Background: Draft Data Escrow Specification

- IRT confirmed that data escrow should be required for all PP providers
- Data escrow industry standards have been updated since RAA was drafted
- IRT polled in late June: Should PPAA include updated specification, similar to RA?
- Poll results: 6/8 Respondents said "Yes" but issues remain to be resolved
- IRT Feedback to Date: What is the benefit to using the updated specification as opposed to the requirements from the RAA (Section 3.6)?



Data Escrow Specification Options

- Option 1: Expand the Registrar Data Escrow specification to handle P/P data
 - CSV format
 - \circ somewhat loose spec
 - defined by ICANN
- Option 2: Use the Data Escrow Specification used by registries
 - XML/CSV format
 - includes a verification process
 - o defined with the participation of the community
 - intended to be a general data escrow specification
 - intended to be standardized in the IETF



- Require DEAs to notify ICANN of deposits made, status and basic stats
- Optionally allows P/P providers to know the status of their deposits (from an ICANN compliance perspective)



Background: PPAA Amendment Process

- Proposed amendment process in draft PPAA is nearly identical to RAA
- Initial IRT feedback suggested that this process might be too lengthy/complicated considering that this is a completely new contract and we may need more flexibility to adjust based on experience
- PPAA draft includes two amendment processes:
 - Section 6: Board-initiated amendment process
 - Many procedural requirements
 - Section 7.4: Negotiation process
 - This can be initiated by ICANN and/or Providers
 - If parties agree, amendment posted for public comment and then incorporated into agreement
- Negotiation process has fewer steps than the Board-initiated process



Overview: PPAA Negotiation Process

- PPAA negotiation process (Section 7.4):
 - ICANN or chair of Provider working group proposes amendment
 - ICANN and working group work for at least 90 days to develop amendment
 - If agreement is reached, ICANN posts proposed
 amendment for public comment
 - ICANN/WG consider public comments; proposed amendment sent to Providers and Board for approval
 - If approved, amendment effective upon 60 days' notice
 - If agreement is not reached, either ICANN or Provider WG may elect to pursue mediation/arbitration



IRT Ranking of PPAA Issues List

- ICANN has identified approximately 20 issues that we know need to be addressed in PPAA draft.
- ICANN specifically requests IRT discussion on these topics (though IRT feedback and discussion is requested on all aspects of the draft contract)
- As a starting point, ICANN proposes to schedule IRT discussions on the draft by topic
- IRT is requested to rank issues on issues list so that discussion schedule can be created
- Results of poll will be used to create calendar, which will be distributed to IRT after this meeting
