Work to build consensus with other stakeholders in order to find solutions to the issues that fall within the areas of ICANN's responsibility. The ICANN model is based on a bottom-up, consensus-driven approach to policy development. Promote ethical and responsible behavior. Othics and integrity are essential, and ICANN espects all stakeholders to behave in a responsible and principledvey.



Facilitate transparency and openness when participating in policy development and decision-making processes.

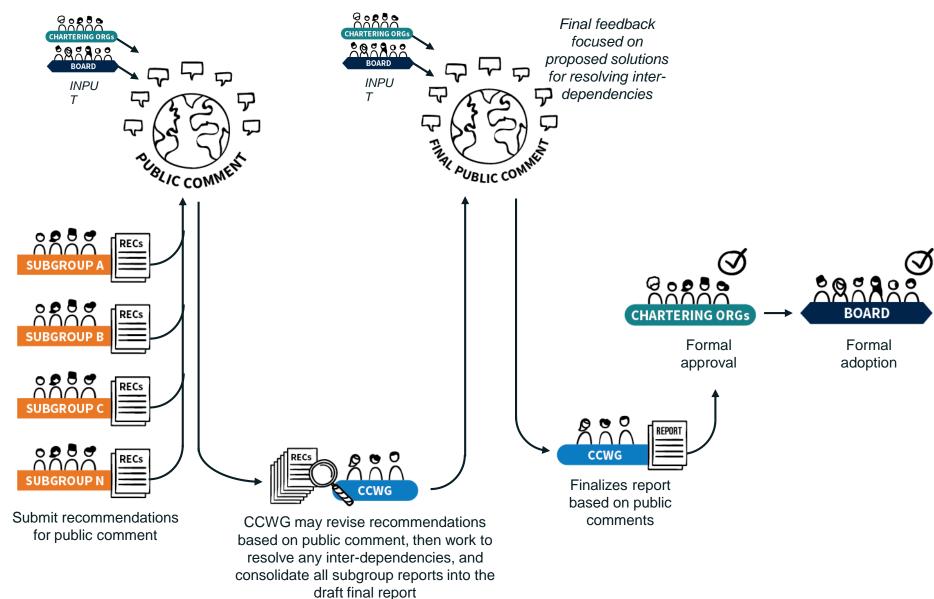
