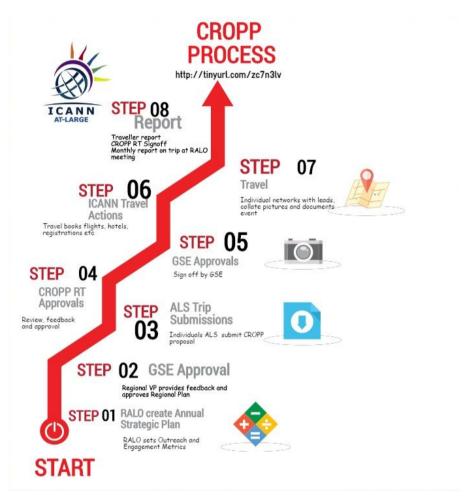

4 In-reach/Outreach and Engagement

In 2016 we had on average 15 attendees per NARALO Monthly call and so far in 2017 we have had 13 attendees. We had also seen consistent participation with our members in many of the active Working Groups last year and this year. In addition we saw a healthy number of financial proposals to the ICANN FBSC which were well received and beneficial to the community as a whole

Special Outreach efforts leading up to ICANN 61 in Puerto Rico

ALs: ISOC Puerto Rico and HETS

- Monthly Roundtable Informal Gatherings: starting in May 2017 Ongoing
 - Strategy: Capacity building on Internet Ecosystem organizations focusing mostly in ICANN multi-stakeholder framework, its policy work, how to get involved and the intrinsic work relations between the SOs/ACs
 - Target: General population with emphasis in University students, Computer/Electrical/Information Systems Engineers, IT oriented organizations, Academics, Government Officials
- ARIN on the Road: Week of 28 August 2017
 - Strategy: Get face time with ARIN to learn who they are, what they do and get questions answered. It will provide the latest from ARIN on everything; from technical services and tools, to current ARIN policy developments and the status of IPv6 adoption.
 - Target: General population with emphasis in ISP operators, University students, Computer/Electrical/Information Systems Engineers, IT oriented organizations, Academics and Government Officials
- 2017 Internet Day Celebration: 27 October 2017 (organizations are encouraged to run week long celebration)
 - Strategy: Celebrate the Internet by focusing in one or two themes and develop activities around them. The theme for this year will be

- developed around Cyberbullying in the younger (-18) and older population (60+). Internet Ecosystem organizations will be introduced as part of the activity with a major focus on ICANN.
- Target: General population with emphasis in mid/high school students and organizations that serves the 60+ sector
- Let's Fall in Love with Internet: 14 February 2018
 - Strategy: Increase awareness of the impact of engaging in issues related to Internet policies, governing bodies in managing local, regional procedures. A kick-off event to highlight what will happen during NASIG2018 & ICANN61.
 - Target: General public with emphasis in university students, government agencies, academics and professional in related Internet services.
- North American School of Internet Governance (NASIG2018): 7,8 & 9 March
 2018
 - Strategy: A three-day capacity building event to provide in-depth knowledge of Internet Governance (IG) issues to approximately 40 individuals from different sectors in the North America At-Large Region.
 - Target: 40 selected participants: 50% from Puerto Rico and 50% from all 50 US states, US territories and Canada

Other:

- Contact the Academic Sector:
 - **Strategy**: Provide material to key University Professors to help in spreading the word and encouraging their students to attend the roundtable gatherings and motivate the professors and their students to participate in ICANN 61. Use of social media (Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and other regional websites), ICANN resources (online resources), and DiploFoundation resources to engage target audience.
 - Target: University students and Academics in general
- Contact Professional/Gubernamental Organizations:
 - **Strategy**: Provide material to key professional/gubernamental organizations such as the IT Cluster, CIO Office, etc. to help in spreading the word and encouraging their constituencies to attend the roundtable gatherings and motivate their membership to participate in ICANN 61.
 - **Target**: Government officials and membership from target organizations

NARALO's General Assembly primary goal is to generate enhanced greater ALS participation with more active policy development and working group participation, Our aim is to encourage community feedback on creating a proactive strategic plan for the region and make NARALO a revelant and vibrant voice in the ICANN ecoystem.

Speech to the Delegates- (10 minutes)

Greetings to all and it's been a long time since we have been together as a group since the ATLAS 2 in the spring of 2014 in London The ATLAS 2 event saw the entire ATLARGE community converge together to discuss many of the shared concerns and issues facing ICANN and specifically our community and today's event will do the same.

Before we proceed let's first acknowledge our sponsors of the event. ICANN for providing their moral and financial support for the event, for ARIN who have provided a great event to colocate and take our MOU to the next level of cooperation and enhanced greater understanding, and lastly and not least to all of the ALS delegates who spared their valuable time to come together and provide advice to ICANN in general and specifically to NARALO.

We need to first ask ourselves why are we having a General Assembly in the first place. What are our expectations and what are the expected outcomes.

NARALO's history of General Assemblies includes participation in the ATLAS One in Mexico in 2009, a general assembly in Toronto in 2012, and the Atlas 2 in London in 2014.

In each of these events we saw NARALO membership gain a greater understanding of ICANN's mission, policies and ATLARGE's roles and responsibilities. In the case of ATLAS one and two we participated with other Regional At Large Organizations in various policy tracks and working groups to generate a set of recommendations which was delivered to the ICANN board. In our current general assembly, though modest in comparison to these events, we are looking inward at the needs and wants of our multistakeholder group. We need to set our goals and aspirations within the remit of our signed MOU with ICANN and our existing Rules of Procedure and work towards making NARALO a successful organization within the the ICANN ecosystem.
