Daniel Dardailler:I'm not clear if what I've done on the examples is right, that is, comment in the columns B C D using my initials e.g. DD:

Erika Mann:Xavier - I see you joined the call. We understood that you couldn't be with us today, we therefore moved point 3) to our next call.

Xavier Calvez: Erika, thank you. I can only listen and will not be able to stay until the end of the call.

enoss: this is the most important part of the early work and really requires a couple of hours of time to sit down and deal with. MORE TIME PLEASE! :-)

MarilynCade:Provide both.

enoss:google docs are much better, particularly for a shared
exercise like this

MarilynCade: In the BC, we always provide both, at the same time.

enoss:anyone can go into the google doc and export a word version

Kavouss Arasteh: I wish to have wrord doc. as I have difficulties to download Google doc.

Kavouss Arasteh: Sorry word

Daniel Dardailler:One reason for not getting more reactions on the examples is that the editing process is not clear

Daniel Dardailler:people may be afraid of messing up something, etc

Daniel Dardailler:I think we need a clear guidane at the top on how to add comments, suggestions, etc

MarilynCade: Ask for full names, plese, not initials, and no anonymous comments, right?

Hadia Elminiawi:I think word or google doc is better than a survey

Wale Bakare: Hi all, apologies for joining late

Daniel Dardailler:Marylin: agreed, initials are not very helpful, I've just done that in the interest of space in the page, but if lots of folks are going to insert data, space is not a real issue to fight for

Marika Konings: There is a notes/comments column that would allow for that?

enoss:@marika I was thinking of something more explicit. I thought of that, but that column I saw as being used for

identifying questions or nuance

Marika Konings:I think people can use it for anything they want :-)

Daniel Dardailler:(I changed my DD: into real name)

enoss: the things I am looking to unearth with this is to see places where conformance with mission is not crystal clear, but desirability is high. these are the places to naturally push further on

Daniel Dardailler:I withdraw my request for more guidance, I hadn't seen the mention right before the table

Daniel Dardailler:maybe the table should go (with it's initial comment on addition/response) at the top and the mission after

Marika Konings:what would be a reasonable deadline for the CCWG to provide its input?

Daniel Dardailler:For instance, it's not clear if I am allowed to implement this idea (move the mission text after the table) or if something reserved to the "editor"

Marika Konings:I would need a bit of time to collate the input prior to the next meeting

Marika Konings:@Elliot - we can also rename the column or provide specific guidance on the kind of input that you are looking for? If you have a description, I am happy to add it. enoss:sure

Marika Konings:@Daniel - I'm happy to make that change, but the reason on putting it first was to make clear that people are expected to use the mission references when filling out the table enoss:@erika correct

Daniel Dardailler: There are many other criteria we could consider as additional columns, like core values et commitments, internet layer applicable, commons, etc

enoss:I like something simple like "desirability" or "preferred category". anything that indicates whether this type of project is very important to the participant

MarilynCade:I would like to review the examples. From the BC perspective, for instance, examples that are about SSR and capacity building about awareness and engagement in ICANN and related events could be a high priority, but we need to consult within the 3 of the BC participants.

MarilynCade:Could we have perhaps initial comments, and then a final date?

Kavouss Arasteh: 19 october

MarilynCade:but try to have some comments to discuss for next call.

enoss: the 19th feels like lots

Marika Konings:so deadline would have to be 16 Oct to give staff time to prepare prior to the meeting

Maureen Hilyard:+1 Marika - it would be good to have a tidied up version of the comments

MarilynCade: I continue to object to this group trying to define what is the Open Internet. This is a very challenging discussion. If you as members insist, then you can reference the various definitions

Daniel Dardailler:I disagree that the name Open Internet is already "owned" by NN

MarilynCade: I proposed the open and interoperable Internet. We believe in a single root for the open and interoperable Internet.

Daniel Dardailler:it's perfectly fine as a label to use for our description

MarilynCade:But, to respond, Daniel, regretably, we are affected by the media understanding.

MarilynCade: We are not at ICANN abotu the Open Internet, but about the open and interoperable Internet.

Daniel Dardailler:IMO, interoperable is a quality of being open enoss:question for kavouss: what is very (very) sensitive? I may be missing something

Daniel Dardailler:kavous, we need a label to make references MarilynCade:Focus on mission of ICANN. Yes. I support you, Kavouss.

Maureen Hilyard: I like Kavouss's suggestion

Daniel Dardailler: I don't support the suggestion

enoss:I do not support it either

Wale Bakare:+Daniel

MarilynCade:Dearest Erika. we need to be very short. Maybe only the mission and then anything else is discussion.

Wale Bakare: I don't agree with that as well. We are focusing on projects around Open Internet in a different concept not based on political motive, IMO

enoss:rather than, or in addition to, us saying we like/don't like the inclusion, I would (sincerely) like to understand what is sensitive. I feel I am missing something and don't want to be insensitive to something I am not aware of

Daniel Dardailler:kavous is not on the chat but I think the sensitivity is around net neutrality, gov surveillance, etc

Daniel Dardailler:in many countries, people are fighting for an "open internet" vs many things

Daniel Dardailler:but so what ?

enoss:@daniel, thanks. @erika, could you ask him fdirectly? MarilynCade:I keep insisting that we are using the term open and interoperable Internet. Not the term" Open Internet".

Daniel Dardailler:Marilin, can an open internet be non - nteroperable ?

Wale Bakare: There seems misconception here

MarilynCade: I am laughing as the media does not accept the small 'n" and "captial N" and in fact the Canadian government itself is in need of your counsel, Elliot.

enoss:no

Erika Mann:Daniel, Elliot, neither do I but I like to avoid an endless debate about the concept of 'open Internet'

Erika Mann:... therefore I'm searching for a solution we all can agree upon

MarilynCade:Really, Eliott, you cannot help us with your Canadian government as they are quite engaged and we could use your input to them.

Daniel Dardailler:I'm lost as to why we need to mention net neutrality at all

Hadia Elminiawi:yes

Erika Mann:Marilyn, please talk!

Daniel Dardailler:I don't mind that we use Open Interoperable Internet vs. just Open

MarilynCade:if you do any search about Open Internet, you do not actually get a neutral statement. I did the research, using multiple search engines.

enoss:I also note I do not at all mind a disclaimer that
excludes any position being taking on net neutrality in the US
Wale Bakare:Not for me

enoss:nor do I have a problem with interoperable

Ching Chiao: "The idea of an "open Internet" is the idea that the full resources of the Internet and means to operate on it should be easily accessible to all individuals, companies and organizations. This often includes ideas such as net neutrality, open standards, transparency, lack of Internet censorship, and low barriers to entry."

enoss:it is more, not less

Ching Chiao: this is from wikipedia

Maureen Hilyard: I go with open and interoperable

enoss:(that is not a bad thing)

Hadia Elminiawi:fine with open interoperable internet

Wale Bakare:Open Inter-operable internet is a good concept but Open captures all the underlined technologies including ICANN core business

Wale Bakare: I mean Open Internet captures all the underlined technologies unlimited to DNS systems

enoss:sure

Manal Ismail:+1 Kavouss regarding 'description' not 'definition' and for the scope of this CCWG work ..

Jonathan Robinson:Yes

MarilynCade:I do not ntink I am an oponent. but if Jonathan joins, I will

MarilynCade: I love being a contributor.

Jonathan Robinson: Proponent?

MarilynCade:Yes.

MarilynCade:or anyone else that loves us.

Jonathan Robinson:@Erika. Important to frame the question

properly so that the DT is tightly / clearly scoped

Jonathan Robinson:OK

Hadia Elminiawi:can contribute as well to the preamble

Daniel Dardailler:is there a clear version of the document ?

with typo/dup fixed ? the view/final still has lots of them Manal Ismail: Happy to contribute as well ..

enoss:thats ok for me

Jonathan Robinson: THanks Marika. That's helpful. I was just keen to get it scoped for all.
