.

Report on Progress

The Co-Chairs of the WG shall update the participating SO's and AC's at least monthly on the activities of the WG.

Position Papers and Statements

At appropriate times, as identified in the work plan, the WG shall produce a Progress paper to inform the broader community of its activities and progress made.

As part of its activities, the WG may prepare and propose a Position Paper or Statement. In order to inform the participating SO's and AC's collectively and individually, and others, in a timely manner that their endorsement or support for a Position Paper or Statement will be sought, the schedule for drafting and decision- making relating to a Position Paper or Statement should be included in the work plan.


