#### Introduction

From 26 – 29 June 2017, African Regional At-Large Organisation (AFRALO) members, together with other attendees, gathered in Johannesburg, South Africa for the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) 59 meeting. 42 participants from 26 countries represented their respective At-Large Structures (ALSes) in the General Assembly and other capacity building sessions during the meeting.

## 2. Local Community Engagement

*Monday, 26 June 2017; 9:30 – 12:00 GMT+2* 

Since the ICANN 47 meeting in Durban, South Africa (July 2013), AFRALO has engaged with local communities each time an ICANN meeting is held in Africa. This time, the session gathered approximately 30 students from the University of Johannesburg, 30 students/inters from the Innovation Hub Management Company, around 42 ALS representatives and other participants interested in At-Large activities. ### 3. AFRALO ALS Capacity Building Sessions

## 4. AFRALO General Assembly

Wednesday, 28 June 2017 [Part 1: 09:15 – 10:15; Part 2: 10:30 – 12:00 GMT+2]

The General Assembly was held in 2 parts. During Part 1, there was a guest address from - Göran Marby (ICANN President and CEO), which was followed by the signing of a renewed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between African Network Operating Center (AFRINIC) and AFRALO for collaboration and mutual support. An Activity report – From London to Johannesburg - was presented by Aziz Hilali (AFRALO Chair).



Other invited speakers were Cherine Chalaby (ICANN Board Vice Chair), Pierre Dandjinou (ICANN VP, GSE Africa), Alan Greenberg (ALAC Chair), Sunday Folayan (Chairman, Board of Directors, AFRINIC & founding member AFRALO) and Khaled Koubaa (ICANN Board Director).
