



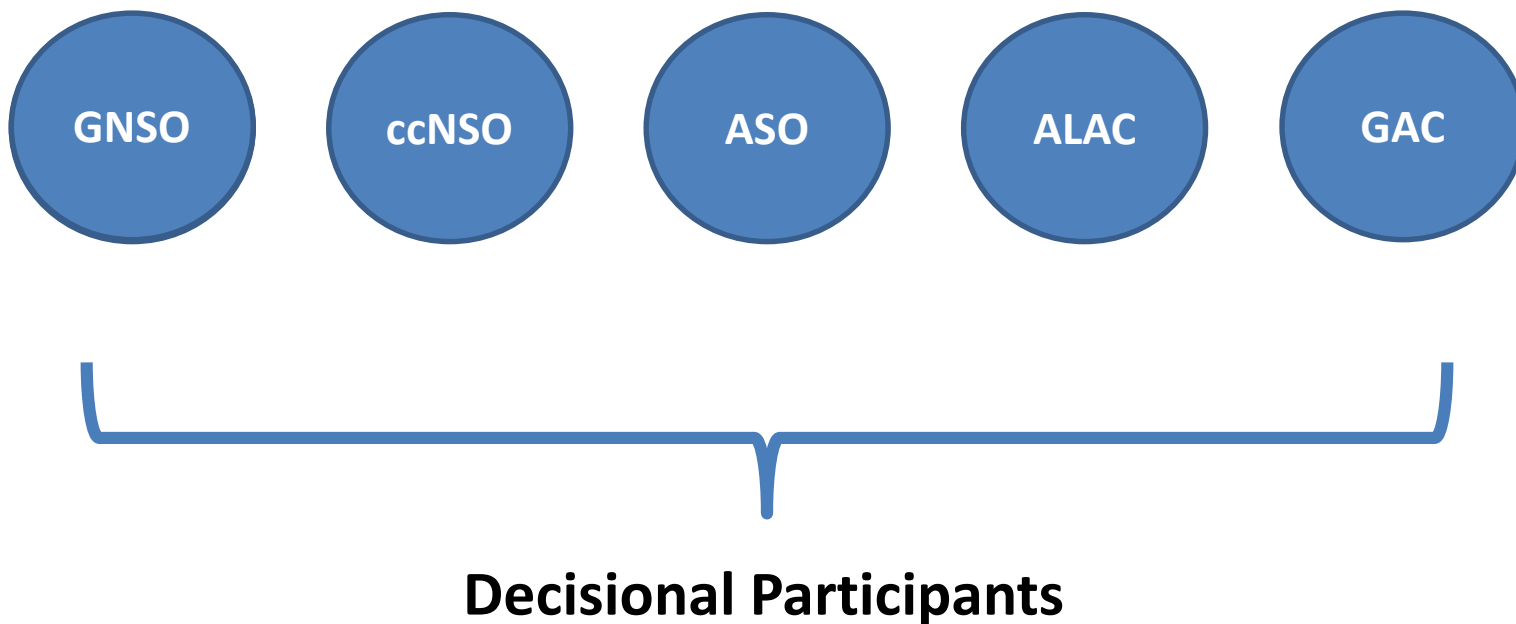

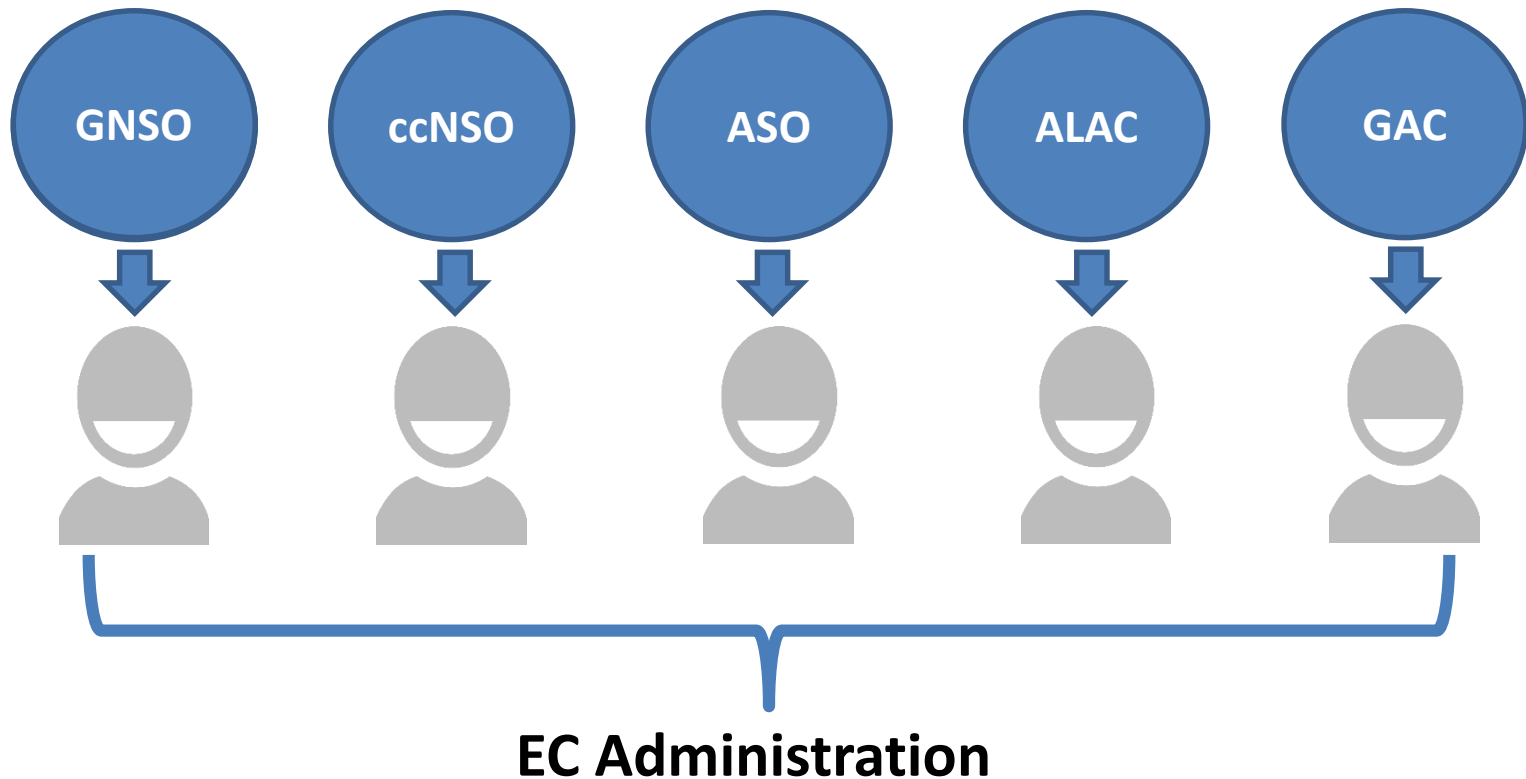

Why?

- CCWG Accountability
- Part of Accountability of ICANN, major powers to reject certain actions
- Trade-off between effectiveness of ICANN as organization and accountability -> strict timelines

Impact of Rejection Action

Example: reject budget

Described in Section 22.4 (ICANN Budget)

(vii) An ICANN Budget that has been rejected by the EC pursuant to and in compliance with Article 2 of Annex D shall have **no force and effect**, and shall be void ab initio.

(viii) Following receipt of an EC Rejection Notice relating to an ICANN Budget, **ICANN staff and the Board shall consider the explanation provided by the EC Administration as to why the EC has chosen to reject the ICANN Budget in determining the substance of such new ICANN Budget.**

New Budget: subject to rejection action procedure again

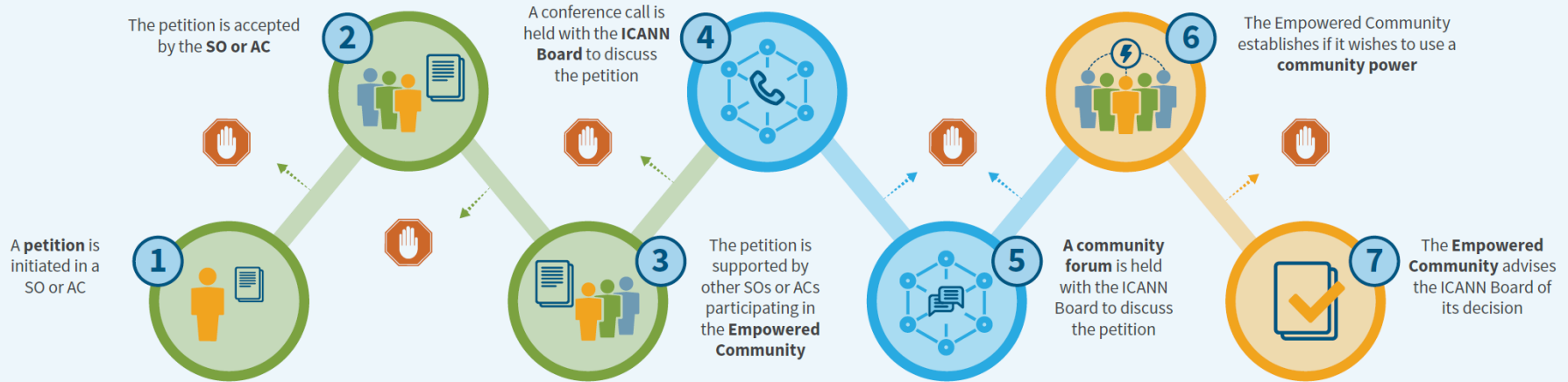

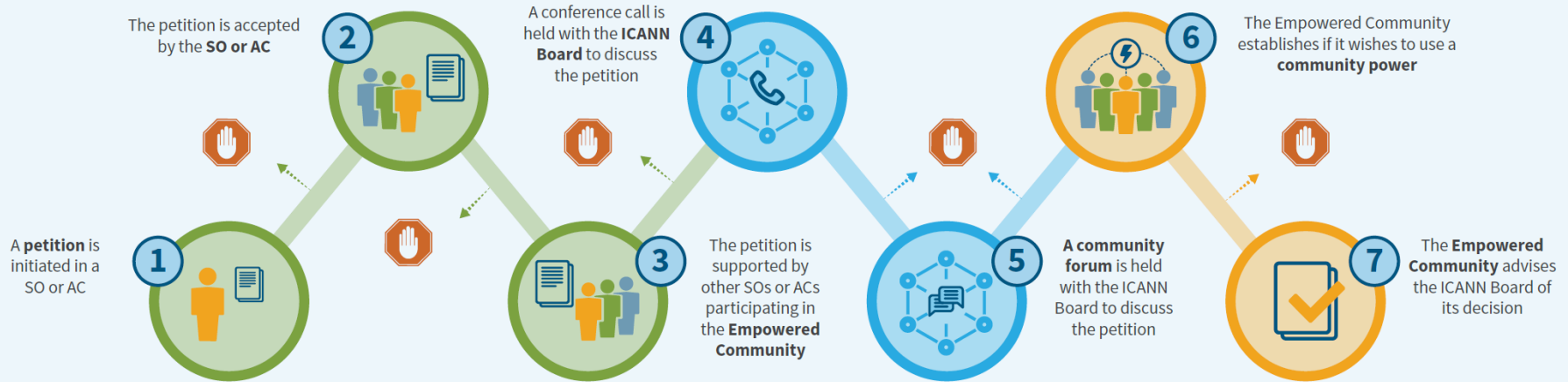

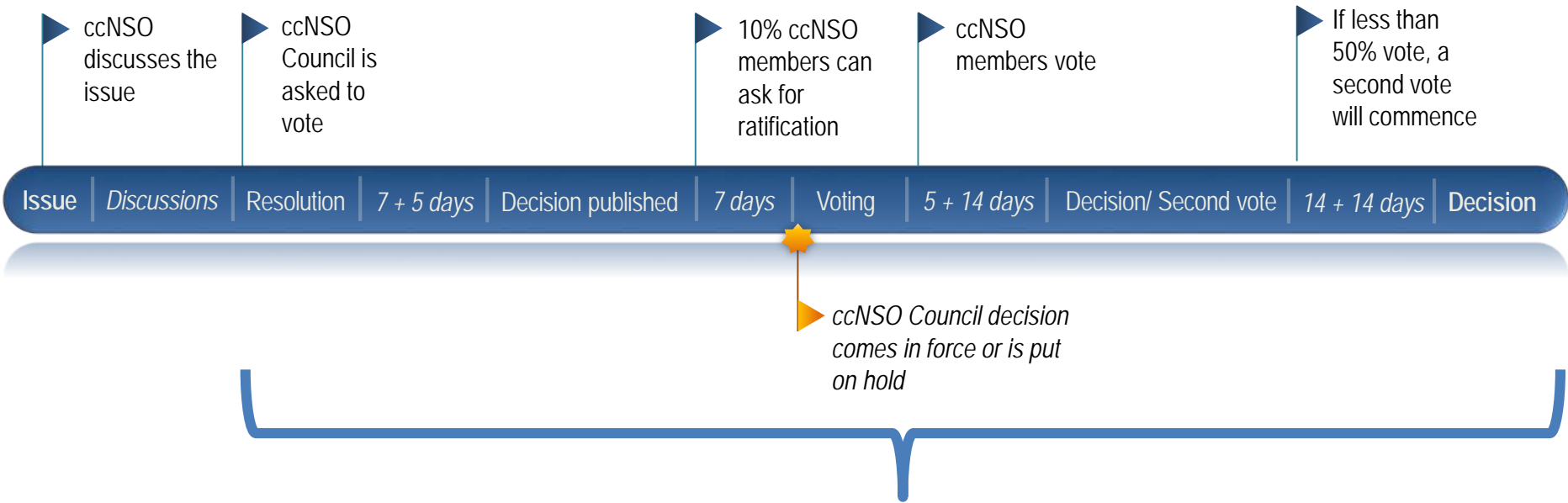


Seven Core Steps in the Escalation Process

Full ccNSO Process, including the Rules of the ccNSO (2004)



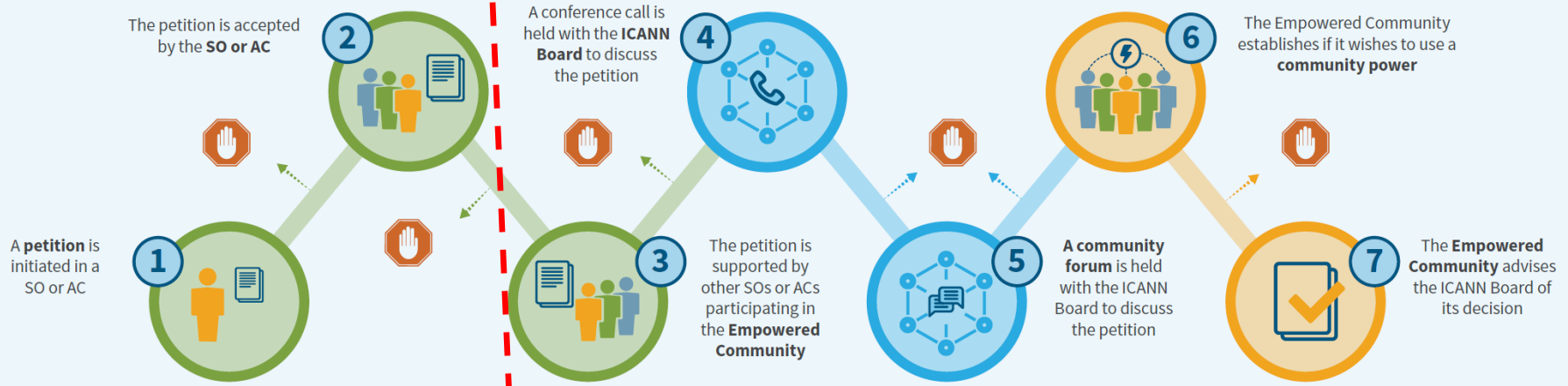

- Regional Organisations

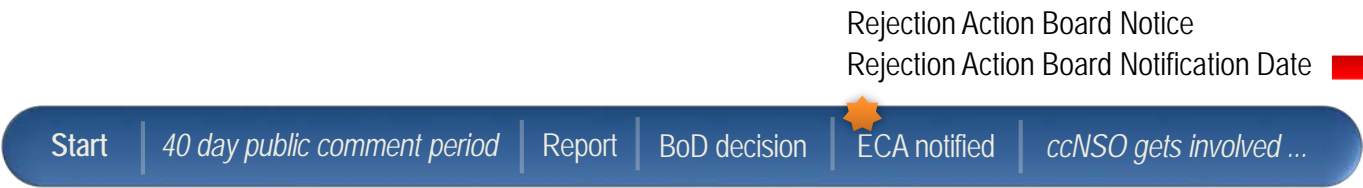

Requirements For Submission

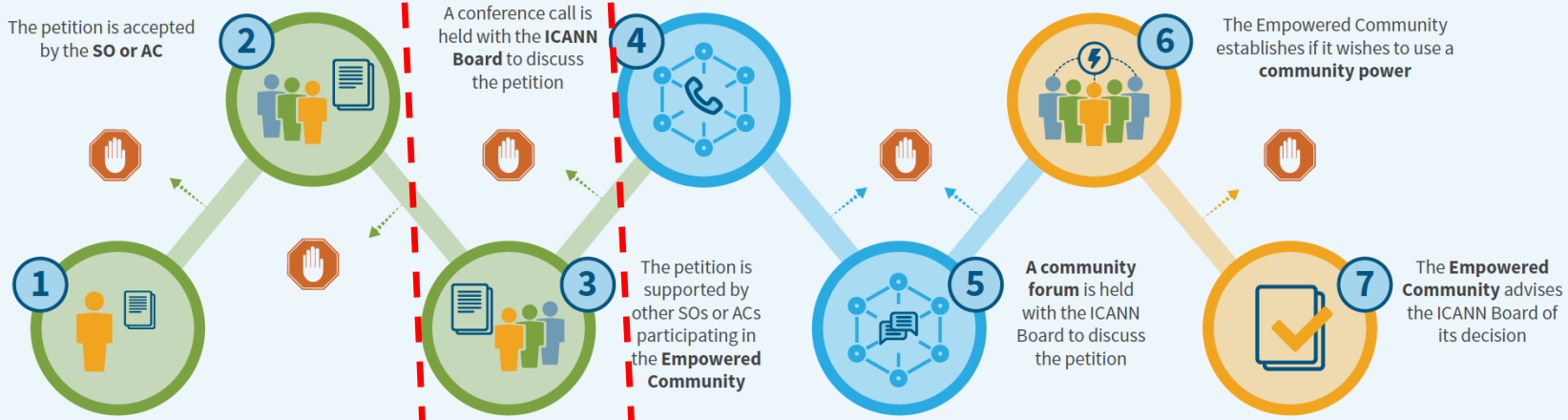
- A submitted public comment
- Time line (ccNSO timeline, see the Guideline)

Story line

- SOPC has submitted comments public forum
- Now submits rejection action: concerns re budget not addressed.
- Council accepts Rejection Petition

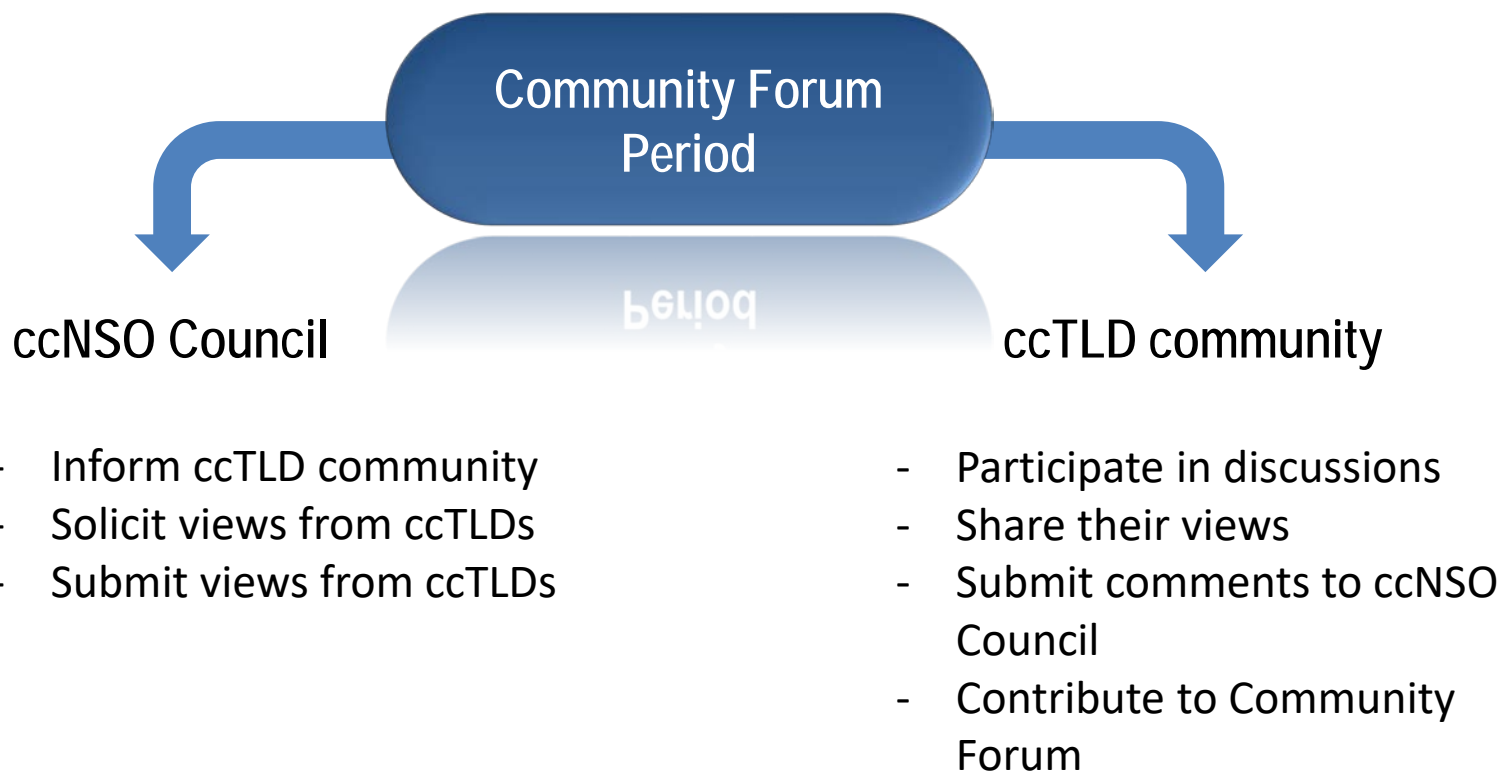

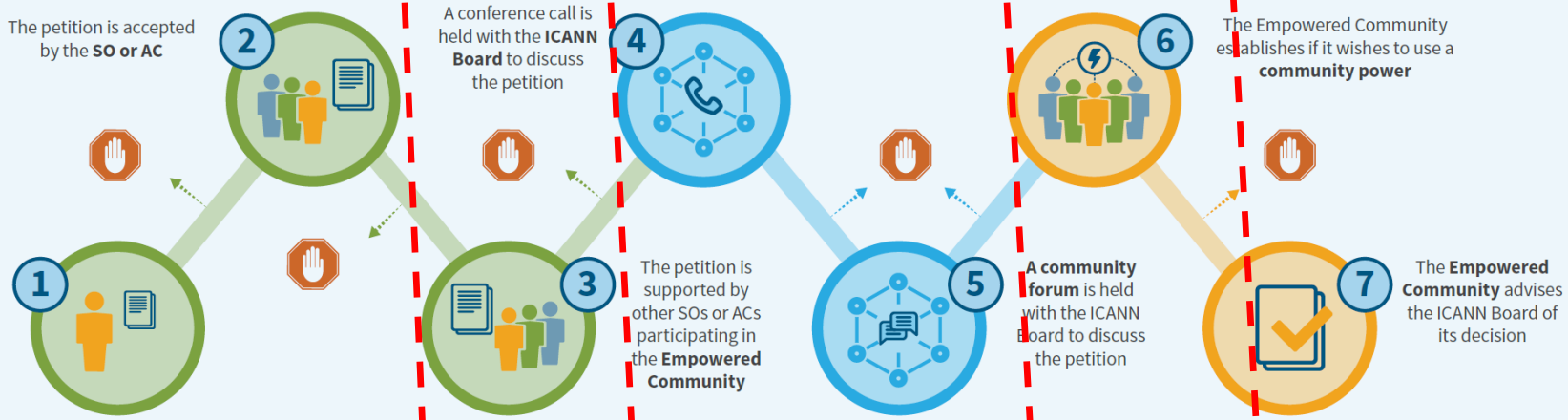


Final Decision

- 2004 Rules of the ccNSO apply
 - 10 % members could ask for vote
 - 7 days
 - If a vote requested -> ccNSO abstains
- Council timeline
- Simple majority vote Council
