
EVIN ERDOĞDU:

Good morning, good afternoon, and good evening, everyone. Welcome to the ALAC Subcommittee on Outreach and Engagement call on Tuesday, 3 October 2017, from 15:00-16:30 UTC.

Today on the call with us we have Dev Anand Teelucksingh, Glenn McKnight, Olivier Crépin-Leblond, Ali AlMeshal, Cheryl Langdon-Orr, Satish Babu, and Lianna Galstyan.

We have listed apologies from Tijani Ben Jemaa, Holly Raiche, Vanda Scartezini, Bartlett Morgan, Jacqueline Morris, Yrjö Länsipuro, and Adam Peake.

On staff, we have with us Heidi Ullrich, Gisella Gruber, Silvia Vivanco, Deborah Escalera, Jia-Rong Low who just joined us, and myself, Evin Erdoğan. I will also be doing call management.

Our Spanish interpreters are Claudia and Veronica, and our French interpreters are Isabelle and Camila.

I would like to remind everyone to please state your name for the record and also for transcription purposes.

With that, I'll turn it over to you, Dev. Please begin.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH:

Thank you very much, Evin. Thanks, everyone, for attending this Outreach and Engagement Subcommittee call. We're now coming to less than four weeks away from ICANN60, and this call is [so we need to have a discussion on] what potential outreach we can do on behalf of

At-Large at ICANN60 and also to discuss the outreach at the IGF 2017 which will be happening in December.

I now just want to jump straight into the agenda, and that is Outreach at ICANN60. I have not really seen much clarity at least on the At-Large wiki at least as to what are the potential activities. I've noted that APRALO is planning several activities as part of the internal AGM. I see Ali has a hand raised so, Ali, perhaps you can give us an update on that.

ALI ALMESHAL: Thanks, Dev. With regard to the outreach activity, I want just to brief you about... Do you hear me? Hello?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yes, Ali, we can hear you.

ALI ALMESHAL: Okay, great. Let me just update you about the activity that has been done [part] of the outreach for the ICANN60. Last week, I was with the Middle East and Africa [inaudible] Baher Esmat and Fahd Batayneh in UAE, and we have reached out to a number of universities there part of this ICANN outreach plan.

To continue on track as well, Fahd Batayneh is in Bahrain this week starting from today. We'll have meetings with the technical community, with the academia community, and ccTLD as well. Today started with the telecom regulatory authority in Bahrain, and by tomorrow there will

be different meetings with different academia or different universities. It's all about coming around the ICANN60.

Also, there is an arrangement but not yet confirmed with the Entrepreneur Center in Egypt to come to Bahrain to conduct a two-day workshop on the DNSSEC, university students as well. But this one has not yet been confirmed. I'm waiting for that.

These are part of the APRALO activity with the region for ICANN60. Thank you. Back to you, Dev.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Thanks, Ali, for this. A question for me was that, and perhaps you or Satish can answer this question, but in terms of an ALS presence in United Arab Emirates, do we have any ALSes there? You mentioned telecom companies, so I guess we may not be able to get potential At-Large joining from those telecom companies but perhaps from the academia. You mentioned several universities. Do you think that these academia are able to join At-Large? I'm opening that to either you, Ali, or Satish. Okay, Satish, go ahead.

SATISH BABU: Thanks, Ali and Dev. I think we're first going to note what Silvia has pointed out, that the Middle East is actually straddling two regions. It comes under the [GSE] Middle East, which is a different part of ICANN as opposed to the rest of Asia Pacific which comes under the APAC Hub. Now this actually potentially has a little bit of room for some confusion, but what has happened here is that Ali has actually directly got involved

because he is from the region. He has been coordinating with the Middle East group of ICANN [GSE].

Now unlike Hyderabad where we had a cross-section of ICANN staff, including I remember Adam and several others who were part of this group, here it is largely restricted to the [GSE] Middle East and Ali representing APRALO. That's one part, which is the background and the context.

On the actual outreach activities, these have been largely planned between Ali and the Middle East group. Now we can, of course, suggest things to them. It appears that there are several restrictions, including security restrictions. We're not allowed to go out to the universities or colleges without a prior process, which makes it all the more difficult for us. Everything has got to be planned out in detail well before if you are someone from outside the region. So this is another wrinkle to this whole outreach aspect.

One suggestion that I probably have, although it's not directly answering your question, Dev, is that maybe we should list down on our wiki what are the activities that we are planning that this subcommittee also comes to know what we're planning and if there is any way to contribute. For instance, if there is an outreach activity at the venue at ICANN60, then maybe some of us can contribute.

So it's a little bit complicated in this case. Thank you.

BAHER ESMAT: This is Baher for the record from ICANN [inaudible]. Can I put myself in the queue please?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Certainly you can, Baher. Thanks for that. In fact, perhaps you can go ahead.

BAHER ESMAT: Thank you. Sorry I couldn't join from the beginning. I had difficulty joining the bridge.

At the beginning, I want to thank Ali for joining us last week in Dubai for the outreach activities, and I want also to maybe add this. The question raised about whether there are any ALSes in United Arab Emirates, yes, there is one ALS called Emirates Internet Group which also happens to be the ISOC chapter. It's not very active. They have some issues at national level to be able to establish themselves as a legal entity, so they're trying to deal with those issues. However, they were present at the [inaudible] event that we organized on the 28th. A couple of their members were there and were engaging in the discussion and they also shared information about the event and about ICANN60 with their members and they promised to continue to do this and to also [inaudible] in Abu Dhabi.

The other question regarding whether we can get new [inaudible] whether from academia or other NGOs to become ALSes, in fact this was one of the messages that Ali conveyed during his presentation at

the universities [we] met with, to become part of the At-Large community and to become At-Large Structures.

At the same time, as Satish has noted, it's a little bit complicated there to be able to engage with them to organize something with universities we need some security clearance. And then also for any organization to become or to be part of a global entity, whether ISOC or ICANN, there is also some process at the national level that they have to go through. Oftentimes while people might be interested to join and to become active, they might not be willing to go through any process of that kind.

However, we will continue our efforts with the academic sector in United Arab Emirates over the next couple of weeks. We're trying to organize one or two more activities with two other universities, and we'll do our best to get them to send some of their faculty members or students to the meeting in Abu Dhabi and also to continue to share with them information about At-Large and how to become members of At-Large. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thanks, Baher. I see Ali has a response. Go ahead, Ali.

ALI ALMESHAL: Thanks, Dev. Just to add to Baher as well, there has been a media roundtable that most of the media have been invited to attend that roundtable. We have the TRA, which is the host, was there in the UAE meeting. So that is just to make the voice and more awareness about the ICANN meeting in Abu Dhabi. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thanks for that. Any other thoughts or comments? Olivier? I saw a hand raised, but did you take it down?

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: I took it down. I typed everything I needed to type. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right, thanks for that. I think two things that come to mind – ah, Naveed. Please go ahead.

NAVEED BIN RAIS: Hi. Can you hear me?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yes, we can. Go ahead.

NAVEED BIN RAIS: Okay. As I am one of the local ones residing in the UAE, I have been trying to help bring these outreach programs. Unfortunately, last week when Ali visited us we [couldn't] hold an interaction with difficulty and the staff but we do the security clearance [inaudible] get them interacted with the general audience that is the students. So we are planning to have another session with Bahrain by the end of next week, I think. There I can – I'm not sure if Ali because we have to go through clearance again – so I can represent APRALO in that session, sharing

some time with Baher. I'm doing all that we can at the ground level to help this outreach. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Thanks, Naveed. I think, Satish and Ali, do you want to respond? I think this will be good. Satish, go ahead.

SATISH BABU: Thanks, Dev. A couple of observations. I'd like to know from Baher or Ali if we are planning any events at the venue of ICANN60 where the security restrictions may be less. So that's one question. The other is to Naveed. Thanks, Naveed, for the offer. Please coordinate with Ali and between the two of you please work out how you should represent APRALO. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thanks for that also. Can I make a suggestion just before we jump into events at ICANN60? We have some presentations about ICANN At-Large. I don't know if that could be translated in time for your meetings with the academia and potential students at the university. I don't know, Naveed, if you're aware. I believe you have been aware of that in fact. You attended some of the presentations that Outreach and Engagement has done regarding the introduction to At-Large. Perhaps, Naveed, would you like to see if you can use that presentation? Also, the second question, if that presentation could be translated. I'll post the link in the chat for that.

I see Ali has a follow up comment or question. Ali, go ahead.

ALI ALMESHAL: Thanks, Dev. If you notice, I have tried to give that type of presentation which is about At-Large and Engagement. Really it's a big thanks for you and for the team who have worked on this. I have used this presentation in my meetings with the university, which is the At-Large presentation that has been done in March I believe this year. So that one has been used. We used the English one. I don't think we would need anything to be done in a different language. The English version was [great there], if this is what you are referring to.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Correct. Yes, that's the one I was referring to. I'm glad to see it has proven useful.

ALI ALMESHAL: It is very much useful.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thank you very much. Naveed?

NAVEED BIN RAIS: I have two points. One is that in UAE, general audience in terms of universities and [companies] and organizations, everybody speaks English and understands it. That's like an official language for organizations because of internationalization, so I don't think that a translation if not available would not be a problem I think.

The second thing is I just want to offer if I can help. I am also ready to visit different universities if they are planned with Baher or with any other APRALO member. I can travel distance and try to help in this outreach. Because I am local, I don't need that kind of security clearance or the permission to talk to. As long as it does not conflict with my work schedule, I can always go and do that. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thank you. I see a comment coming in from Siliva. Silvia?

SILVIA VIVANCO: Hello. Yes, thank you, everyone. I just wanted to encourage everyone to please send us any photos or tweets or Facebook posts whenever you are attending these [great] events. I am in contact with Baher and Fahd for our [GSE] team in the Middle East. So we will be retweeting, reposting, and just promoting through our social media channels all the great activities that you are already engaged in. So just don't forget to send us and also share it through the mailing list so we can get the links and post them in our social media channels. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thanks for that, Silvia. This has all been very interesting. Naveed, I think perhaps you and, of course, Satish and Ali with Baher we could discuss if there is any other potential for other academia outreach to speak of. You mentioned that there's going to be a session next week with Baher. My only comment is that I do want to have this tracked in some form or other. So I would like to just suggest as a staff action item

to just note these pre-events, so to speak, on the wiki page. So we can note these [pre]-events on the wiki page so that we're aware of what they are and if there are any follow ups that need to happen. So that's one thing.

I guess the second thing we want to talk about is I know that, yes, there are challenges in trying to do any external outreach given the security concerns as Baher and Satish have mentioned. So is it possible then that we can organize a session and invite these academia that we reached out [to] at these pre-events to attend? I guess what I probably would like to ask is whether you think the At-Large should have its own event, be it for one hour or perhaps a longer type of session, at ICANN60 where we have discussion, we invite persons from the various academia, students, faculty members to attend the ICANN60 meeting and also attend the session where we can do an introduction to At-Large and/or present on certain core At-Large policy topics?

Does anybody have any particular thoughts on that? Ali, go ahead.

ALI ALMESHAL:

Thanks, Dev. I just said I will answer if Baher is not yet on the call. If Baher is on the call, I think he has more clarity on this. Baher?

BAHER ESMAT:

Yes, I am on the call. Thank you, Ali. Thank you, Dev. I think this is a good idea to organize a one-hour or 90-minute session with the community and invite them to attend. Actually, one of our messages during our meetings last week with the [three] universities we met with

was to encourage them to come to ICANN60 to attend the newcomers day and also to attend some of the sessions that relate to At-Large and the user community.

In one university, [they report] that they are going to try to arrange for a group of students and faculty to go together, and we're following up with them on that. So in principle I think it's a good idea. I think it requires a little coordination between APRALO and ICANN staff together with the invitees from the different universities. Like if we have a specific date and time for this session that we can share with them ahead of time before the event, I think that will help them also plan accordingly. But I agree that this is a good idea. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Thank you, Baher. I note also Deborah from ICANN is also noting in the chat that NextGen would also be available for outreach events on Saturday, 20 October. Okay, so and potentially the NextGen students attending would also be available to attend such a session. Seeming no one is objecting – all right, I see Ali has a comment at least. Go ahead, Ali.

ALI ALMESHAL: Thanks, Dev. On the same subject, we have communicated this in our presentation and meeting with the universities that this is average and we would like them to come and join us on the ICANN meeting at least one or two days, whatever suits them. Actually, the security or the management of the university have no objection to that. But to be honest, we haven't got a clear yes. They said yes, we want to do that,

but we don't know if they will be sending students or will accept to get the students to come to the university. They showed interest, but now we need to do some more follow up just to make sure they can bring students to attend at least the NextGen or any of the At-Large activities or At-Large sessions as well. Okay, thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: All right. Thanks, Ali. I think it supports to have a session with a specific date and time for a meeting to do an introduction to At-Large and to answer any questions from the students/academia from the area as well as for the Fellows and NextGen students. My question now would then be to staff. I don't know, probably Gisella or Heidi, is there potential for this in terms of in the schedule to have such an outreach session?

HEIDI ULLRICH: Hi, Dev. As I wrote on the – I'm just going to go on mute for one moment – sorry. My voice is back. As I wrote in the chat, is this an additional spot now? Because, again, the meeting schedule closed a week or so ago – two weeks ago I believe. So this would now need to take either the Subcommittee on Outreach and Engagement slot or then use another working group slot meaning another working group would not be able to hold their meeting.

Another option – and, Gisella, correct me if I'm wrong – is we would just be able to assign that for an informal meeting. So you wouldn't really have a whole lot of services, but you would be able to have a room and talk to people. Gisella, jump in. Go ahead, Gisella.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Go ahead, Gisella.

GISELLA GRUBER: Thank you, Dev. Thank you, Heidi. Yes, my question as per the chat is, and apologies for the delay in getting this out to you, we do have a slot for the Outreach and Engagement working group. I haven't finalized the slot yet. The only reason why is because I'm trying to have an overall look at the ICANN schedule, the internal one that we have access to, to make sure that none of the major working groups clash with any of the LAC or the APAC space meetings, etc.

What I can suggest on my side is a 60- or possibly a 75-minute working group session. I do have a 90-minute session if this was to replace the Outreach and Engagement working group or, as Heidi said, the smaller pop-up rooms. But just remember with those that there are absolutely no services. So again, I just want to emphasize that no services, no recording, and it is not on the main schedule. If we do use the Outreach and Engagement working group slot, it will be on the schedule and we will have interpretation. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thanks for that, Gisella. Well, I would not want it to replace the working group slot. But regarding this space that's available without, as they say, the services, what's the capacity of such rooms? I'm tempted to say we can go for that slot if – now, when you say no services, does that mean there's nothing we can display on a screen with a projector

or is it that you just mean that there's no recording and no interpretation?

GISELLA GRUBER:

Dev, if I may, it will depend on the number of people that you're thinking of. If you decide on a pop-up room, I would need to check on the availability. I believe that we're going to have access to these meeting rooms with no services as of next Monday, but I can already work in the background on this. An approximately number of people you would be thinking of.

No services means that potentially, depending on which room we get – again, sorry to be so vague – it can literally be not even any microphones. But if we have a larger room, I'm hoping for microphones. But again then, we may not have a screen and we definitely won't have recording. A screen, I can again see if we can pull some strings to get a room where at least we have a screen up front. But again, just bear in mind that there would be no remote participation possible.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH:

Okay, thanks for that. I'm thinking things like remote participation isn't – hmm, well, let me make a suggestion or ask the group. I think interpretation is not critical from what I understood from Naveed and Baher and Ali. We should be able to have a conversation in English. But I do think that microphones would be needed and I would think that as Satish is saying and Olivier is agreeing, a mic and a projector would be needed at least to show what this is particular comment, this is how we organize things, etc. So I think we do need a room that – it may not

need to be recorded, does not need interpretation but we do need a microphone and projector. And so I guess it's my suggestion and if nobody objects, we should try to find a room which has at least microphones and a projector to present contents on.

Ali, go ahead. Sorry. Gisella first and then Ali.

GISELLA GRUBER:

Sorry, again, just to remind that this session won't be anywhere on a public schedule so it would be up to the group to make sure that we publicize this session to the people we're focusing it on. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH:

Okay, understood without a doubt. Ali? Go ahead.

ALI ALMESHAL:

Thanks. The most important is that we need to specify the date. If we want to communicate with the universities, are we getting them on the NextGen Day which is on the 28th or there is another date that we have to get them into the venue? Because I think they will come maybe only for a day and they will go back.

So that's the most important, for us to communicate the date directly with the university and give them specifically which day, which time. So to ensure that and to get their response, whether they will be able to join or no.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, all right. I fully agree and it does not have to be on the form of ICANN schedule but we just communicate the actual date, time and where. I think that's all that's particularly needed. Naveed?

NAVEED BIN RAIS: Yes. Two points. One is I just want to clarify my point earlier remark regarding the calculation. What I meant is when you communicate to the prior meeting as outreach, I said most of the organization has [internationalization] so they will understand that. But normally, people here are reluctant and shy and not feel comfortable if they talk, when they communicate. So for them, the calculation is absolutely mandatory if you really want to outreach. So I just want to differentiate between the two points.

The second thing, because I am coordinating and I'm trying to have my students to ICANN at least for a day – and this is what we discussed when Ali and Baher and others visited last week – so it will definitely be for one week and that is when we coordinate. It's up to them later if they want to continue or whatever but prior to visiting, we can obviously coordinate and see if we can engage them at the day that they visit, because that is going to be already a coordinated visit when one or two security members would be with them, helping them, taking them there and then getting them back so we can do that easily.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. Thanks Naveed for that. Okay, so I think next action item then is for staff – and for Gisella I'm sure, this will probably fall to you – to [finally] find a room that has at least microphones and a projector.

And I know the challenges noted regarding interpretation but if interpretation could be provided but the core thing is microphone and projector and the goal of such a session will be to invite the various persons to talk at the academia, the faculty, students to come to the meeting venue and for us to have a one-on-one session with the faculty and students from the area. Okay?

So daytime capacity and duration – I would suggest the day will be on Saturday. I'm asking if anybody would have an objection to that. I see Naveed has an objection to something. I presume this is regarding the interpretation criteria? Naveed? Go ahead, Naveed and then Heidi.

NAVEED BIN RAIS: No. Nothing from here actually as I was trying clear the lower end and [inaudible] I clicked on that. All okay.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Oh, okay. Thank you. Okay. Heidi? You want to ask a question or clarifying question? Okay.

HEIDI ULLRICH: [Inaudible]

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Heidi, I'm not hearing you.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Hello? Can you hear me?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Now, we can hear you.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Okay, that's great. So we do appreciate Naveed [inaudible].

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Unfortunately, Heidi, you've gotten distorted again. I think I could be wrong but I'm not hearing Heidi anymore.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Hello?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: You're coming in and out, unfortunately.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Okay. I think it's time for a new phone. Okay. Hello?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Well, let's try it again. I heard you the third time so let's try again. Go ahead, Heidi.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Again, I'll just make it short. We appreciate the purpose of this outreach and we'll do our best to schedule it but this is again two weeks after the [inaudible]. For me, it would be very [unlikely]. If it's on a Saturday, keep in mind that At-Large, it's normally scheduled full-day meetings all day Saturday, all day Sunday. So you do need to keep that all in mind. So I'm not sure if Saturday is the best day for this.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Well, I appreciate that the schedule is always a challenging one to work with. And I will defer to staff to come up with – if Sunday or Monday even, it would be a Saturday then I think I'll defer to you on that.

In terms of the questions that Gisella was asking, the duration, minimum of one hour. Capacity – well, I will ask Naveed and Baher. What do you think? If you were to announce to people to come at this particular date and time and in this room, how much people do you think will be able to attend in terms of [inaudible] capacity needed? Okay. Are you all hearing me now?

BAHER ESMAT: Yes, I can hear you Dev. I don't know about the rest.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: My question to –

BAHER ESMAT:

The point here is I raise a question to Naveed. His hand is up right now because I don't know if Saturday will be suitable for students because Saturday is not a working day. So I don't know if that students will be able to join or university will be able to arrange on Saturday. And we are speaking about university, one is Ajman University and the other university that we have met is Sharda University and both showed the interest. So maybe for Ajman, Naveed can help us with that and give us some feedback.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGHL: Okay. And I'll appreciate the feedback. Naveed?

NAVEED BIN RAIS:

I was just thinking that Saturday may not be a good day and not only because it's not a working day. But because from the university's perspective, we want to expose the students to the real meeting and that actually starts the Sunday and all the registration, the process, the people and the newcomers. That's what we were targeting because they would not understand anything except the newcomer things and all that and that's happening on Sunday.

So I'm not sure if Saturday is the right day and I'm not talking only about my university, I think for any outreach and for any newcomer coming in, Saturday would not be fine, I think. Sunday would be better if we can arrange something.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Let me ask a question then and I guess I'll ask especially the coaches to chime in on this. The option is of course is to use the subcommittee on Outreach and Engagement slot. Gisella or Heidi, can you confirm when that slot is?

HEIDI ULLRICH: Hi, that would be a Gisella question. So Gisella, do you happen to know that?

GISELLA GRUBER: As I said, the working groups were the last elements to the puzzle that is put together. We have two options of 90-minute sessions with interpretation on microphones but these two slots are running parallel with a cross-community sessions one on Monday afternoon running against the operating standards for specific reviews. And the other one, currently on Thursday from 13:30 to 15:00 running against the jurisdiction cross-community sessions. Those are the longer slots that we've got, the 90-minute slot. If you're looking at only a 60-minute slot, then I can put those forth to you probably within the next 12 hours by e-mail.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Well, I think let's do that. I'm thinking one hour would be sufficient for this. I don't think we need 90 minutes. Okay, so let's – go ahead Heidi.

HEIDI ULLRICH: A possibility is if we did use a 90-minute slot, we could do the first 30 minutes as proper subcommittee in Outreach Engagement meeting in which we discuss the IGF, for example, followed by a one-hour slot of outreach so that's probably another alternative as well. Then you could also just do the IGF planning by teleconference. So those are some options. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. That definitely it could work. What could happen is actually have the outreach session first and then 30 minutes to talk about regular outreach and engagement matter. We can do it that way and the key [inaudible] for being the IG.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Dev?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yes?

HEIDI ULLRICH: Sorry, we've seen... we have a lot of experience on how these meetings work and I think that it might be more useful to do a 30-minute slot of the meeting itself first. Because the outreach event usually I would suspect, that's going to go over. So if you had held that one first, then you'll likely to really cut down on the meeting time for any kind of regular sessions, just a thought there. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. So thanks for that, Heidi. Okay. So let's tentatively – I think we should try, given that Saturday may not be a good day, let's try to schedule a 90-minute session. I think using either one of those two sessions, I think Gisella mentioned either one option being one on Monday or one on Thursday. If you could just provide an e-mail, Gisella just said within the next 24 hours as to the exact time and whether there'll be actual room with microphones, projector, etc., etc., that will be good. And then what we can do is that we can have 30-minute outreach and engagement to discuss all matters. And then we can tell people to come in for that particular time when we do the actual outreach to the attendees from the various academia.

Okay? Is that okay? I see two queries from Ali and then Gisella. Ali, go ahead.

ALI ALMESHAL: Thanks, Dev. So what will be the program for the students after the outreach which is for the 90 minutes or the 30 minutes that they will have? I mean, I think we'll be having them for at least a full day, a full working day. So what is next for them after that? Are we going to take them to join the first sessions? What are you planning for them?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Well, it depends entirely on what day is being picked and what are the additional sessions. If it's held in the morning, then we could tell

them these are the various sessions that are going to be happening that day and invite them to be with us and we could sort of [inaudible].

ALI ALMESHAL:

I think it's better to have a prearranged program rather than just keeping open to them because as we said, they are new to the ICANN community. So I would suggest – I don't know about the rest – I would suggest to have some prearranged program for them. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH:

All right. Okay. The suggestion is noted. Gisella?

GISELLA GRUBER:

Thank you, Dev. Thank you, Ali. So if we're looking at the 90-minute slot sessions, the Monday advantage is that if they came to be there at 9:00, they would have the opening ceremony. They would have the cross-community session on the community inputs and feedback on progress and approach for conducting the work of the CCWG accountability. There's another cross-community session in the afternoon. They would then have the 90-minute session and then we've got the first part of the public forum and the gala evening that night.

Now, I don't know the specifics for the gala with the tickets, etc., but I don't think that it will be a huge issue but please don't quote me there. I would need to confirm with you.

The advantage on the Thursday is having the – again, I'm not sure how interesting it is for them but we've got the APRALO debrief. We've got

cross-community session in the morning on the general day to protection regulations.

In the afternoon after the working group at 15:00, we've got the second part of the topic forum and then to close off the day, we've got the ICANN wrap-up [cocktails]. So on both days, they've got the public forum. On both days, they've got a social event in the evening.

So if you would like to, I'll put that in an e-mail with the sessions on those days, and then you may be able to choose in that way. If again, which fits in best with the university timetables, etc. That's all for me.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Thank you so very much, Gisella, and I think we will look forward to that e-mail. And once we see those sessions... the question is this schedule up anywhere for anybody to look up? Is it on a wiki page or an ICANN website or whatever?

GISELLA GRUBER: Dev, not on the website yet, but I'll send you the wiki page as I'm actually just working on them now. And it would just be labeled as At-Large Working Group. Just let me prepare the e-mail for you because at [inaudible] where you can see the cross-community sessions. I'm busy adding those cross-community sessions to our wiki pages as well. If you give me a couple of hours, you'll have all the information on our wiki pages.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. Thanks, Gisella, so much for this. I think I will wait Gisella's e-mail noting the sessions that are potentially available on Monday versus Thursday. And then we'll make a decision very soon and then once you've confirmed it, we'll look on the date, time, and location within the ICANN venue. We can then issue that to promote to the various academia.

All right? Okay, anybody has any additional comments to add regarding this approach? Going once, going twice. Okay. Well, I see Gisella has a hand raised. Is that an additional hand or this is old hand?

GISELLA GRUBER: Apologies. Old one.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Thank you. All right. Very quickly. The information regarding reaching out to the academia, that could happen on either Monday or Thursday. I just noted something from Siranush and Deborah that you noted that the Fellows will be in sessions.

All right, just a note that obviously the date we picked for the Monday or Thursday session obviously we'll invite the Fellows and NextGen to that session once that date has been confirmed. Okay? And hopefully it would not be during a time where they will be in session.

All right. Okay. And that's a beep. Okay. I don't know where the beep is coming from but hopefully –

EVIN ERDOĞDU: Hello, Dev. Sorry about that. We're trying to locate the line that's causing that. Sounds like it stopped.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. That's good. Thanks Evin. All right.

Are there any other outreach activities at ICANN60? I mean, at the last ICANN meeting in ICANN59, there was a booth or a table or a space for At-Large. Will there be such opportunity at ICANN60 for that? I see Silvia and Satish both hands up. Satish first then Silvia.

SATISH BABU: Thank you, Dev. Yes, we have a booth for the whole of At-Large, which will be manned by volunteers that APRALO will provide but we might also call for volunteers within our community. And Silvia will be screening it up and we will manage it jointly. So Silvia might be able to add more.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Great. Thanks for that, Satish. Silvia? You may be muted, Silvia, because I'm not hearing you.

SILVIA VIVANCO: Hi, Dev. Sorry. Coming back in.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. I think Silvia is having some communication difficulties. Okay, Satish, do you have by chance have the link or whatever for this booth because I do recall some e-mails that this is going to be done.

SILVIA VIVANCO: Sorry. Hi, I am back. Sorry about that. I wanted to update everyone on the booth. Yes, we have a table allocated for At-Large and the priority for the APRALO event. But everybody from At-Large will be invited to be a volunteer and work with us at the table. We will be a table about one meter and 80 centimeters long. We have good size. We have three chairs and we are going to put a nice white table cloth. And also the background will be the APRALO banner and [inaudible] and I will be monitoring the booth and organizing the sign-up sheets which will be done as soon as the schedule is completed. We'll put it in an Excel form or Goggle Doc and we'll circulate it among everybody, asking for volunteers. So that should be done by the end of this week, so stay tuned for that.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay.

SILVIA VIVANCO: Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: All right. So thanks for that, Silvia. Okay, so that information – and I guess just note that as an action item and be sure to have that

circulated on the Outreach and Engagement and the of course APRALO list for this Goggle Doc and/or wiki page or whatever that's used to track the persons to volunteer at the booth.

Okay. All right. Okay, so now we have some clear idea of what some of the outreach activities are planned. We are going to have a session that's geared towards academia to invite to come to ICANN60 given the challenges of trying to go outside of the ICANN venue.

We are going to have At-Large booth, APRALO booth and we can all volunteer to assist, to be there to answer questions and so forth. Are there any other potential or any other outreach activity that perhaps we should be doing at ICANN60? I see Satish has a hand raised. Go ahead.

SATISH BABU: Sorry, that's an old hand.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. Well, I was wondering if there was any additional outreach that's been done on the civil society side of things. But I know that Adam Peake who is normally in charge of those civil society outreach at ICANN is unavailable on the call. So perhaps we can reach out to him and ask by e-mail if any such thing is planned. Glenn?

GLENN MCKNIGHT: Yes, hi. Olivier and I did an excellent joint civil society session with NCUC I believe the last session, and I'm just wondering if that has actually been put into the schedule. And Olivier did a great job. It was very well

attended because people who are coming, they really don't know where to – they don't know the difference between our communities and it was a great session to hear from members of the community that were there. So that's something that will be in the schedule. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay, thanks for that, Glenn. Olivier?

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: I was not expecting to speak so it took me a little while to unmute. I haven't got any plans yet. I haven't been asked. So if I'm asked, if I've got the time, then I'm happy to do a joint session of some sort. But I personally haven't been in touch with NCUC on all these things.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Do you want it and thus reach out to NCUC and ask, explore the possibilities of any joint sessions?

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: Well, I don't know what they're up to. It would be helpful to know in advance what they are up to. I have no idea what they're up to. I think that they might be having a pre-event event because that's often what they have but I haven't followed up on that, sorry.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. Okay, well let's just note that as an action item. Then perhaps we can reach out to NCUC and noting as Glenn pointed out, the

beneficial joint session that was held at the last ICANN meeting and is there a possibility to repeat that.

Olivier? I see another hand raised.

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: Yes, thanks very much Dev. You know, it's a bit late in the game to send the wake up and say, "Hey guys, you want to do something?" I'm sure they've already done something or they've already prepared something. We can certainly get in touch. I'm happy with that asking and see what they have. But I think we are late in actually coming to them and I'm a little concerned that if we were to say, "Hey, can we just jump in on your activities?" They might see it as – that we are not doing our homework and we're just trying to pull the rug in our direction. I don't know.

One has to be aware of the inside politics of [inaudible] of NCUC and NCSG and if they've spent several months preparing something, it would be a little bit like turning up one of our event and saying, "Hey, you know, can we also talk about NCUC and NCSG?" Now that said, I'm all for the collaboration and as you rightly said, it was very well attended and it was good fun. So if we can, then why not?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. All right. Well, I guess the thing is to find out. I'm being aware of what it is. It can't hurt. And you're right, it might be too late to get involved if it's an extensive event already planned. It can't hurt not to not know. Heidi?

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yes. Thank you. So rather than reaching out to them talking about ICANN60, it might be useful to reach out to them and ask them what their plans are for the IGF and then maybe have some informal chat about possible collaboration during ICANN60 for the IGF event and perhaps that 30-minute session of the subcommittee and outreach engagement might be a good platform or an opportunity for that to happen, that kind of discussion. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Thanks for that, Heidi. That's also a good idea. Any thoughts or comments regarding that? Perhaps reaching out to NCUC regarding not so much the ICANN60 outreach plan but also to explore the potential for any outreach or some sort of joint outreach at ICANN – at the IGF, sorry.

I see a [tick] from Cheryl. Olivier, go ahead.

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: Yeah, thanks very much. Yeah, all for talking to them about the IGF, that could be a little bit more advance time. I'm aware that the NCUC has some sessions as well at the IGF, and I think there might even be some day zero event that is somehow linked. I think it's about time that not only do we coordinate our At-Large activities but that ICANN coordinates the activities in a wider way for all of the ICANN community.

On several occasions, I have alluded to this and asked for this to happen. It's always been At-Large that's been trying to federate all of the activities that are coming from all of the different ICANN communities and yet when we end up on the ground, we've got several different parts of ICANN that operate and it's semi. It's not completely independent fashion with absolutely no coordination at ICANN level.

I really don't know whether it should be for At-Large to do this. I have a feeling that it should be whoever is organizing the overall ICANN participation at IGF to be doing something about this. But perhaps because I have mentioned it in the past and they're not doing anything about it, they're either – I don't know – they might not see the interest in this. But we have to ask of it.

We've done it in the past. Then one of the problems is that the moment we are opening a wiki page with all of the different activities taking place in ICANN, at IGF, we have other communities that are less aware of this than we are, so we end up with all of our At-Large staff on there, that very few NCUC, NCSG, GAC, ICANN official sessions, etc. We might need a slightly more neutral venue for this and we certainly would need to have some help I guess maybe through staff for other communities to be aware of what's going on.

I'm really dumbfounded as to why there is no coordination at this level and it's not like it's the first time ICANN goes to an IGF meeting. There's been quite a few now. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yes, thanks for that, Olivier. I don't think anybody would object that there certainly needs to be a more coordinated and informed approach by all at ICANN when it comes to planning these things. So I don't think anybody would object onto that.

I can only hope that that [stuff does] happen because I have experiences also that at the [inaudible] ICANN face-to-face meeting that I've gotten various ICANN staff from various other communities asking me questions about this, why this happened and they weren't aware of it and so forth.

So yes, indeed it should really be happening at the ICANN level. Okay. I think we covered all of the outreach at ICANN60 here. So at least we've gotten some good clarity as what will be happening at ICANN60.

I just want to now focus a little bit more on the next agenda item, which is the outreach at the IGF 2017. And, just a note that as good as to develop the page to talk about the... I'll now just find the link right this second.

All right. Here it is. So this is just a note – the idea, the concept of the IGF, the outreach activities at the IGF, and the background behind it. And the background behind it was that we submitted a budget request and we have to pick – well, the two travelers will be picked. It needs to be picked to go to the IGF, one from the Outreach Subcommittee and one ALAC member. All right.

And also, there's going to be a booth that Glenn has put in the request for and we managed to obtain the booth. So we have to really do several things here. One, figure out who are the persons that are

attending the IGF 2017. A wiki page was set up for this, and I'll just post the link here. Who would be going from the Outreach Subcommittee and who from the ALAC as for the Outreach and Engagement proposal. And then coordinate the various types of materials and any opportunities for like [Swag] I should say, for the At-Large booth at the IGF. Such thing is possible.

So the first things first. The At-Large persons attending the IGF, I know that there were some circulation [by various] At-Large but on the Outreach and Engagement Subcommittee list. I believe that by some, if not all, of the RALOs but I don't think it's really gotten the attention for people to actually fill out. The form basically has three things: the name of the community member in the table, whether they are funded to attend or not, and also whether they are attending any particular session and/or presenting, and when are they presenting. So far there's relatively small amount of group of persons.

So I do want to suggest that as an action item [staff] perhaps could – and we can work with staff, the coaches, and I can work with staff to [draft] this message for asking for people to please fill this out urgently. Okay. And give a deadline by say by next week Monday or something like that. Okay. Is that okay with everyone? I'm just looking to see if there's anybody objecting or raising their hands on this. Okay.

And then, for staff, and then certainly on the ALAC-Announce and on the various RALO list. So they'll get some more visibility so we can get them more informed either who is going to the IGF and then we can then better plan who can then do a volunteer time at the booth and so forth. So that's the first thing.

Second thing, once we have that information on the wiki page, we can then make a more informed selection as to who would then be the person from the Outreach and Engagement Subcommittee that would then be funded to go to the IGF 2017.

Is everybody okay with that approach again? Looking again to see if anybody wants to raise a hand or leave your comment. Heidi, go ahead.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Hi, Dev, I didn't hear if you called on me.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Oh, okay. Go ahead.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Okay. Thank you. So again, the fiscal year '18 approved budget request said that one person from the Subcommittee in Outreach and Engagement would be able to be funded to the 2017 IGF. So I would assume I met a member of this committee and perhaps this group wanted to develop criteria for that selection that might be useful. Okay, thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Thanks for that. Thanks for that, Heidi. So, what we can do is we can probably put this up on the Outreach and Engagement wiki page, which has the noted the persons attending the IGF. I guess the coaches

will then make a decision on the person that will come from the Outreach and Engagement Subcommittee.

Having said that though, we do need to plan out who will be able to assist from the community that is attending their IGF to help man the booths and so forth, and when they can do so and that type of thing. So the notice still needs to go out to find out who are the At-Large communities attending IGF 2017. Okay.

I think Glenn has some suggested criteria that's been shared informally with the coaches. Glenn, you just want to quickly just take the floor to just mention the criterion?

GLENN MCKNIGHT:

Sure. The criteria, it's pretty simple that you have to have a commitment to time at each of the days for the timeslot for the booth and being involved where the booth means making sure there's [inaudible] and literature is available and definitely have a spiel. And in keeping track of who actually is interested in steering these people directly to the right person, so people will be coming maybe interested in joining APRALO but no one at that timeslot is an APRALO person, so it would be good to get their information and information afterwards to [those people].

Second of all, there is a number of sessions as you know from day zero all the way through and if some people are actually leading the sessions and some people are in panel, so we need to know this because with the flurry of submissions, many of us submitted proposals, some were accepted while some were not. And in many cases where many of us

are actually panelists on session, so we need to flesh that out. And I've asked people to provide these details and I haven't really seen it so it's another call for people to actually disclose what sessions they're actually doing. That will be helpful in order to determine the merit of the person attending. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yeah, thanks for that. Thanks for that, Glenn. Heidi, I can see your hand raised.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yes. So, the booth, I just wanted to add to what Glenn said. The person who is going to be leading the At-Large booth at the IGF will need to prepare everything for that booth daily. So that includes getting the laptop for use that will be presenting any kind of loop. It will be making sure that the booth is set up with all of the promotional activities. It will actually going to the – apparently there are lockers where you store the computers, etc. overnight, so that person will need to come every day beforehand, set everything up and at night put everything away again.

So again, what has been given is a table. Okay. That is it. So there needs to be someone who is going to be able to cover all. Set everything up every morning, etc. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Great. Yes. Thanks, Heidi. I would think, yes, I think that's probably the core requirement for – if you are going to be funded to be the Outreach Engagement person, you have to take the lead and managing the booth,

yeah, the booth management, you know, as they say collecting the materials, putting away things on lockers and so forth and then of course, setting it up at the beginning of the day. So that could also be the additional criterion that they have to commit to doing this – to doing that, sorry.

Okay. Glenn, you have a response for that?

GLENN MCKNIGHT:

Yeah, let me just clarify that if you look at the picture I sent earlier on, it's almost like a [inaudible] size box and that has a lock on it. So it's not like you have to take the laptop and [inaudible] and look for your locker elsewhere, it's right in your booth. So a key will be provided and that's where you store things.

In addition to that, what I do – and I've done a lot of tradeshow, I've seen this happen – but if we can make sure the laptop is cabled, that would give us a sense of relief because it's one thing setting booth up and then, okay, other people are there, people get distracted if that laptop is not secured down and things go missing. And I was at the WSIS event back in 2004, I saw a laptop stolen in our area with the LPI. I was at [inaudible], same thing happened right in front of us. So, I keep dwelling on the security issues, so this is extremely important.

So if I can add to what Heidi is saying, we need that timeslot for the people who are attending. Some people are not too keen on volunteering but we have to do as much as possible. We have a lot of people in Mexico and I suspect we'll have a lot of people at this one. So

it'd be great that it doesn't fall only on a couple of people's shoulders.
Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Thanks for that, Glenn. And you mentioned a very good point about having the laptops secured in some way. So I guess my question then will be that we need to ask ICANN at least to be able to at least provide that security connection, the security lock for a laptop. So, is that the thing we should be requesting from ICANN to provide? And I'll defer to Glenn. He has probably more experience at the IGFs than I have – and events.

GLENN MCKNIGHT: Sorry. I'm bringing a cable regardless. So if ICANN doesn't bring it, I'll make sure I bring mine.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: All right. Okay. Okay, well that will be good. So that is taken care of. [And the key]. All right.

So the next question is – and I know we're coming up 10 minutes before the hour, so I didn't think we'll actually... We allocated 90 minutes for this.

All right. So going back to the booth itself, obviously, we are going to have to have scheduling once we have our list of the persons attending the IGF, getting a scheduling just as how we do it for APRALO booth at

ICANN60 and what was done for ICANN59, some sort of scheduling to determine who can be at the booth at the various times.

My two core concerns or questions would be, what materials can be obtained or printed to have at the At-Large IGF booth? And are there any opportunities for – well, I would like swag that it could be given away. Is there anything that could be done in terms of swag that could be given at the At-Large IGF booths? And I'll defer to Heidi on that or anybody on staff on that.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yes, this is Heidi.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yes, go ahead.

HEIDI ULLRICH: As I put into the chat, there is a possibility that EURALO could submit a request for RALO discretionary funding [inaudible] in their region. And again, this is the [inaudible] for \$2,000 for fiscal year '18.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Okay. So that will be the approach. Thanks, Heidi. So that will be the recommended approach. We use the local funding that's available to RALOs to request the outreach materials or swag or whatever that way. Okay. Olivier, go ahead. This will involve EURALO's permission obviously.

OLIVIER CRÉPIN-LEBLOND: Thanks very much. Swag, you mix swag with outreach materials. These are two things. So the brochures and all that stuff are printed automatically and we just have to decide on what languages we want, whether we want the At-Large brochures, whether we want just the RALO brochures and I gathered that if we want to cover all of the RALOs, we could have brochures for all of the RALOs. Since now we have a bit more desk space than having to fight with others on a very limited desk space. So that's one thing.

Perhaps we could look at some of the beginner's guides if there are some printing of this, beginner's guides are available. All that goes I believe, and Heidi, please correct me if I'm wrong, but all that goes into the Comm's budget.

Now, the special budget items, which are not relating to travel and which are relating to swag as such, these are things like stress ball, chocolates, chewing gum, USB keys, badges, all of this stuff and pens and I don't know what else is really hot these days, this can be put on the budget. I guess that we could have EURALO ones and ultimately, I think that we're now going to be fighting over funding stuff on these things. So if we can do all sorts of things not only just EURALO, then of course, for all of the regions or for just At-Large, that will be great. Thanks.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Thanks for this. Thanks, Olivier. And I guess Heidi can respond to that. I would also suggest that what can happen is also is because we

have the community onboarding stuff materials. We have like, for example, why should end users care about ICANN policy issues? We can have that as the interactive guide on the laptop at the booth so people can see things. And perhaps put certain selected portions of the community onboarding materials that we could use because as Heidi noted, the beginner's guides aren't printed anymore.

Satish, go ahead.

SATISH BABU: There was a suggestion by Rinalia. She was writing to me this morning saying that she's available for any kind of outreach at Geneva.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay.

SATISH BABU: If you could suggest how we can use her, then she will be happy to come with us for what will be planned there. So I would like to place that on the table so that when we plan the outreach, we can take that into account.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. That's excellent, Satish. Thanks for that and let's indeed note that so that we can look to see... maybe we can plan one of those outreach sessions at the IGF, the lightning sessions and so forth.

Okay. Okay, in terms of the communications materials, we probably do need to put a quick shortlist and ideally a quick shortlist of materials that we wanted to share with people. All right.

And in terms of swag, I do see some things like... it could be just simple things. Something that attracts people to come to the thing. Chocolates, as Olivier suggested, that will be pretty good.

Probably we can use the funding to cover that type of swag. And of course, I'm open to any suggestions as to what the swag is. USB drives? That's potentially also something and maybe we can then populate the USB drives, the various electronic materials about At-Large. So, that's a potential option.

Satish, is that a hand raised or is it a new hand raised? Okay, all right.

All right. Okay. So that's a list. Get some ideas as to what potential swag could be given. And maybe the simplest thing, maybe to just simply just give some candy, chocolate, and we'll just have a discretionary fund for that as opposed to trying to do anything like USB flash drives. I'm seeing in the comment that it could be done but then it could be abused and that people would just take a lot of those flash drives.

Any other thoughts? I see two hands. Glenn and then Heidi. Glenn?

GLENN MCKNIGHT:

Yeah. I observed IGF US, IGF in Mexico, and we've seen in our own ICANN booth with the Fellows. They're either feast or famine. Nobody is there. I mean, you watched it. There's nobody there, so they just

[inaudible] the booth or there's everybody and his uncle is there, which crowd free space and rarely ignoring anyone that's coming by.

So we need to be aware that it's got to be professionally done with not overexposure. To be honest, I'm at a conference right now in San Jose. Lots of junk people have. I don't need the junk. And there's nothing in the swag that I need. And most people just don't want that shit. So it's just my opinion.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Okay. All right, well then, do you want to just leave [inaudible] who can just add it to the booth page and just get some ideas and then we can really make that request because obviously we have to put that request in very, very soon. Heidi, go ahead.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yeah, a couple of things because I know we're very close to the end of the call. So, just to summarize, I think three points here for the IGF. We're going to send the message under traveling, travelers. We're going to send the message to the ALAC-Announce and At-Large Worldwide and the RALOs on who is going just in general from At-Large.

Secondly, if we could ask AFRALO if you're on the call, APRALO, to send to staff and to the co-Chairs of this group who is going, which two people are going from your RALO on the additional budget request, to do that pretty quickly, that will be useful. ALAC and the Subcommittee on Outreach Engagement will need to select someone based on criteria.

Again, two people from each of those groups, one from the ALAC, one from this subcommittee.

Then the second activity or booth activities, we need to identify the actual activities that we need to do. Are we going to do pop-ups, poster sessions? We need to identify a schedule who's going to be manning that booth and we need to look at what kind of materials we want there including outreach materials, as well as swag.

And then, for the subcommittee on Outreach Engagement session at ICANN60, that 30-minute session will include – we'll be inviting ICANN staff who are working on the IGF, as well as NCUC and NPOC representatives. Is that all correct?

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Thanks, Heidi. Thank you. I think you captured everything there quite [succinctly].

HEIDI ULLRICH: Okay. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Yes. All right. Well, just one question that just came to mind here. The selection of the person that has to come from the ALAC, is it that the Outreach Engagement Subcommittee will be taking that person too? Or is that ALAC decision?

HEIDI ULLRICH: Sorry, Dev, I didn't hear that question.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. So, the proposal says for two persons to go to the IGF.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yes. Correct. One from the ALAC.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: [Inaudible].

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yes. Correct. So, the ALAC has to select one. They haven't decided whether it has to be an ALAC person but they're going to be choosing one and then the other person will be needed to be selected by this group, the Subcommittee in the Outreach and Engagement. So two people there.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay.

HEIDI ULLRICH: And then, two people from AFRALO, two people from APRALO. Okay. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Okay. Yes, and those selections indeed happened. We need to know those persons as well. Obviously, the person selected from the ALAC will also have to agree to the criterion to be responsible for at least, as you said, being at the booth to coordinate and prepare the booth and so forth. And the other criterion... So we could just [inaudible] on that.

HEIDI ULLRICH: Yeah. Actually, I was waiting for this call because I was asked by ALT to develop the ALAC criteria, so I think it's an excellent idea to basically map, make sure that they are pretty much the same. So, we can definitely have a chat on that. Thank you.

DEV ANAND TEELUCKSINGH: Great. All right, thanks for that. All right, Any Other Business quickly? I know actually we are almost three minutes past the hour. So, Any Other Business very quickly? Going once.

Just to answer Sarah's question quickly, the Outreach and Engagement proposal is for two persons. But APRALO and AFRALO have had the IGF proposal that were approved and also the separate things. So they have persons to select as well. All right, and thanks for Heidi for answering it.

Right. Okay. I think no other quick questions or hands. Let's try to update the wiki page and continue the discussion there online. I'd like to thank everyone for attending this call. It's a very fruitful call. We have a very clear idea at least what you want to do at ICANN60 and what we need to do to prepare for the Outreach at the IGF or out At-Large booth.

So, I'd like to thank everybody and thanks also to the interpreters. This call is now adjourned. Have a wonderful morning, afternoon, evening, night.
