


important part of the process to make sure that there's broad input and participation in proposals that are being put forward and before those are finalized. We have a number of stakeholder review collaborations, such as with Google Docs, updates, reports, and seminars to inform the ICANN community members and those outside of ICANN, and of course, Adobe Connect, and you are seeing, now, is as well an important aspect in moving forward the work that is undertaken.

Now we go to some concrete examples, and I think some of these may already be familiar to you. First, actually looking at the AGO. As I noted before, from an AGO perspective, policy only makes a head of a great policy when the same - exact same policy has been adopted by all the RGLs. So the policy discussions that occur at the Regional Internet Registry level, and only when they're all adopted the identical policy will it bubble up to the ICANN level. There are actually currently no global policies on the discussion in the AGO, but of course, that doesn't mean that there are not other policy discussions ongoing that focus more on regional issues that


