Consensus decision-making is a group decision-making process in which group members develop, and agree to support a decision in the best interest of the whole.

Conditions for using Consensus

- 1. Common Goal
- 2. Commitment to reaching consensus
- 3. Trust and openness
- 4. Sufficient time
- 5. Clear process
- 6. Active participation
- 7. Good facilitation

Test for agreement

Do you have agreement? Check for the following:

Blocks: I have a fundamental disagreement with the core of the proposal that has not been resolved. We need to look for a new proposal.

Stand asides: I can't support this proposal because ... But I don't want to stop the group, so I'll let the decision happen without me.

Reservations: I have some reservations but am willing to let the proposal pass.

Agreement: I support the proposal and am willing to implement it.

Consensus: *No blocks, not too many stand asides or reservations? Active agreement?*

The Review Team will not require full consensus. We discussed in Brussels 80% agreement of the team would constitute consensus in our recommendations.

As we finalize our recommendations we will record each members level of agreement.
