What does the SSR2 Review focus on?



SECURITY

Assessing the security, operational stability, and resiliency matters, both physical and network, relating to the coordination of the Internet's system of unique identifiers



STABILITY

Ensuring conformance with appropriate security contingency planning framework for the Internet's system of unique identifiers



RESILIENCY

Maintaining clear and globally interoperable security processes for those portions of the Internet's system of unique identifiers that ICANN coordinates

What skills do you need for the Review Team?

General Skills:

- Commitment and time to participate
- Team spirit, consensus-seeking attitude
- Willingness to learn
- Readiness to contribute
- Objectivity, put aside personal opinions
- Analytical skills
- Capacity to draw fact-based conclusions
- Good communications skills using multiple methods and tools

Specific Expertise:

- Understand Internet Unique Identifiers, including: DNS, IP numbering, AS numbers, protocol parameters
- Identify and mitigate abuse within those sectors
- Understand operation of the DNS root name system
- Understand malware and abuse vectors and mitigations
- Conduct risk assessment and management
- Have background in corporate data security and/or business systems
- Understand incident response

Introduction: ATRT3-RT

- The SSC has been tasked with reviewing candidates who are seeking GNSO endorsement for the ATRT3. The SSC will recommend a slate of candidates to the GNSO Council.
- Nine candidates are seeking endorsement from the GNSO.
- As with the RDS-RT, the SSC may recommend up to 7 candidates, including up to 3 primary candidates.
- Per the Staff Assessment of Expertise, one candidate meets all criteria, two candidates meet most criteria, and six candidates meet some criteria.

Finalize reports with recommendations to achieve measurable outcomes

Provide recommendations for Board consideration











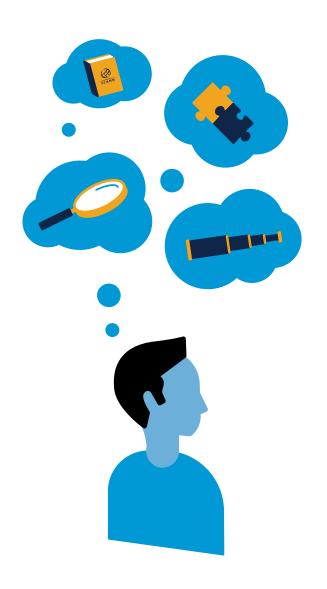

Specific Knowledge & Expertise Needed for ATRT



- Performance assessment and audits
- Good governance and board performance
- Performance measurement
- Process improvement
- Knowledge of recognized frameworks for organizational excellence
- Principles of accountability applicable to organizations broadly similar to ICANN



Proposed Timeline for ATRT3-RT Selection



To Summarize

After SSC members individually assess the candidates, the group will meet to discuss the ranking. If the group is able to make a selection quickly, it can submit recommendations in time for the September GNSO Council meeting. If the SSC needs additional time to deliberate, the next opportunity to submit a motion is the October Council meeting.
