Lori Schulman: Backing up Kiran's comment, perhaps a solution is to allow local participants just for GDPR discussion. This would take past practice into account and still respect overall balance of the meeting.

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: that's great benedetta, thanks

Joan Kerr: A key take away is a great idea Renata

Tony Harris: Apology, must step away for a while

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: that could be a path too, certainly it will be the most appropriate time to get into a same page on that

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: thanks Steve

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: Joan yes, we have little time for all the discussions but I'm sure we can do it

Tony Holmes: What is the benefit of being an observer over remote participation?

Mary Wong: @Kiran, from the staff side, this is a matter for the planning committee to decide; however, we want to note that there may indeed be space constraints so even if this arrangement is agreed to we will need to see how many more folks can be accommodated.

Kiran Malancharuvil: Many people have expressed a desire to attend in person as an observer as preferential to remote participation.

Kiran Malancharuvil: It's not our job as their representatitves to question the preference

Kiran Malancharuvil: I don't understand how it creates a disadvantage if they are only observing

Louise Marie Hurel: agree with Ulrich

Tony Holmes: If we start allowing observers what happens when the numbers wanting to join exceeds capacity? How do we decide who can come?

Kiran Malancharuvil: I suppose that's a risk with every open ICANN meeting, how do we ever deeal with "capacity" issues? Is that a hypothetical that has ever materialized?

Ines Hfaiedh: Hi everyone

Tony Holmes: I thought that was why we're limited to 7 participants each at the Intercessional?

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: Yes Farzaneh, I agree that in person observers have way much more leeway

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: Yes Tony

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: as for the closing messages I think there could be a scenario without convergence on points but that will be ascertained once the sessions are done

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: yes

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: preserving the balance is key

Mary Wong: Following up on the lunch slot - as Benedetta mentioned, the Day 2 lunch arrangement with the Board does not allow for a formal meeting.

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: I think we should still have the preparation

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: even though we don't have a formal meeting

Tony Holmes: AGREE with Renata

Barbara Wanner: agree that the lunch on Feb 1 provides a good chance to hone preparations for Board and CEO meetings

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: any update on the strategic session being a webinar or something similar?

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: yes

Steve DelBianco: teh Whiteboarding sessions with MSSI, right?

Renata Aquino Ribeiro: yes

Sam Lanfranco: It might be useful to review the intent of the Intersessional as captured in the first Intersessional agenda in 2016. In my view it was more about figuring out how to work together better on a menu of issues, and less like a high level "Cabinet/Ministerial Meeting" to battle over the issues on the ICANN policy table at the moment.
