





The Context for IDN

- A multilingual world with diverse writing systems/scripts
- More than 7000 living languages in the world, of which about 50% spoken in the Asia Pacific region
- Numerous writing systems/scripts (fewer than languages)
 - Examples: Han, Hindi and Arabic
- IDNs are meant to serve the online needs of a world that is diverse in languages and script



Milestones

- IDNA Protocol developed by IETF in 2003
- IDN at the second level introduced in 2004
- IDN ccTLD introduced in 2010
- Dot Asia's sunrise period for CJK in 2011
- IDN gTLD in 2013



Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs)

- IDN Domain Names that can be represented in scripts, in addition to Latin, e.g. Chinese, Thai, Devanagari and Arabic
- IDNs enable opportunities for local communities to come online with their own content





IDN TLD Program: Label Generation Rules (LGR) for the Root Zone

- Need for community to determine valid and unique IDN Top Level Domains (TLDs)
- For each script or writing system, community to define:
 - Which code points are valid for use?
 - Are any of these code points variants of each other?
 - Are the any additional constraints on the labels?


- Label constraints
 - ⊙ Cannot mix ≤ and ≤ in a label








Root Zone LGR Development Status

Coordination Challenges

- Some writing systems share same script, so need to coordinate for variant sets
 - Chinese, Japanese and Korean all use Han script
- Some writing systems have cross-script variant letters, so need to coordinate to identify them
 - Some letters among Khmer, Lao and Thai look similar
 - Some letters among Armenian, Cyrillic, Greek and Latin look the same as letters in other scripts in this set



Other End-User Issues (1/3)

- Security issues
 - Ability to mix scripts to simulate letters
 - Homographs and user confusion
 - paypal.com
 - How will end-users be protected ?



Other End-User Issues (2/3)

- Users would prefer emails in their own languages
- IDN-based emails: Quite hard at this time
 - സതീഷ് @ नमस्कार.भारत
- There is limited support for such email IDs in most common email systems
- Special (and paid) services are required
