Maxim Alzoba (FAITID ):instead of footnotes

Kathy:It's a little confusing which column is which.

Maxim Alzoba (FAITID ):we need the text in the end about meaning of colours and numbers in each

Mary Wong:Specific registry Sunrise Dispute Resolution Policies may also have additional provisions about this.

Mary Wong:OK - both TMCH dispute resolution policy and each registry-specific policy.

Lori Schulman:So we should ask whether policies currently have language about access to proof of use documents

Maxim Alzoba (FAITID ):it does not work when TM lost after the end of a particular sunrise

Lori Schulman:Suggestion: sampling of policies from individual registries

Maxim Alzoba (FAITID ):excuse me. need to drop the call. my train

Lori Schulman:thank for your contributions Maxim

Kathy:Should we link #16 and SDRP questions below?

Kathy:will review...

Mary Wong:@Lori, I believe the TMCH was supposed to be set up to accept different languages and scripts

Kathy:perfect!
