Manal Ismail:@Marc are we listing theoretical options or is there a specific advantage for using multiple entities (and how to ensure consistency across?)

Kavouss Arasteh:What is the difference between existing entities and Internal in ICANN?

Kavouss Arasteh:WHY MULTIPLE ENTITIES?

Kavouss Arasteh:Inside our outside ICANN

Marc Gauw:@Manual: since the value of the funds is huge, and since there are many foundations in the world that may help, it may make sense to use 'more' existing entities

Manal Ismail:@Sylvia I see so multiple entities are meant to handle different themes of fields, right?

Nadira AL-Araj:Regarding the external organization(s). Is there a limitation on the geographical origin of these organization(s)

Kavouss Arasteh:sylvia, you said one single place? Are we talking in terms of Place or in terms of entities

Wale Bakare:I think, there is need to fletch out the advantages and disadvantages of both internal and external

Kavouss Arasteh:Wale do you mean to have a list of Advantages and Disadvantageous?

Manal Ismail:@Marc thanks for the clarifictaion .. perhaps dividing them by theme/objective/topic may make sense in that context ..

Wale Bakare:How do we define the mechanism for evaluation of proposal and what if the selected entity scope of work goes beyond the mechanism put in place, as its is highly likely should more applications are received more than expected?

Wale Bakare:<<Wale do you mean to have a list of Advantages and Disadvantageous?>> Yes, @ Kavouss

Wale Bakare:Yes

Wale Bakare:I agree

Marc Gauw:@kavous: why are many entities more costly ?

Nadira AL-Araj:I support the move of having a proposed model in how another multi-national organization handling similar situation and then let CCWG members provide thier comments.

Marc Gauw:Not if 'many entities' are existing entities that can right-away help out...

Wale Bakare:Yes, we can hear you Evan

Marc Gauw:@Evan: exactly! And the good news is that there are a number of these kind of entities

Sylvia Cadena:agree.

judith hellerstein:+1 Evan I agree. We should not reinvent the wheel

Wale Bakare:This is the reason why we should identify advantages and disadvantages of having either internal or external entity. I think, Evan has captured few of those.

judith hellerstein:Does anyone know what the US state department does for the grants its gives out for non-profits

Sylvia Cadena:agree.

Wale Bakare:USAID does it well, i think

Sylvia Cadena:that is why the evaluation of proposals and the due diligence is so important. so that we can build on trust. great point Sebastian

Julie Bisland:please note: Samantha Eisner has joined audio only

Sylvia Cadena:control

Joke Braeken:thank you Julie

Sylvia Cadena:agree with Sebastian, there are parallels we can use to keep the spirit of what ICANN does, where there are issues that are different for every region, constituency, issues addressed, etc

Evan Leibovitch:The issue is not necessarily where the evaluation entity is located but where its own subject focus lies. There are some that specialize or have special competence in ICT4D projects, some in infrastructure, some in education etc.

Erika Mann:Xavier can you hear us?

Sylvia Cadena:yes, please do

Sylvia Cadena:I don't agree. that is very premature, not knowing the objectives

Marc Gauw:Note that you can apply the 5-10 % rule on funding costs

Sylvia Cadena:yes

Nadira AL-Araj:Please can you send these questions to me to ask someone who work at DAI

Nadira AL-Araj:yes, I agree with Evan, creating in house organization, it is very costly and I did some reserach on this issue. It was a consensus that dealing with external established entities are much more cost effective.

judith hellerstein:I agree with Evan, we need to make a decision now.

Kavouss Arasteh:The speaker talked about the costs of internal entity but external could have more costs than internal .Moreover, are are compromising between the quality and successfulness or just we are worried about the cost. It should be tradeoff between the two

Marc Gauw:A bit more clarification on the '5 - 10 %' : many external foundation work with donations on a 'tax-exempt' status. However you only get/keep your 'tax-exempt' status provided you donate at least 90-95 % of your incoming funds

matthew shears:I would have thought that the structure chosen should largely be determined by the purposes to which the funds are being put

Sylvia Cadena:agree, but are we using the survey responses to

Evan Leibovitch:Kavouss, an external entity would have a fixed (and known) overhead for its operations. External would NEVER have more costs than doing this internally

Kavouss Arasteh:Marika, pls note that there is third option and that is a hybrid

Sylvia Cadena:agree with Evan

Sylvia Cadena:fine with me, thanks

Wale Bakare:How are we so sure about the external vs. internal cost implication? Let us get this clearly

matthew shears:+ 1 Wale

Sylvia Cadena:please focus on the outline of question 7. is about solicitation and assessment of proposals. not evaluation of outcomes for proposals funded. Call again the group to focus on the scope of the question so that we can move forward. the evaluation part is on another question.

Julie Bisland:Xavier's line has dropped again.

Wale Bakare:I agree with Sylvia, let us focus on the charter question 7. The page 5 of the Q7 states this clearly as guide for this discussion

Evan Leibovitch:EVERY solution is a hybrid, as of course ICANN has its own obligations so not ALL can be done outside. Even the "external" option assumes ICANN will need some controls,

Erika Mann:Indeed Evan

Evan Leibovitch:So I still am unclear of its consideration as a discrete option

Sylvia Cadena:great list of ideas there. it is wonderful to see!

Marc Gauw:@Marika: Your presentation above looks to have less feedback than the link with the SurveyMonkey feedbacks. Could that be correct ?

Sylvia Cadena:The mind map is a distilled version of the survey

Sylvia Cadena:right, Marika?

Marc Gauw:Distilled from my feedback :-)

judith hellerstein:I understand it to be open standards

Wale Bakare:The list of ideas are overlapped

Kavouss Arasteh:There are considerable materials on open internet

judith hellerstein:Also make sure that we meet the WC3 standards
judith hellerstein:regarding accessibility
Marc Gauw:Aha... thanks
judith hellerstein:open internet can also be one where there are no internet shut downs
Ching Chiao:yes Marika I'll send notes shortly
Wale Bakare:Even, Fake News issue may be grouped as part of open internet
judith hellerstein:OK I can send you my points via email. Who should I send it to

Sylvia Cadena:that is also a way to encourage members and participants to really participate through the surveys and for the group to use them to move forward on the discussion
