APRALO Leadership Team @APRICOT 2018

The APRALO Leadership Team (ALT) which included Maureen Hilyard and Kaili Kan from the ALAC, and Satish Babu and Lianna Galstyan from APRALO, participated in the APRICOT2018 at Kathmandu.

While their attendance was formally to enhance the presence of APRALO and ALAC and to network personally with regional organisations, it also gave them an opportunity to establish direct contract with local ALS members and to meet and encourage new members to engage with APRALO.

Maureen and Lianna participated in activities such as the APTLD73 meeting and the AP* Retreat, providing updates on APRALO and ALAC activities, including current policy hot topics. Amrita Choudhury joined them in several sessions and events, including the Tech Girls Social which was moderated by APRALO member, Afifa Abbas, and where Maureen made a brief intervention to encourage participation of more women in At-Large as members and contributors to the At-Large policy development process. The ALT and ALS members took advantage of social and mealtime events to engage with other participants and spread the word about APRALO and At-Large.

ISOC Nepal enabled the ALT to formally meet with 11 members from 8 ALSes from the region who attended the APRICOT event. During the interaction each ALT member gave a brief presentation

about: engagement & policy development; participation and constraints; participation in regional activities; a specific policy issue (CCT-RT) and the APRALO history project. The meeting also gave members an opportunity to feedback their concerns and interests to the ALT.

The ALT was successful in engaging several participants who wanted to discuss the ICANN Fellowship program and how to join as individual members. One participant from Samoa, made an online registration to connect to the Pacific ALS (PICISOC) and become a member of APRALO immediately. Another participant from ISOC Malaysia had been encouraged by her employer to meet with the ALT while she was at the APRICOT event to find out how she could become more involved in APRALO. Several other participants also left their contact details in order to be added to the APRALO mailing list.

During an informal meeting of the APrIGF MSG members attending APRICOT, preparations for the APrIGF 2018 to be held in Vanuatu were discussed. It was decided to extend the workshop application date and to prepare an introductory webinar on how to submit a good workshop proposal, to encourage more submissions from across the region. The ALT will be submitting an APRALO workshop.

ICANN Updates

During the month of February ICANN,

- [Signed a Memorandum of Understanding](#) with GSMA at GSMA Mobile World Congress to enhance collaboration and raise awareness about Internet governance issues that are of common interest to both organizations and their communities.
- Published the [assessment report](#) of the second review of the ICANN Root Server System Advisory Committee (RSSAC) conducted by Interisle Consulting Group. A [session](#) on the subject is being organized at ICANN61 where community members can share their feedback.
- Published the FY18 Q2 Stakeholder Update for the quarter ending 31 December 2017 and organized a question and answer call on 22 February.
- Hosted a webinar on the [Replenishment Strategy for the ICANN Reserve Fund](#) and a [Pre-ICANN61 Policy Open House](#).
- Contracted [Analysis Group](#) to conduct an independent review of the [Security and Stability Advisory Committee Review](#).
- Held the [First Capacity Development Workshop for Asia GAC Members](#).
- Board passed a resolution of [not delegating the .mail, .home and .corp strings](#) .
- Board passed a [resolution](#) whereby ICANN CEO to facilitate negotiations on .amazon.
- [Called for Experts](#) to Study the Application of Root Zone Label Generation Rules.
- Sought comments on a [draft procedure](#) for ICANN to consider changes to Specification 12 of Community Generic Top Level Domain (gTLD) Registry Agreements by 2 April, 2018.
- Released the [New gTLD Subsequent Procedures PDP Working Group newsletter](#), which provides an update of all the Work Track activities that are associated with the New gTLD Subsequent Procedures. The purpose and importance of the PDP working group, along with issues impacting any future use of new gTLDs have been described in details in the newsletter.

APAC News

- The ICANN APAC hub organized a web conference to discuss on the [Introduction to Next-Generation gTLD Registration Directory Services to Replace Whois Policy Development Process \(PDP\)](#).

At-Large Highlights

In February,

- Alan Greenberg, Chair of the ALAC asked the 15 ALAC members to ratify the [ALAC Statement](#) on Proposed Incremental Changes to the ICANN Meetings Strategy.
- Comments were invited from members on the [Proposal for Korean Root Zone Label Generation Rules](#) by 16 February, 2018; the [Draft Procedure for Community gTLD Change Requests](#) and the report on RSSAC Review.
- The February ALAC Monthly Call was held on 27 February 2018.
- EURALO organized the "[EURALO GDPR Webinar](#)" on 19 February 2018.

APRALO Highlights

In February the APRALO held the [monthly call](#) on 20 February, 2018 and the submission date for the [survey](#) among ALS and individual members with the objective of enhancing member engagement was extended to 15 February, 2018.

APRALO Survey Highlights

The APRALO leadership team (ALT) conducted a survey to get a better understanding of the issues and expectations of members.

32 ALSes and 2 Individual members residing in 22 countries participated in the survey.

It is interesting to note that, most of the new ALSes who are members for less than four years participated more actively in the survey.

The survey also revealed that 89% of the respondents have their own website; 82% attend APRALO calls; 78% promote ICANN policy among their communities; 74% work on issues related to domain names and 74% ALSes are a legal body

For attending APRALO calls or other ICANN initiatives, 90% access Adobe connect using their laptop microphones and only 33% reported using the ICANN phone bridge. However 25% of these respondents also reported facing issues while connecting through adobe connect.

ISOC Delhi Online Meeting

Subashish Panigrahi, ISOC APAC Bureau shared on the [Action Plan 2018](#); Dr Govind, Delhi Chapter, shared the feedback on the recently conducted Chapter survey and areas of focus in 2018; a pre-recorded interview with Pablo Hinojosa and Srinivas Chendi from APNIC on APRICOT 2018 and APNIC 45 meeting and ways for the community to engage, was played; chapter member Col. Inderjeet Barara gave a presentation on "Block Chain-The foundation Technology of Future".
